I informed Allen and Karen Nicholson to write out statements as this would be turned over to detectives. They stated they would drop them off tomorrow.

Nicholson came to my place of employment to ask for a raise so that she could go to 1026 310th her former place of work to get the rest of her property i.e. clothes, jewelry etc. as we sat there we noticed that all her belongings were laying on the front lawn, and most of her clothes were ripped at that time. He also called our number and demanded money from Karen and if she hasn't paid it by 5-9-80 that he was going to pay her a visit in a threatening tone of voice this happened on 5-11-80 at about 12:00-12:30

Upon arrival to the area Off. Olson and I exited our squads and started checking through the backyard and adjoining yards. Off. Garber continued to circle the area in Squad #54. Off. Olson and I were unable to come up with anybody so we went and spoke with the complainant Budysz. In talking with the complainant she thought that the guy at her door was the same guy as the one that was at her house on 6/23/85. See indecent exposure case #M85-38705 for further details.

I then asked her to tell us about tonight's incident. She said she was sleeping on the sofa when she heard knocking on the front door. The party then opened up the screen door in an attempt to get into the residence. By the time Budysz got to the door the suspect was standing in front of the door with a red t-shirt wrapped around his head. Budysz said she could see his eyes, nose, and mouth. Budysz said that she then screamed and the suspect fled. Budysz said the suspect was 5'9" to 5'10" and about 160 to 170 lbs. She also thought that he had no mustache or chest hair. The suspect was also wearing blue jeans. She also added that the suspect was tan. At this point I informed Budysz that we would return to talk to her because Off. Garber had just stopped a suspect in the matter a short distance away.

Off. Garber had stopped Allen in the 1400blk. of Madison St. while he was riding a motorcycle. Allen was wearing a red t-shirt that could be seen sticking out from under a black leather jacket. Allen also matched the physical description except for the mustache. Off. Garber asked Allen what he was doing in the area but he could come up with no real explanation. Allen was also carrying a brown leather case containing some cassette tapes. Allen stated these were not his and that he had just found them in the area of Pulaski Park. Off. Rocklewitz was working on a car entry which occurred in the same area. (See case #M85-38807.)

I walked to the location where Off. Garber had Allen stopped and Off. Rocklewitz also arrived and informed us that Allen was a suspect in the car entry. Other than the mustache Allen was also a suspect in the exposure case. I then informed Allen that he was under arrest for the traffic charges and also that he was the prime suspect in a veh. entry and that he would be transported to our dept. Allen was then handcuffed and searched. Two screwdrivers were found in Allen's possession but he said he was using both to tune up his motorcycle. Allen was then placed in squad #54. His motorcycle was driven to his residence by Off. Rocklewitz. Allen did give us permission to place his cycle there.

Upon arriving at the station Off. Garber issued Allen his traffic citations. Sgt. Weina and I then placed a call to Det. Nellis to see if he wished to question Allen. The reason for the call was because of the two indecent exposure incidents and the car entry. Also Allen has been a suspect in other prowling and peeping tom incidents. Det. Nellis felt that Allen would probably not talk to us but he did suggest that a new mug shot be taken. I then read Allen his rights but he refused to answer any questions. He informed me that we should wait and see what the investigation turns up. Allen did want to know what would happen with the cassette tapes. He also wanted to know what would happen to him if the tapes were hot. I informed him we would have to wait and see on the matter. Allen was informed that he would probably be contacted again. Allen was only told that he was a suspect in a car entry tonight. No mention was made of the indecent exposure cases. After Allen was released from the station I took several photos that Off. Rocklewitz had picked out and took them to the Budysz residence. The photos included two shots of Allen and several subjects that looked similar to him. Budysz said that nobody in the pictures looked like the guy at her door but she said she was not sure. She said she would have to see them with a naked chest.

6-26-85-I contacted Jean Budysz and went over this complaint with her; she advised that in regard to the two incidents, she is very frightened. She advised that in regard to the incident on 6/26/85, in checking in the morning she discovered that a window on the south side of the house had been removed; this would be the kitchen window. Also a bedroom window on the north side of the house which is a combination storm/screen aluminum window had approximately twelve screws removed from it. It would appear that this is getting very serious in regard to the suspect, GREGORY A. ALLEN. He in all probability is the suspect involved, however at this point Jean Budysz could not make a positive identification. I went over the report with her in regard to the mustache. She advised that it is very possible that the subject has a mustache, however during the excitement and the fact that she was so frightened, she could not positively say he did or did not. Furthermore she advised that the only other thing she remembers is that he had a very large belt buckle; she is not positive if it is silver or gold. Also the screws that were removed from the storm window on the north side of the house were Philips head screws and as the officer stated, the subject in question did, in fact, have this type of screw driver with him. This area will have to be kept in mind and watched very closely as it would appear that the subject, Gregory Allen, if he is the person involved, will have to be caught in the act as he is starting to become very bold. I also informed Jean Budysz that she should hide her telephone so that it cannot be seen through the kitchen window and the front door and in the future if someone knocks loudly on her door at this unreasonable hour, she is to call this department immediately and not even look out the window.

[REDACTED] described the suspect as follows: approx 508 - 510, in the area of 180 lbs. She could not see his face or hair at all. She stated he said nothing unusual that would help to ID him, had no accent or unusual slang terms. She stated he had a very slight pot type stomach, and although the light was dim, she didn't think he had much if any tan. She stated she didn't think he was intoxicated. 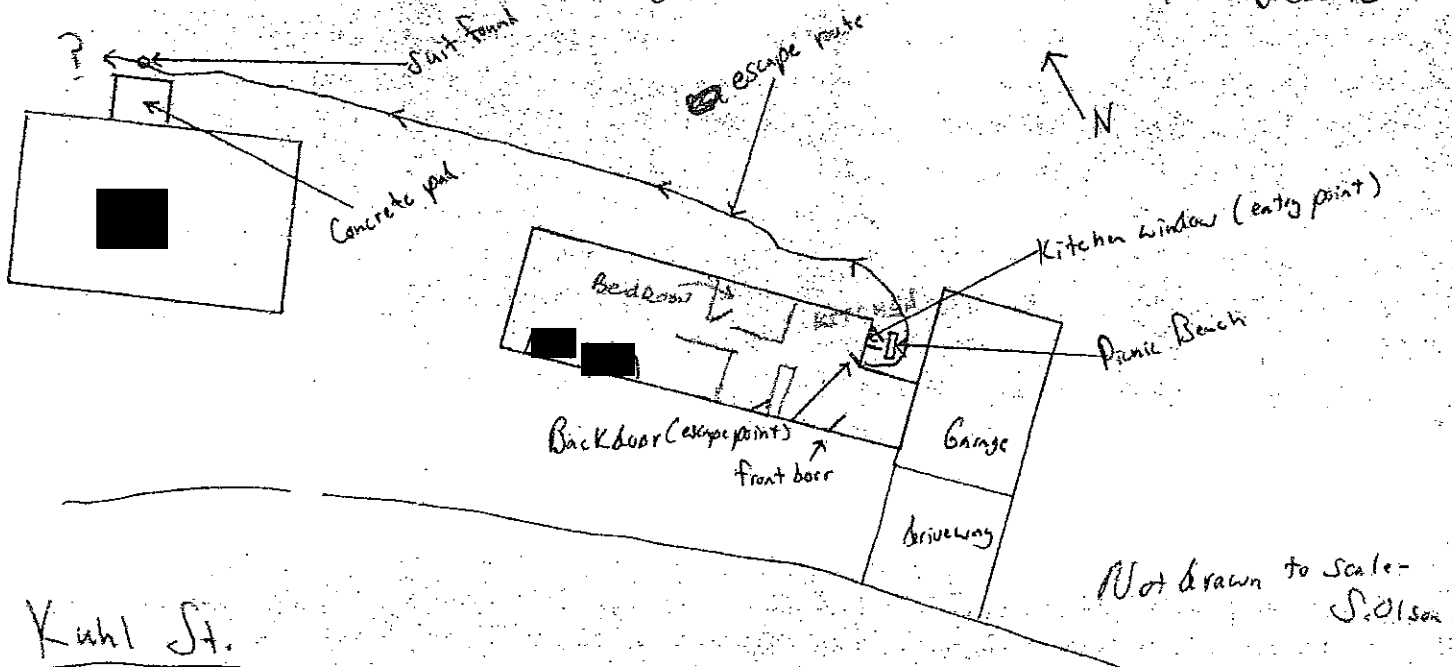

I was summoned to report to 1821 Waldo Blvd. at which time I met with the complainant, Mr. Rameker and the victim, [REDACTED]. He then placed a knife to her throat, a knife she describes as being a small jackknife, approximately a four inch blade, she stated that he put his hand over her mouth and stated, "If you say anything, I'll kill you". He then ordered her to take off her clothes and ~~stated~~ stated "no", that she couldn't, and he stated "Take them off or I'll kill you". She then explained to him that she can't because she has her period and he stated, "You better prove it or I'll kill you". She stated he then did not actually touch her but touched the heating pad she had below her and apparently felt that she was having her period. She stated she was not wearing any type of sanitary napkin or tampon but was laying on the heating pad because of cramps. He then took her hand and made her hold onto his penis as he then assisted her with his hand to ejaculate on her nightgown. She did not tell us this part until later in the morning after she had spoken with the daughter of the complainant, Rameker. She stated that she did not know that he had ejaculated until after he had left and she went to change to leave the house and then noticed the ejaculation on the nightgown. It is a cloth nightgown, like a pullover type with designs. She pointed it out to me when I was at the residence with her and I took this gown into evidence. She does have a younger sister who is [REDACTED] years old and he did ask her where her sister was when he was sitting on top of her. She had explained that the sister was up north. After he had ejaculated on her nightgown, he took her by the arm and told her to lead him to the door. She at first attempted to lead him to the front door but he pulled her back and stated "no, the back door". While she was leading him to the door, he had the knife against his neck and when he got to the back door, he told her that if she contacts anyone or tries to call anyone, he will come back and kill her. He then left out the back door and she feels he went to the west of the residence. She then went back into the residence and tried to get herself settled down and then had noticed the stains on her pajamas when she changed. She then waited a little while and went to her vehicle and then to the Ramekers. The only description she could give was that the subject was 5'8" and he had a solid build, but in her opinion was not a weight lifter or anything over muscular but he was big and solid. She feels that possibly he had lighter hair because she did not notice any exceptionally dark pubic area and she does not feel that there was any chest hair, although she cannot be sure. She stated that the only light that was on was a living room lamp and her door was partially closed so she could not get a very good look at the subject. When they walked through the lighted area that would have been part of the hallway, towards the back door, he was standing in back of her so she could not see anything then. Also the subject left nude, as he had entered. Besides the incident last winter with the male subject approximately the same physical description in body size that had gone through her back yard, they

had also had a problem where the picnic table bench was moved to a spot below the bedroom window of hers and her sisters. Her father thought that possibly one of the girls possibly moved the bench there to gain access to the house because they were locked out but this was incorrect. They did not notify the Police Department at this time about this suspicious activity. Also Mr. Rameker had spoken with [REDACTED] by phone this morning and she had mentioned a time in May when she noticed fingerprints on the window sill of the girls bedroom. The picnic table bench was taken this time from an area it is set up at, to the point of entry, that is the kitchen window as described by Off. Olson and also depicted on the sketch. I also took that picnic bench into evidence for possible prints. Also taken into evidence was the bedding from the lower bunk where she was sleeping and the heating pad that she was laying on along with the swimsuit that Officer Olson took into evidence that was found in the back yard. She stated that the light was dim, but she did recognize her swim suit around his face when he woke her. Det. Brey was called in to attempt to lift prints and he and I returned there to dust for prints and also at that time we received a call from her about the ejaculation part, so after the prints were gathered, we went and spoke with her again at the Rameker residence where she relayed the story about the ejaculation. She still has a hard time talking about the incident and we recommended her seeking counseling. She is going to stop in on Monday after 5:00 and speak with me further and see if anything new develops as far as her remembering anything about the incident. The type of operation is very similar to that used by Mr. Allen in his prowling escapades, especially the fact of moving furniture to windows to see inside. Also speaking with other neighbors, they have had furniture moved, but they never thought anything of it. I received a call from one of the neighbors I had spoken to, a Mr. BOB MARTIN, who lives at the corner of 16th & Kuhl, and he stated that approximately one month ago, he was walking his dog at approximately 2030 hours, and as he walked past the [REDACTED] residence, he noticed a male subject duck into the bushes. He did not think anything of it as he felt it probably was an old boyfriend or her boyfriend trying to check and see if she was home. He then stated he walked around the block and noticed a motorcycle parked in front of the GEISLER residence. He stated he took note of the motorcycle because the Geisler's are an elderly couple and he did not think they would know anybody with a motorcycle. He stated that as he was

walking his dog, and at the corner of Ahrens and 16th, he heard the motorcycle start up and it appeared to him that it drove off without its lights on traveling south on 16th street and then out of the area. He cannot say whether the motorcycle was a Harley Davidson or not, but he didn't feel it was a big motorcycle because it did not sound like a loud Harley Davidson as he knows them. This also fits the method of Mr. Allen where he lately has been taking his motorcycle out, and he is a suspect in many other indecent exposures and prowling complaints. The evidence that I gathered was dried according to the evidence manual and is packaged and will be tagged. Also the scene was photographed by me and prints were obtained by Det. Brey.

0537 Hours-Received a telephone call at my residence from Det. Bergner informing me of the above and requesting assistance at the scene. I reported to the station, where I met Det. Bergner who filled me in as to what had transpired thus far, the necessary equipment was obtained and we reported to the scene. The point of entry previously described was meticulously processed, and two small areas on the inside of the window casing which were latent prints or possibly a palm print. The developed area was very poor in quality, however lifts were made for possibly comparisons. There were also two latent prints developed on the inside of the screen which had been removed, and they also were lifted. A check was made of the bedroom windows, and it was apparent someone had placed their hands on the window sill on the outside, therefore the entire sill was dusted, and several latent prints were developed. Because of the large amount of dust and sootlike material on the aluminum window sill, the ridge detail is of very poor quality. Lifts were made, and these along with previously mentioned lifts have been maintained under Property Inventory 2006 as evidence, and I am maintaining custody of same for possible future comparisons. I assisted Det. Bergner with his investigation, and made a thorough check of the back yards in the area.

1338 hours-Det. Bergner called me at my residence and indicated he had made contact with [REDACTED] who advised they have received information from a neighbor that a party was seen carrying the picnic bench on the west side of the house, and he felt the suspect may have been looking in the west bedroom windows also. I reported to the station, picked up the necessary equipment, reported to the scene and the remaining window sills on the residence were dusted, however no latent prints were developed. I had occasion to speak with [REDACTED] who was very emphatic about keeping [REDACTED] name confidential. [REDACTED] informed me that at 0242 hours this morning [REDACTED] observed a subject whom [REDACTED] believes was a man, carrying a picnic bench between [REDACTED] house and the victims house ([REDACTED] lives in the house directly west of [REDACTED]), and [REDACTED] believes the subject was wearing what appeared to be a grey or similar colored gym suit or sweat suit. [REDACTED] did not pay much attention to this as [REDACTED] thought it was a neighbor boy possibly returning a picnic bench that had been borrowed from the [REDACTED]. I also made contact with Mr. Charles M. Stangel, 1520 Kuhl St., [REDACTED] who indicates he and his wife were informed by their son, JOHN, age 21, that he observed a male subject park a motorcycle in front of their residence early this morning approximately 2:30 a.m., and then walk in the direction of [REDACTED]

John was at a soccer game today, it is unknown when he will return, therefore I have made arrangements with Stangel to have John call Det. Bergner tomorrow afternoon and make an appointment to stop at this department to see him. Det. Bergner is to call Stangel's at 4:00 p.m. and make an appointment with John to stop and see him. He should also call [REDACTED] and make an appointment for [REDACTED] to stop and write a statement; [REDACTED] work until 3:30 p.m. and would be able to report shortly after that time with her parents.

7-15-85-Spoke with a party by the name of JOHN A. STANGEL, [REDACTED], Manitowoc. John had notified our department stating that he observed a motorcycle parked on Kuhl Street the night of this incident. The Stangel residence is [REDACTED] to the west of the [REDACTED] residence. I went and spoke with John who stated that he returned home on the early hours of Sunday at approximately 2:20 a.m. He stated that at 0230 hours he was in his bedroom and heard a motorcycle on Kuhl St. traveling west and he heard a motorcycle shut off its engine somewhere in the area of the front of [REDACTED] or [REDACTED] house and then the motorcycle coasted with the engine off to the front of his residence. He stated the subject on the motorcycle parked the motorcycle in front of his sisters vehicle which was parked in front of [REDACTED]. He stated that he could see that it was a motorcycle but could not tell what type of motorcycle it was. It sounded like a larger motorcycle like a Harley Davidson. He stated that a male subject got off the motorcycle and proceeded directly across the [REDACTED] lawn, directly towards [REDACTED] residence. He did not think anything of it figuring that it might be a boyfriend of [REDACTED]. He stated he could not identify the subject or even tell us what the clothing the suspect had on. The street light in that area is situated basically in front of [REDACTED] residence so there would be light shining back into the eyes of Mr. Stangel and he would be viewing the dark side of the suspect. There was nothing unusual about the hair but he stated it didn't appear to be down to the shoulders. He stated he must have fallen asleep then because he did not hear the motorcycle leave. This would corroborate with the information gotten from [REDACTED] who saw a male subject carrying the picnic bench alongside of the [REDACTED] residence at 0242 hours. I also had the victim

report here with her parents and went over the story she had originally given us on the day of the incident and the only thing relatively new that she added to this was she retired at approximately 0210 hours and she looked at the clock at that time, and also shortly before the perpetrator left the house, while he was still on top of her, she looked over at the bedroom clock she has, and it read 0314 or 0317 hours. She stated that this clock is approximately five minutes fast. The more specific rundown of the evening was received from her, she stated that approximately 2100 hours she was in the house at the table with her friend, RACHEL, until approximately 2350 hours when Rachel's boyfriend, MARK, and her boyfriend, GREG RAMEKER, came over to the house. At approximately midnight, Mark and Rachel left and she and Greg sat at the table until approximately 0045 hours. She then took Greg home and returned to her residence. She then prepared herself for bed which ended up to be 0210 hours. She stated that she was awakened when he was touching her on the genital area and her breast. When she first awoke, he was not on top of her but to the side of her and then put his hand over her mouth and threatened her. She stated that he used his right hand to threaten her with a knife and held it against her left eye. He did not touch her in the genital area again after this but just touched the heating pad when he checked to see if she was not lying about her period. She stated that after she let the subject out of the house, she became sick and threw up in the bathroom. She then brushed her teeth and ~~her gown and~~ got dressed. She then noticed the screen off after looking over the kitchen and replaced that. She stated she walked around the kitchen a short time and then figuring that he had left the area she got into her car and motored to Rameker's.

The sequence of events would probably correspond with the times that the suspect entered approximately 0258 to 0300 hours. He was probably in contact with her until 0315 hours to 0320 hours. With travel time to Rameker's and her getting sick, dressed, and putting the screen back up would probably bring her to Rameker's at 0328 or that vicinity. I again had asked her about smelling any intoxicants on the breath because she told me on Sunday that she did not, and she again told me that she did not smell any. She personally felt that the subject was not on drugs or alcohol because of his clear speech and no odor. [REDACTED] then sat in here without [REDACTED] and I informed them of our suspect and also gave them information to be on the lookout for his vehicles and him personally in the area. Also they were informed to notify the phone company immediately in the morning and have a tap put on the line for approximately 7 to 10 days in case the suspect or perpetrator would by chance call the [REDACTED] residence and threaten [REDACTED].

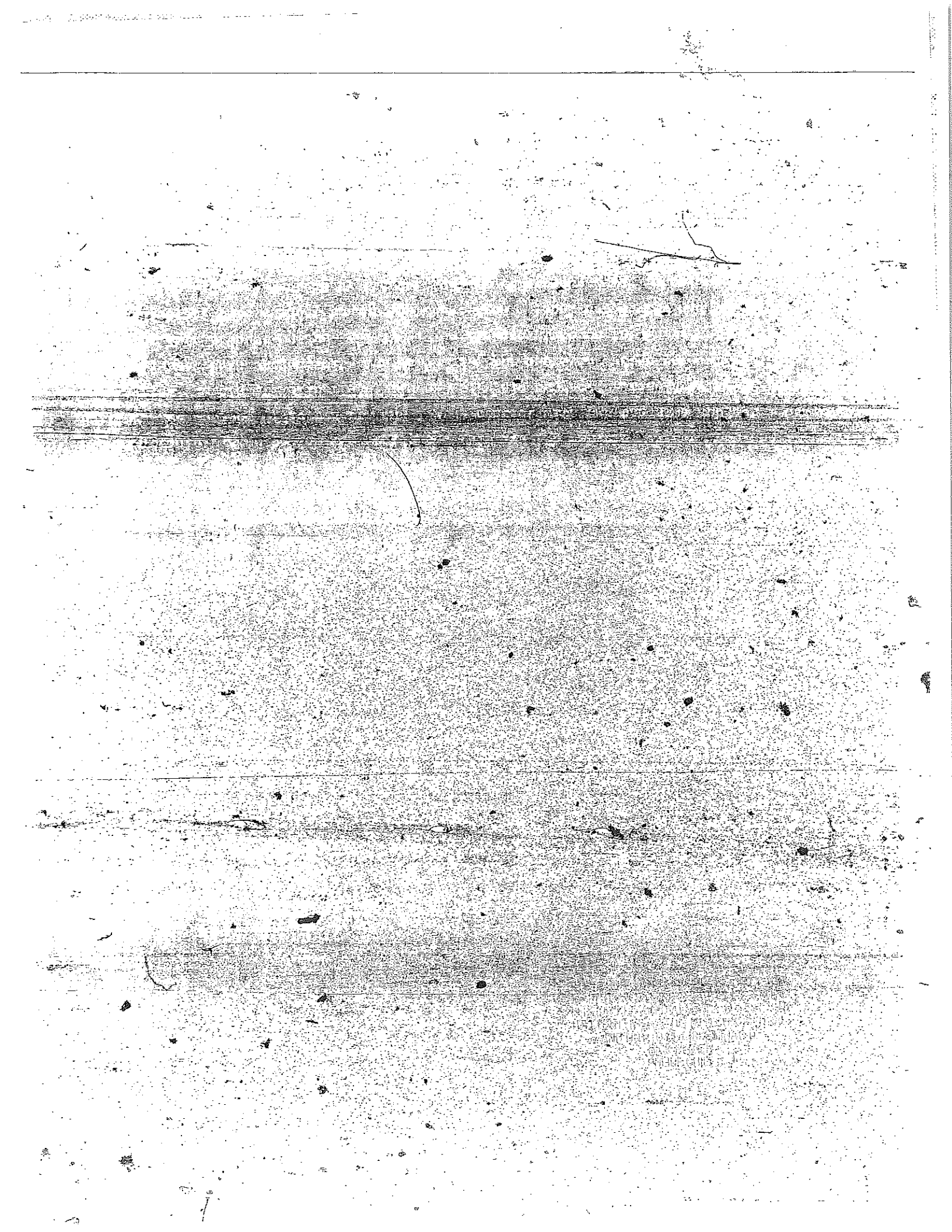

I first received a phone call from [REDACTED] this evening and at that time she told me that her daughter-in-law had been raped late last evening in her home at [REDACTED]. I advised [REDACTED] to bring her daughter-in-law to this department so that I could obtain a detailed statement about what took place so that we can begin our investigation. When [REDACTED] arrived, it was quite evident that she was still very shaken up by the ordeal she had experienced. She explained that her husband, [REDACTED], is an over-the-road truck driver and he has been gone from home for a week. She had received a call from [REDACTED] last evening, however it was before the sexual assault took place and he was calling her from Cincinnati, Ohio. [REDACTED] explained that she and her husband own the two story home at [REDACTED], and they are in the process of building a garage and remodeling the house. She stated that she has a habit of always sleeping on the couch downstairs when her husband is away and on the road, and she has a 2½ year old son, and a 4 month old baby that were sleeping upstairs last evening. She explained that the front door was locked and chained last evening, however the back door to the residence is somewhat warped and the lock doesn't always catch properly. She stated she had been watching television last evening and fell asleep while doing so, however she woke up sometime around 1:00 am to shut the TV off, and laid back down and fell asleep. She stated that when she first woke up, she isn't sure whether it was a noise that caused her to wake up or why she woke up, but she suddenly realized that a male subject was standing within reach of her right alongside the couch. Her initial thought was that it was her husband, however when she woke up, she heard the man say, "Don't scream, because if you do, I'll kill you". She explained that the house was quite dark with

only a small amount of light coming in from the windows facing S. 11th Street, and she never really got a look at the subject. She estimated that the man was probably in his thirties and did not have real long hair, but he did have a mustache. She stated that he was of medium height and rather muscular. She was unable to tell whether or not the man had a hairy chest because she claims that he kept his T-shirt on during the entire ordeal, but she stated that the T-shirt must have been a darker color because it did not appear to be light in color in the darkness of the house. She did remember that the shirt had a pocket on the front of it and she had grabbed the pocket and remembered that it had ripped. She also recalled that his pants were not a dress type of pants, however she was not sure whether or not they were blue jeans. She remembered that ~~she~~ he put his pants back on, that she heard a jingling sound like change in the pocket, but she didn't think that he wore any belt. ~~She~~ explained that after the mans initial threat warning her not to scream, she became very concerned because of her young children asleep upstairs and for that reason she tried to make as little noise as possible. She stated that during the ordeal, the assailant did not make any other statements to her, and all she can remember doing is crying and pleading with the man not to do it. She claims that there was never any weapon displayed or threats of a weapon made. ~~She~~ told me that she was only wearing a short, lightweight nightgown and she recalls that the assailant lifted her nightgown up to under her armpits so that it exposed her breasts. She did not have on a bra or panties at the time, and she stated that she did not struggle violently or resist in excess for fear that the children would be awakened. She claims that the assailant began caressing her breasts with his hands and his mouth, and that he had his pants off and got on top of her to have intercourse in a standard, missionary position. She recalled that he did not have difficulty in making penetration although she tried to prevent him from spreading her legs apart. She stated that he was not overly rough with her and he did not bruise her in any way. She is unable to be positive about the length of the intercourse, but she stated that it didn't last excessively long and when he stopped thrusting, he then laid on top of her for just a short time, and it was during that time when he laid on top of her that he made two

other comments to her. To the best of her recollections, the statements that the assailant made at that time were, "If you call the police, I'll kill your two kids". He then said that "I saw you leave Monday in a silver Cadillac heading towards Kiel". For this reason she knows that the subject must have been watching her residence since at least Monday, because her in-laws who do own a silver Cadillac had picked her up on Monday and had gone to Kiel with her where her family lives. She also is fearful because of the fact that the assailant knew that she had two children. She stated that she is rather concerned at this point that there is a danger of pregnancy because she is not on any [redacted] and her baby is only 4½ months old and she does not nurse the child.

I contacted the Emergency Room at Holy Family Hospital and explained the sexual assault treatment program that is operated through Holy Family, to [redacted]. She was agreeable to go to the hospital to be examined and she will be working with R.N. Mary Frieder as the Sexual Assault counselor. [redacted] explained to me that after the assailant got off of her, he simply pulled on his pants and left the house. She pointed out that it was rather surprising to her that he never bumped into anything even though he had to make a couple of corners and walk around things that were piled up due to the remodeling work being done. She stated that when he left, she does not recall hearing any vehicle starting up, however she was too afraid to get off the couch and look as to how he left. She claims that she stayed on the couch for a couple of hours before she got up to go and take a bath. She stated that when the assailant left, she recalled that she noticed her small son had awakened during the assault and was sitting on top of the steps, however she didn't talk with her son at that time, and he simply went back to bed. This morning her son did not make any mention of the incident and so she did not mention it either. She stated that her son frequently will awaken in the night and he is totally unaware of being moved around or of walking and he appears to do this in his sleep. [redacted] mother and father-in-law had brought her to this department and they were caring for her children as they waited for her. I spoke with them briefly after my interview with [redacted] and asked that they take the children back home and put the children to bed and then come up to HFMC to pick [redacted] up after she is finished with her examination. I then took [redacted] back to her home at [redacted] where I was able to collect a blue blanket that she had been covered with and had used to wrap around herself after the assault. That was placed in one paper bag, and the small blue nightgown she had been wearing had also been placed in a separate bag as were the two white sheets that covered the sofa which she had not disturbed since the assault. No other items in the house appeared to have been touched or disturbed and the assailant did not leave any items or evidence behind. I then took [redacted] to Holy Family Medical Center where she was left to be examined and I briefly spoke with Mary Frieder who will be working with [redacted] as the Sexual Assault Counselor. After the examination of [redacted] was complete, I obtained the items of evidence from the Emergency Room and they were returned to this department where they are presently being kept in the evidence room. The sexual assault collection kit was opened by me and the swabbings and saliva samples were placed in the open air of the evidence room to air dry so that they can be sent to the

Her written statement is quite well done and it is basically as she told it to me. Upon going over the sequence of events again, she remembered that the assailant did not remove his shoes during the assault because she can remember feeling the strings from his shoes on her legs and she figures that they were tennis shoes. She was asked again if there were any details that she could remember about the person, such as any odors on his breath, or anything distinctive, and she cannot recall any other details. She was again asked whether or not she felt she could identify any suspect if we showed her any photographs, but she stated that she was quite sure that she could not because it was so dark in the room that all she knows is that the subject had a mustache because she could feel it. She was asked whether or not she is employed anywhere in the event that the suspect could have spotted her where she works, however she does not work outside of her home. She was also asked about whether or not she takes walks in the downtown area or where she does her grocery shopping. She stated that she does not take walks very often and she usually does her grocery shopping out at Copps except for once in a great while, she will pick up small items at the Mid-town Market on Washington St. I explained about the victim-witness program in Wisconsin and gave some materials to [redacted] about that and I also had some other reading materials that deals with the psychological effects of the sexual assault and I also gave her copies of that. She was reminded that if she experienced difficulties later on because of this, she should feel free to contact the Sexual Assault Treatment Counselor that has been working with her. She

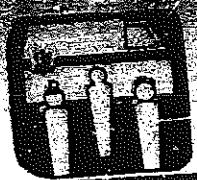

The whole blood sample (item A6) was ABO Blood Group A. Serological typing of the saliva sample (item A4) indicated that [REDACTED] is a secretor individual. One polymorphic enzyme, Phosphoglucosaminase (PGM) type 2-1, was identified from the blood sample (item A6).

Seminal material was identified on the vaginal smears (item A1) and the white sheets (items C1 and C2). Serological typing of the seminal stains on the sheets (items C1 and C2) indicated the possible source of the semen is an A secretor, O secretor or a non-secretor individual.

Electrophoretic typing of the semen present on the sheets (items C1 and C2) was inconclusive.

No seminal material was identified on the blue blanket (item B) or the blue nightgown (item D).

Eight (8) head hairs were recovered from the blue blanket (item B). Seven (7) of the recovered hairs were generally consistent with the head hair standard (item A5) recovered from [REDACTED]. One (1) of the recovered hairs was considered unsuitable for comparison purposes. Seven (7) pubic hairs were also recovered from the blue blanket (item B). Five (5) of the recovered hairs were generally consistent with the pubic hair standard (item A3) from [REDACTED]. Two (2) of the recovered hairs were considered unsuitable for comparison purposes.

Five (5) head hairs were recovered from the white sheets (items C1 and C2) and determined to be generally consistent with the head hair standards (item A5) from [REDACTED].

Mr. Janda stated that for the past several weeks his two daughters have said that they have seen eyes looking at them. [redacted] and [redacted] stated that one night they saw someone looking into the back window. vehicle that would fit the description of Greg Allen and his M.O. is quite the same as Greg Allens. stated that the night of the 5th of October which would have been a Saturday night, they had noticed the piece of wood moved but did not think anything of it. They also noticed the same type of activity the morning of the 12th of October, which probably meant the suspect was there on Friday night, the 11th. The block of wood being used is the same each time. I made them aware of what vehicle to be looking for and to get any type of license number they possibly can of anything suspicious in the neighborhood. I asked her if there was any doubt in her mind and she stated, "No, that's the person I saw, and as I told you before, he was a blonde, and I am sure he is the fella". I obtained a statement from Julie Reh that is attached, of tonight's incident.

On Gregory's alibi of being at Mr. Donut on 31st and Calumet Ave., I checked with the manager, Connie, who stated she left at 6:15 a.m. on 10/22/85, and didn't see anybody but regular customers that she knew and none fitted the description of Greg Allen. She advised me to talk to JUDY M. REEDY, DOB 10/23/49, phone #682-9174, of 6907 Cnty Trk JJ. Judy informed me that she worked until 6:15 a.m. also and did not see a person of this description come into the donut shop. She stated she only saw regular customers and no one fitted that description.

I spoke with Christine M. BONESS, on 10/23/85, who lives at 3627 S. 15th St., phone #684-6159, DOB 4/02/53, and she stated she was at the restaurant from 6:00 until noon. I showed Christine the same array of pictures mentioned above and she stated that no one in that picture group was in the restaurant between 6:00 and noon that she recalls, and she would recognize the subject in question if he was in, she was sure. After ruling this out, I went across the street to the Mini Mart Service Station and spoke to the manager, LARRY K. KITTELL, who runs the Mini Mart Service Station on the corner of 30th & Calumet Ave., his address is 1109 Parkrow Blvd, Mtwc, phone number 682-9240, and the service station is called Tri-Par, phone #682-0488. Larry went through the array of pictures and stated he did not recall any of the subjects being there as I had the same filler photographs mentioned above with Gregory Allen's picture, and then when I took Gregory Allen's photo out and showed him that specifically, I asked him if the subject was in for a can of gasoline for his car. He stated he did not remember any such person being in his service station for a gallon of gas, and he would have remembered had he loaned a gas can to him, but cannot remember anybody taking or asking for a gas can for a gallon of gas.

when Greg walked out that he made a mistake, that it was really 6:30 or thereabout, and called Greg on the P.A. system informing him that he made a mistake and that it was 6:30, not 5:30 a.m. I asked Scott if this was the proper time and he stated that it was around 6:30, he couldn't be sure if it was 4 or 5 minutes after 6:30 or not but it was around that time, and he couldn't be sure if that was the exact date of 10/22/85, but thought it was. He stated Greg acknowledged and waved his hand and walked off. I asked Scott if he was in a car, on a motorcycle, or on foot, and Scott stated he couldn't remember, he just saw him walk out, he did not see him get into a car or on a motorcycle, and did not pay any attention after he corrected his time element. I asked Scott to make out a statement which will be attached to this report and at this point it is very vague and Greg did come approximately a week after the incident took place above, and I called Greg to the P.D. the same afternoon of the incident of 10/22/85, and he mentioned nothing of being at Super America for gasoline. There was a gas station a block away from where his car was parked near the incident of the prowler, and as stated above, they were open and could not remember anyone getting a dollar's worth of gas or a can of gas.

I went a step further and talked to the manager, Greg S. Winnekens, of Super America, who lives at 1706 Western Ave., DOB 7/25/58. I asked Greg if he had a printout from the cash register that would indicate the time and the date of purchases pertaining to 10/22/85, at approximately 6:30 a.m. Greg stated that they do have a printout of this type and they usually keep it for a couple months, but in this case it was already disposed of and they have no record to indicate this.

Greg had one alibi after another on this issue from the beginning stating he was at Mr. Donut Shop, which proved to be false, and ran out of gas and had to get a gallon of gas from a gas station, which also did not prove to be true as there was a gas station open at that time a block away, and he certainly wouldn't walk 3/4 of a mile round trip for a can of gasoline when there was a gas station a block away. Greg is obviously grasping for straws on this issue but it was checked out as stated, and the witnesses can be called in if it comes to that point.

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Complainant, Marion Cumming, related that she is a landlord at the residence where Gregory Allen lives and on 7/10/86, he wrote out a check to her for partial rent payment of \$100, that was due on 7/1/86. When contacted of this, Greg Allen and his room mate, [REDACTED], related that there was a disagreement between Greg Allen and the complainant and he felt that it should be taken out of the security deposit which is \$250 that the complainant is still holding. The complainant stated that they took a dog or puppy in against the regulations she required, and she is certain there is damage to their rug and other parts of the apartment that will cost her a great deal of money beyond the \$250 security deposit. At any rate, she spoke to the assistant D.A., Jim Fitzgerald, who advised her that this was a worthless check and she should pursue the matter through the Police Department, which she did. The check is now at the P.D., and after I made an attempt to get Greg Allen to come to the P.D. to discuss this with me, he did not show up so it will be forwarded to the D.A. for final disposition of Issuing Worthless Check.

He was told to stop and he stopped and turned and stated You Guy's Aren't Going To Do This To Me Again and with that struck Officer Le Duc with his Right fist on the upper cheek bone just below and to the right of the right eye. I then gained control of the right arm and Officer Reindl the left arm as we went to the floor. Gregory Allen had managed to stay on one knee and regain standing. We then collided with the wall next to the chair attempting to gain control crossed the room colliding with dressing room doors then with the east wall where partial control was regained and then back to the wall with the chair where total control was gained and handcuffs were placed on Gregory by Officer Reindl. Gregory was patted down for weapons and a knife was found in his right front pocket (tagged #113). This knife was taken and handed to Officer Reindl who turned it over to Det. Sgt. Ospedale. Gregory was then transported to the station in Officer Reindl veh. and locked in cell #3 at the station (see booking sheet). I remained in the dressing room to collect several items which I had lost from my uniform in the fight and struggle and to check the dressing booths. Linda (store security) accompanied me as we checked the first dressing room Linda had seen him in. Earlier when first I.D. Gregory asked him about the other dressing room were two tags and a pack of Kool Cigarettes were on the floor. He immediately stated those were his cigarettes and went and picked them up. (Cigarettes tagged #115) When checking the dressing rooms discovered a hole had been made in both dressing rooms permitting the occupant to view the person in the next booth dressing. Both holes were made at a level that might permit one to sit while viewing. Linda stated the hole in the South-west room had been enlarged from the day before. The hole in the North-west room hadn't been there 20min's prior stated Linda. Both rooms were closed and locked for possible pictures.

Statement were obtained and are attached. At the station Gregory Allen was Charged with State D.C., Resisting Arrest (state), Battery to a Peace Officer and Criminal Damage to Property is pending. Gregory is on probation and Det. Sgt. Cspedale contacted his P.O. and a Probation Hold was also put on him. He was transported to MESC later by Squad #48 after signed for his property. The jeans he had in the dressingroom were tagged #114. Was later informed that his Walkie-Talkie #30 had been scratched in the scuffle with Gregory. For the injury I recieved to the face I recieved medical attention from RFL (see attached copy). Later in the evening also experienced pain in the [redacted] on the


Le Duc

I did a follow up investigation of the case because of the seriousness of the incident. The officers apprised me of what took place after they placed Allen Gregory in cell #3. I went to the scene and met two of the witnesses who are also security officers for Prange Way Store, who would be Linda Lazich and Carrie Anderson. I asked them in detail what they saw and they saw the complete picture from beginning to end, from what they told me, their statements are attached. Linda and Carrie stated that the hole in Stall D has been there for approximately a two year period and has periodically been patched and drilled out by a culprit at least five times during that time. Linda stated that for this reason, they periodically check the womens changing room which is situated in the center of the Prange Way Store, surrounded by womens apparel. There are no ladies signs on the changing room, but there are no mens clothes near that section. The men have a changing room in the mens apparel which is on the far southwest side of the store, nowhere near this changing room. I asked Linda if men occasionally use this changing room and she stated that they do not. Linda and Carrie continued with their story, as I interviewed both of them at the same time and stated that when they observed the mens pants on the floor in Stall D fitting room, they approached and bent down to look under the stall and observed male legs and a male subject sitting in the corner of Stall D, tight against the wall. They stated that the male subject did not move from the position for approximately 20 minutes and there was a female subject in the next stall which would be stall C, trying on a pair of slacks at the time. The girls stated that during the entire time the female was in Stall C, the suspect in Stall D stayed in the stall next to her.

Linda and Carrie stated they both layed on the floor and did ascertain the male subject was pressed against the wall that divided Stall C and D with his face against the dividing wall. At this point Linda left her partner, Carrie, who is also a security officer, and told her to stand by and observe while she called the police. Linda returned shortly to her partner who had moved to the south wall of the enclosed changing area because she heard the male subject starting to come out of his stall D, and hid around the corner to observe. Carrie stated that the male subject came out of Stall D and crossed the three foot aisle into

Stall F which is directly across the aisle from Stall D. They stated the subject continued to sit in stall F laying his jacket and slacks in the 11 inch space from the stall to the floor, the same as he did in thr previous stall. Carrie stated Linda was gone for the police at this time but she noticed the suspect look from under Stall F diagonally across to Stall C where a person can observe up to the lower waist level, the person in Stall C. This is because of the height of the door and the stall from the floor. The door is higher from the floor that the stall, being 19 1/4 inches from the floor, whereas the stall is 11 1/2 inches from the floor. I put my head to the floor in Stall F and could see across into Stall C to crotch height with no problem. Both Linda and I also checked Stall D and by looking through the hole in Stall D into the mirror on the opposite wall, you can see the reflection of a persons complete body.

His intent was without question by the statement given by the two security officers, that they both observed the subject in Stall D with his eye against the wall and his pants wrinkled as if pushed halfway down to his knees and staring at the woman changing clothes in Stall C. See attached statements for further details. Attached is a diagram of a top view of the six stalls in an 11 ft x 20 ft cubicle used for the womens dressing room. On the reverse side of that same page which is attached, is a drawing of both stalls, the side view of where the hold in question was, and the measurements in question.

I processed the subject with fingerprints and photograph and also spoke to Probation & Parole Officer Richard Swade as I was unable to locate Greg Allen's probation officer, William Napiecinski. Mr. Swade is the supervisor and stated that he would put a hold on Greg Allen at the County Jail, which he did, for the charges mentioned and final disposition will be arrived at at the D.A.'s office Monday morning. The State charges are arrived at on this incident because of the repeated morals charges on Greg Allen from the past. The jackknife in question, possible residue from Stall F, is tagged as evidence, along with the scrapings found on the floor beneath the hole in Stall F, and the package of clothes that was in Stall D when Greg Allen was located in Stall F, indicating he was in both

stalls, as stated by the two witnesses and Off. Le Duc who questioned him on the issue and he admitted to Off. Le Duc he was in Stall D. previous to Stall F when he had to retrieve his package of Kool cigarettes. The two slacks in question are also tagged as evidence until final disposition of this case.

An additional statement from James A. Walters, the maintenance man at Prange's, will be attached to confirm that he vacuumed the dressing room in question at approximately 10:30 or 11:00 a.m., on 3/28/86, the day of the incident. It was also noticed at that time by the maintenance man that a second hole was not started in Stall F.

The woman in question in Stall C that was changing her clothes on this issue, was not identified as she left moments before Off. Le Duc arrived with Linda. The only description I have from Carrie and Linda is the unknown female could have been approximately 50 years old.

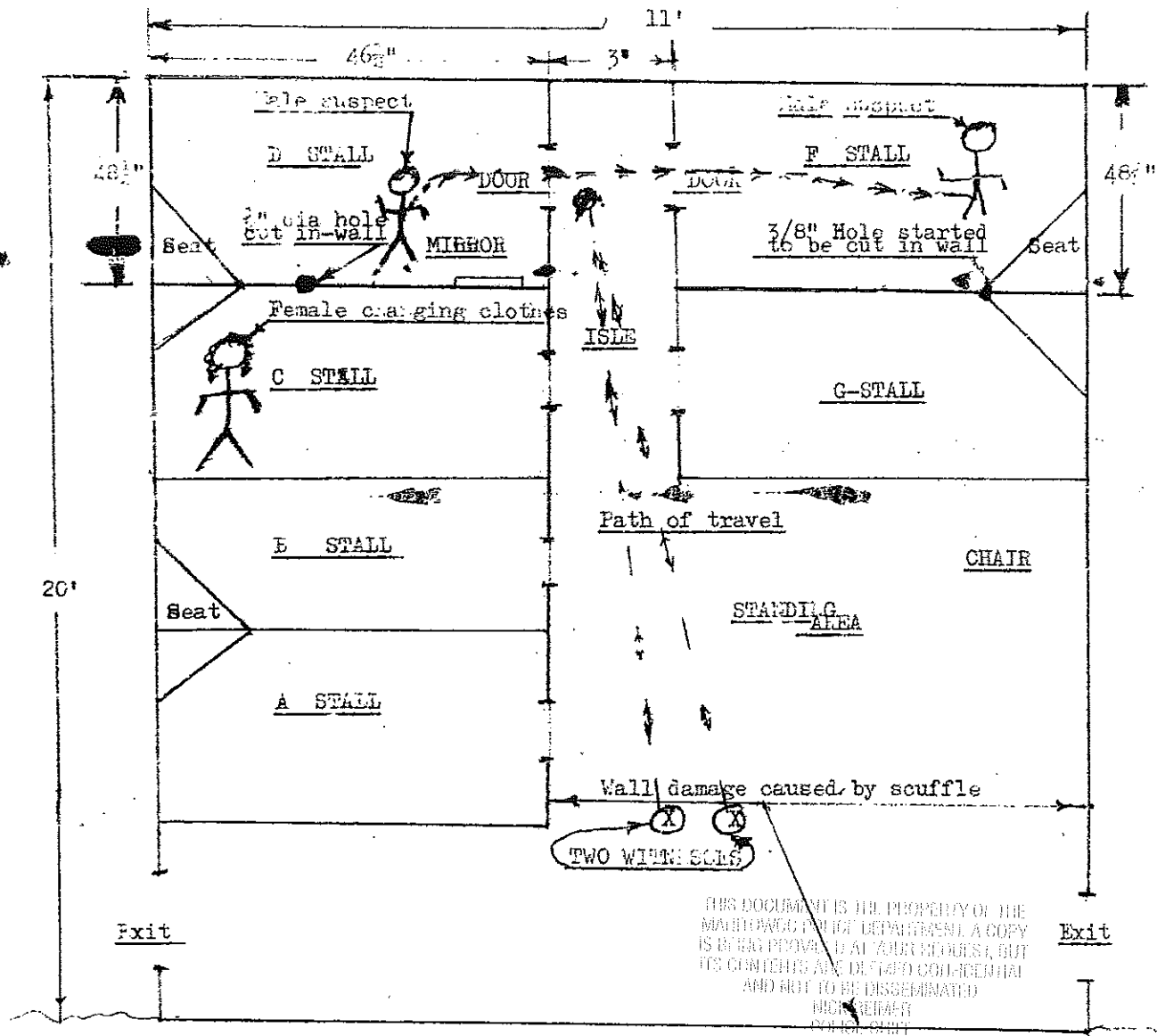

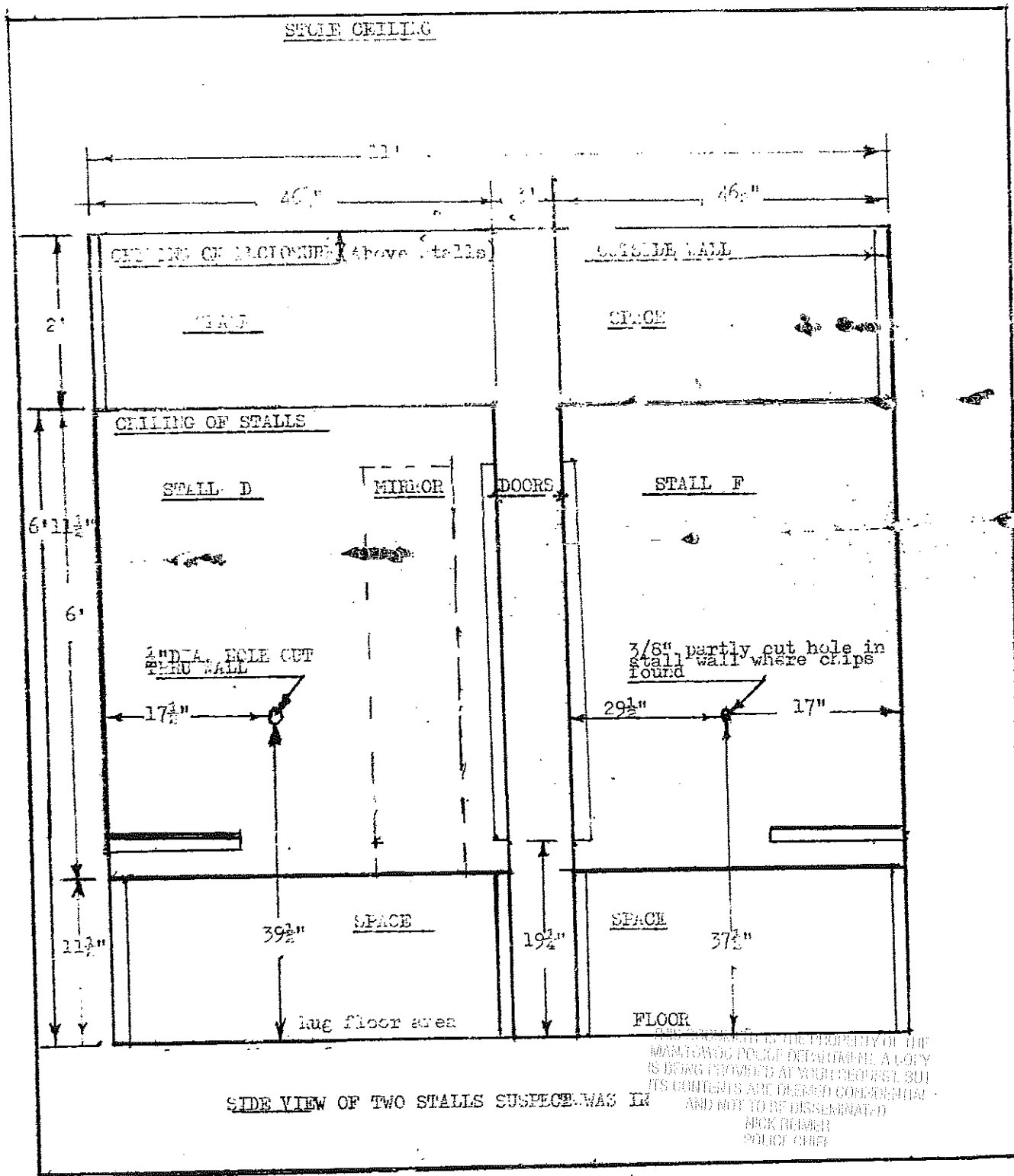

Shortly after 1411 hrs on 03-28-86, I was assigned to assist Officer LeDuc at PrangeWay 700 E. Magnolia Ave. When I arrived, I was escorted to the dressing room in front of and to the left of the front entrance. This appeared to be a women's dressing room as the dressing rooms were surrounded by women's and girl's clothing. Officer LeDuc had a male subject seated in the dressing room. Officer LeDuc handed me a driver's license that he had obtained from the party. The DL identified him as Gregory A. Allen DOB: 01-17-54. LeDuc stated that the security people in the store observed Allen looking through a hole in one of the stall walls and was watching a female disrobe. The security people also stated that Allen went across from the stall that he had originally been in and was lying on the floor and watching a female disrobe. Officer LeDuc and I approached Allen and told him that he was being charged with Disorderly Conduct in violation of the State Statute. Allen was told by Officer LeDuc to stand and place the two pair of pants that he was holding on the chair. Allen was told to turn around so that handcuffs could be placed on his wrists for transport to the police department. At this point, Allen attempted to walk out the North entrance to the dressing rooms. LeDuc and I prevented him from leaving. Allen stopped and for a few seconds it appeared that he was going to cooperate. However, after a few seconds, he stated "you guys aren't going to do this to me again". After saying this, he immediately struck Officer LeDuc in the face ~~in the right eye~~. It appeared that the punch was a solid blow to the face. After the blow to LeDuc a struggle took place. Allen attempted to prevent us from taking him in. After struggling with Allen for several minutes, we managed to gain control of him. As we started to handcuff him, he said "if you guys back off a little, I'll let you cuff me". He then tried to pull away from us again. He struggled with us all the way out to the squad car. Allen told us that the only disorderly people in the store were in uniform. He was transported to the police station in car 49. Officer LeDuc turned over to me a pocket knife which was found in Allen's right front pants pocket. I turned the knife over to Det. Ospedale. Allen was brought to the police dept. and placed in cell #3. I inventoried Allen's belongings and placed them in locker #3. After placing Allen in the squad, I noticed that the Motorola handie-talkie #30 that I was carrying had a small piece of drywall on it and the face of the talkie was scratched.

10-25-83 - I met with the complainant over the area and located two clear footprints on alleys #5 & #6 that are of a different pattern indicating there were two culprits that came from the point of entry as described above to the cash registers, and went back down the same alleys. The measurements are as stated on the attached copy, and there were no fingerprints that could be lifted from the cash registers, as the cash registers were the only two items that were cleaned out, and they took \$29.80 total from the two cash registers in the bar and bowling alley area, (5) singles and the rest was in change. I advised the complainant to call if he located anything else missing or damaged, but it appears as though the culprit (s) just came in and took the change out of the cash registers, and made a quick exit.

and I advised Robert of his rights and had him sign the Your Rights Statement before any questioning. I had him place his feet up on my desk to examine the imprints on the soles of his shoes, and they came out exactly to the prints that I copied down on the lanes placed there by the culprit at the time of the burglary. I advised Robert that the charge was burglary to R. & J. Bowling Lanes, and he denied this at first. We spoke further and as we talked about the burglary Robert admitted that he did break into R & J Lanes then proceeded to give me the story, and the reason for doing so. He stated that on 10-24-83 he was at TOMMY WAGENER, 4304 Ravine Dr., working on his girlfriends car, Patricia LeCaptain, who lives at 4005 Broadway St. in Rapids across the street from the R & J Bowling Lanes. At any rate Robert stated they were working on the transmission and finished it about 4:30 or 5:00 in the morning of 10-25-83 and they went for a walk toward the Manitowoc Bridge on Hwy 141. While walking they were talking about money, as Robert stated that Robert is out of money, and he doesn't know where to get any money to pay his rent or his food, since he is not on relief, and lost his job over an injury he had to his hand at the end of September. Robert stated that he was in need of money and applied for relief in Mid-October of this year, and was told to get a note from his doctor which he tried to do, but didn't get, and because he didn't bring the note in they would not give him any relief money, and they would not talk to him until 7th of November, 1983. In the meantime he has lived at 1016 S. 14th St. for a month and a half, and he pays \$150 a month for his room to a GREG ALLEN and [REDACTED] whom he lives with. He stated he owes them money, and he also owes his girlfriend Pat about \$109 for money he has borrowed from her.

Robert stated that TOMMY WAGENER stated that he knew how to break into R & J Bowling Alleys and he felt it was a way to get some money, so the two of them went to the rear of the bowling alley and kicked in a door, with Tommy Wagener reaching in through the panel he kicked out, and unhooking some welding rods that were put through loops to hold the door shut, and let themselves in. He stated they walked down the alleys, and Robert went to the cash register in the bowling alley section while Tommy went to the cash register in the bar section, and mentioned that he wanted to go into the empty apartment, or at least he thought it was empty adjacent to the bar. Robert stated that he just wanted to get out, and he put the change in

his pocket and left by the same way they entered, running down the alleys, which left the footprints that I have marked on this report that compare exactly with Robert FLICK'S, and in about two minutes TOMMY WAGENER came out and met him out behind the bowling alley. The two of them walked back to Tommy's garage and worked on the car a little more by putting some fluid in the transmission when they both mentioned that they only got a handful of change. Robert stated he only got about \$8 or \$9 change, and when I told him that the amount of cash that was taken was \$29.30 he was a bit startled, stating that he didn't know there was any bills, or that Tommy kept that much money. At any rate he picked up his girlfriend and took her to work, and never told her what he did.

I asked Robert if he was involved in other burglaries, and questioned him on the most recent large burglary at the Janet BREUER residence, and he stated he was not. He was quite shook up because he stated that this would give him two years to serve in jail because of his stipulation on his probation, and wanted to make a deal. I advised him I couldn't make any deals, and I asked him what type of a deal he was talking about. He asked if he could not be sent to jail if he would tell me about 7 or 8 burglaries two of his friends are involved in; one of which is the Breuer residence. I asked him what he was talking about, and he would not give me the names of the two subjects involved, and when asked if he saw any of the items he stated he did. I asked him to describe the items in the Breuer burglary, and Robert stated he recalled a 12 gauge double-barrel shotgun; a 12 gauge pump shotgun; a 20 gauge pump shotgun, and a couple other guns that he doesn't recall what they were. He stated there was also a large silver candlestick that had several risers on it for candles, and when pressed on this issue he wanted to make a deal, but I would not make any deals informing him that this could not be done. He requested I call the D.A. and I advised him he is out of town on weekends, and he will not be able to be contacted until Monday.

I also advised him that this may be alot of hearsay information, and Robert insisted it was not, and also insisted that he is not involved in any of the burglaries. He stated that he was walking over the Rapids Bridge when his two friends had their car parked on South ends of the Rapids Bridge going toward the Breuer residence, and he thought they were fishing. As he walked toward the car he saw no one until one of the fellows appeared and then hid, and then they saw it was Robert they came in the open, and stated they just knocked off the Breuer home, and placed a bunch of guns, still in their cases, in the trunk; a candlestick in question; and a cassette box that contained a large amount of coins, or old coins. He stated he saw no jewelry or anything else, but the two subjects mentioned that they just broke into the Breuer home. He stated he saw the items once more today, as the guns are buried in a woods away from that area, but he refused to give anymore information unless a deal is made. I advised him that the D.A. will be apprised of this in this report, and any further decision will have to come from the D.A. himself, not anyone else.

In the meantime I confiscated the brown suede rubber-bottom shoes that match my drawing exactly with the imprint, size, width, length, and diagram for evidence, which are tagged and placed in the evidence room. Robert started to write but a statement and I was busy.

with another case of a accidental death that I was conferring with the officres on, and when I returned a few minutes later he had torn up the statement, stating he did not wish to write a statement until he talks with the D.A. about a deal. I advised him he could do as he wished, and didn't pursue the issue. He kept stating that he could open up seven or eight burglaries that he was not involved in, but that the other two fellows were involved in, if he would not be placed in jail, and they were not only in the Rapids area, but in a couple other areas of the city; one of them up around Dewey St. I advised him this is only hearsay information unless he came up with more physical evidence, and we will pursue that issue only if he wished on Monday. Robert was processed and transported to County Jail, and his probation officer, Dick Swade was notified of this. I have been trying to make contact with TOMMY WAGENER as the second subject in this burglary, but he had been out-of-town this week, and is allegedly out-of-town all of next week, in Berlin, WI, but I will speak with him as soon as he returns, as I know his father on previous occasions.

I will follow up on that issue as I have contacts with Tommy's father, after I have spoken with Robert Flick.

11-11-83 - Friday - 1700 Hrs. - TOMMY L. WAGENER, DOB: 11-26-64 of 4304 Ravine Dr. reported to the P.D. and his father was with him. I informed him of the charge of burglary, advised him of his rights and let him read the Your Rights statement and sign same which is attached. I had talked to Tommy on the phone yesterday when I told him to report to the P.D. when he was in Water Town visiting his grandmother, and briefly advised him of the complaint and then advised him of his rights. I advised him he is being charged with burglary, and he denied it at that time, but stated he would report.

Tonight Tommy readily came forth when I showed him the footprints, and advised him of some of the things I had implicating him in the burglary, and gave me the story as follows: His statement is attached, and he related that as close as he could remember the things leading up to the time Robert Flick and himself burglarized R & J Bowling Alley as stated on his statement, that is attached, where they were together the previous evening, and then drank a considerable amount of beer after working on Flick's girlfriends car and installing a transmission. At about 4:30 or thereabouts, in the morning on 10-25-83, Pat LeCaptain called and ~~arranged for~~ to be picked up at 6:00 A.M. to go to work by Robert. After the phone call Robert Flick and Tommy Wagener allegedly took a walk into the downtown area of Rapids, and first went to JOHNNIE Nuh's Service Station on Hwy 141 and Archer Rd. He said they got a soda at this point, and Robert was stating that he needed some money just previous to this. Tom stated that Robert asked about breaking into Johnnie Nuh's Service Station and he started to fool around the window pane, but Tommy stated he knew Johnnie Nuh pretty well and did not want to get involved with anything like that with Johnnie's Service Station. Tom stated he stopped, and they both left and walked down Broadway St. and noticed the bowling alley and walked into the vestibule area at the front of the building and looked around for a place to break in, but everything was secure in the front. Tom stated they walked around the back of the bowling alley and saw the door in question that was entered, and Tom stated that he kicked at it, but it didn't break, then Bob kicked at it and it didn't break, and then he kicked at it again and it broke the panel out. Tom stated that Bob Flick more or less picked him up in level position, and put him through a hole in the panel of the door, and once inside Tommy stated he pulled the welding rods out of the loop that held the door shut.

Tom stated that he began wiping off the cash register with his elbow to wipe any fingerprints off while Bob went inside the barroom area around the bar, and to the cash register that he was cleaning out over there. He then walked over by Bob who was behind the bar and he didn't take anything else except a half a pack of cigarettes that was on the back bar. Bob kept all the change out of the bar cash register, then they both walked toward a back room and saw that it was living quarters, and they both ran out of the building the same way they came in. From that point they went back to Tom's house and Tom stated they counted the money that was \$22 in change or thereabouts, but he didn't see any paper money. Tom said he put all the money in his bedroom and watched TV and made a pizza. At 6:00 A.M. they both took Pat to work and returned back to his house and got the money that they put away, and then they drove to Manitowoc Cour Bank and cashed the change in. Tom stated that Robert kept all the money except for the \$4.00 in dimes that he kept when he grabbed from the cash register when they first went in. From that point they went to eat and get some cigarettes; Bob paid for the meal, and still never gave him any money. Bob also cashed the change in alone in the bank, while Tom waited in Pat's car for him. Later that day they put a new set of brake linings on Pat's car, and went to sleep. When they woke up they went to Kevin Harlow's house and from that point Tom didn't see Bob that day anymore. Tom stated he was not involved in any other break ins with Bob or anyone else. Tom added that he was picked up in Watertown by a friend of his named Jeffery Krueger because he didn't have any money and Jeff offered to drive him to Watertown and pick him up and bring him back to Manitowoc. During their travels back from Watertown, Tom stated that Jeff Krueger told him that Kevin Harlow and Robert Flick stole some guns and Kevin got paranoid because the police were talking to him and told Robert to throw the guns in the river and get rid of them. Tom stated that Jeff told him that Robert picked him up and decided to hide the guns instead of throwing them in the river, and possibly selling them in the future. Jeff went onto tell Tom that they buried the guns in some leaves after they were wrapped in plastic,

and oil rags in the woods at the north end of 40th St. somewhere. This part is also in the Breuer B & E report dated 11-1-83. Tom stated that Jeff also told them that he saw Robert and Kevin break up the silver candlestick, and was with him when they drove to a store in Manitowoc and cashed it in for money. Jeff drove them to the coin shop, but didn't get any money from the silver they cashed in. I advised Tom I would speak to Jeff further on this issue. Statement is attached.

I also questioned Tom on where the shoes were that he wore when he broke into the bowling alley and he stated that he left them in Watertown at his grandmothers house, and they match the drawing that I have on this complaint sheet exactly. I advised Tom to bring them back to Manitowoc when he goes there until this is over with.

On 11-19-83 - Wed. - Robert Flick had the jailer contact me and stated he wanted to talk to me, and when I went over to the Sheriff's Dept. after clearing through the D.A.'s office who contacted Robert Flick's attorney Mr. Pozorski; Mr. Pozorski came out of the cell block and told me that Mr. Flick did not say this, he wanted to know, "If I wanted to talk to Mr. Flick." I advised Mr. Pozorski that this was not the case, as I had nothing to say to Mr. Flick, and as I found out later from Mr. Flick, he did want to talk to me, but his attorney refused to let him talk to me. Robert Flick stated that he wanted to make a statement out and confess to everything, and his attorney advised him against it stating, "I can get you off of all this without a thing."

On 11-14-83 - Monday I was contacted by Parole Off. Dick Swade who related that Robert Flick wanted to talk to me about this burglary and another burglary which would have been the Breuer case. I met Mr. Swade and Robert Flick at the County Jail at approximately 4:15 P.M. this date. Again Robert was advised of his rights and the part pertaining to this burglary only is that Robert Flick stated that he did contact Tommy Wagener by phone, and tried to get him not to say anything, but Tommy stated that he was going to admit to the burglary at R & J Bowling Lanes, and with this Robert Flick admitted to me in the presence of his parole officer that he did break into R & J Bowling Alley with Tommy Wagener as stated above. He also admitted that the statement he gave me earlier was true, and the information his attorney gave to the D.A.'s office of Robert not admitting to the R & J Bowling Alley incident was false, and was only a smoke screen to see if he could beat the case. From this point Robert admitted that from the time they walked from Wagener's house and broke into R & J Bowling Alley was as stated by Tommy Wagener, except that he reversed the money bit, stating that Wagener got most of the money and he only got \$8 or \$9, and stating that Tom knew how to break into the bowling alley and not himself. He stated that he already heard about me checking shoes from Kevin Harlow who tipped him off after I questioned Kevin, and he switched shoes and came to the P.D., but without knowing it he put the shoes on he wore in the burglary, and took off the shoes he thought he wore in the burglary, and that is how I caught him with the shoes that were comparable to the diagram I drew. He does not wish to give a written statement at this point because he is also involved in another burglary at the Ned Breuer residence, and there is some plea bargaining he is requesting on that issue.

I of the Manitowoc Police Department that I do not have to make any statement against myself, no threats or promises having been made, I have been given the Miranda Warning and fully understand my rights. I give the following information to the Manitowoc Police Department:

On Oct. 24th 1983 at about 12:00 noon, till about 7:30 P.M. that same night Robert Flich & I were working on his girlfriend Pat LeCaptian's car in my fathers garage. We finished it & took it for a ride and left it off at LeCaptains house. Then Robert & Pat went on a ride and I walked home to eat. Then Robert came back to my house about 9:30 P.M. or 10:00 P.M. and we worked on the brakes of Pats car. We test drove it and returned to my house about 10:30 P.M. We sat and watched T.V. (Rob & I) till about 4:30 A.M. 10-25-83. Then Pat called & said to pick her up at 6:00 A.M. to take her to work. Then after that we took a walk down the Mill Rd. to the bridge & to Johnny Nue' Service Station on Hy.# 141 & Archer Rd. and got a soda. Just before this at my house we talked about stealing some stuff for money. Robert asked me about this as he needed money, and we were drinking quite a bit of beer at the time. Robert then asked me about breaking into Johnny Neu's and he started fooling around with the window pane. I told Robert to stop it because I knew Johnny and he was a friend of mine. He stopped & we left & walked down Broadway St. & noticed the Bowling Alley (R&J). We walked into the front hallway and couldn't get in there, and then we walked around the back of the alley and saw the door in back. I kicked it and it didn't break, then Bob kicked it and it didn't break, then I kicked it again and it broke out the panel. Robert then kind of picked me up so my body could go through the panel and I went in first. I locked the door behind me. I put loops to hold the door shut and let Robert in. Once inside we both walked down the alleys and went to the cash register in the bowling alley section. The register was opened and Bob grabbed one handfull of change and put it in his pocket. Then he went to the next cash register in the barroom while I stayed there and cleared out that one, and also tried to wipe out my fingerprints while Bob was going through the other register. Then I went by Bob ~~maxxxxx~~ behind the bar and he finished taking the money out of the register and was going through the drawers. I didn't take anything except a half a pack of cigarettes that was on the back bar. Then we both walked toward the back room & saw that it was a living quarters and we both ran out of the building the same way we came in. We both left the same time and went back to my house. We counted the money and it was about \$22.00 in change, and he didn't tell me about any paper money. We put all the money in my bedroom, watched T.V. and made a pizza. At 6:00 A.M. we both took Pat to work and returned home & got the money and took it to the Manitowoc Co. Bank and cashed it in. Robert kept all the money except about \$1.00 worth of dimes I kept. Bob & I went out to eat and got some cigarettes that Bob paid for, but he never gave me any money. Bob cashed in the money at the bank alone while I waited in Pats car for him. Later that day we put new brake linings on the car & I went to sleep.

Involved in any other break ins with Bob or anyone else.

After Det. H. Ospedale called me in Watertown at my grandmothers house, I first heard something of some stolen guns. He told me to come back to Manitowoc because I was charged with burglary with Robert on R&J Bowling Alley. I agreed to come back and talk with him.

I was picked up in Watertown by Jeffery Krueger who came for me because I didn't have any money to come back with. On the way back Jeffery Krueger told me that Kevin Farlow & Robert Flick stole some guns and Kevin got parole because the police were talking to him and he told Robert to throw them in the river and get rid of them. Jeff said Robert was talking to him and told him about the guns, and Jeff & Robert decided to hide the guns and sell them in the future. Jeff said they burried the guns in some leaves wrapped in plastic and oil rags in the woods at the N. end of 40th St. somewhere. He told me this on the way back from Watertown. Jeff also said he saw Kevin & Robert break up the silver candle stick and he drove Kevin & Robert to a store downtown in Mtwe. to cash it in for money. Jeff used his car to drive them but he didn't get any money I don't think. I've read the above and found it to be exactly as I told it to Det. H. Ospedale.

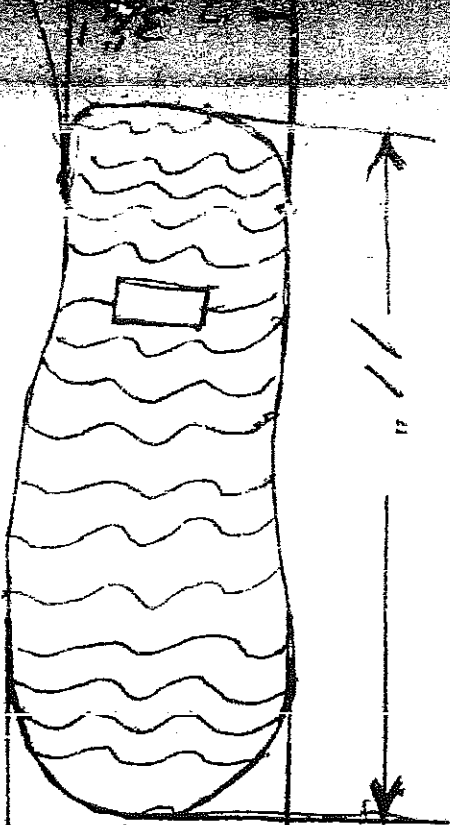

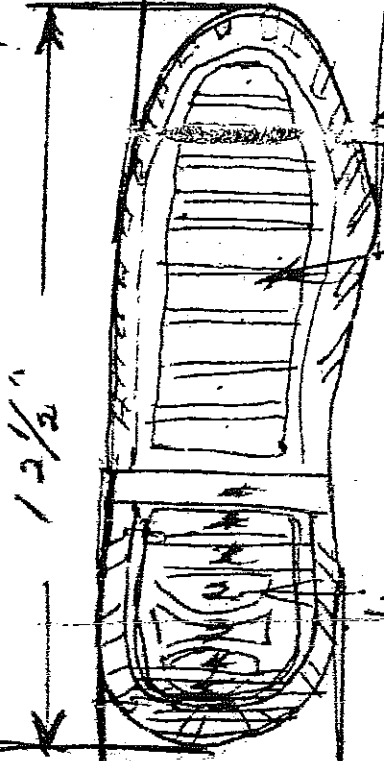

Mr. Cumming has more cleaning up to do in the residence and I will accompany him on 2/9/89, to further see if there are any other items of previous burglaries that may have been committed by one of these two suspects. The credit cards have been tagged with evidence tag #3767.
