On November 6, 2005, S/A Kevin L. Heimerl and S/A Lisa Wilson assisted with the investigation of the missing person Teresa Marie Halbach, in the Town of Gibson, Manitowoc County, WI. S/A Heimerl and S/A Wilson were conducting a neighborhood canvas in the area surrounding the intersection of State Highway 147 and Avery Road.

On November 6, 2005, S/A Heimerl and S/A Wilson made contact with two individuals residing at 3622 STH 147, in the Town of Gibson. The subjects residing at this residence were identified as Aaron L. Steeno, W/M, DOB 07/29/1979, and Kristin I. Junk, W/F, DOB 08/09/1983.

Investigators asked Steeno and Junk if they had seen news coverage of the missing female and her vehicle, and both Steeno and Junk stated they had seen pictures of the missing female and her vehicle on the news. The investigators inquired as to whether or not Steeno or Junk had seen the female or the vehicle in the area. Steeno and Junk both indicated that they had not seen the female or her vehicle in the area.

Investigators inquired if Steeno or Junk were familiar with, or had ever conducted business with the Avery family or their business. Steeno and Junk stated they were not familiar with the Avery family or their business.

Investigators inquired as to whether or not Steeno or Junk had made any observations of unusual or abnormal activity in their neighborhood during the course of the previous week, and Steeno and Junk stated that they had not.
