On Wednesday, November 9, 2005, at approximately 3:44 p.m., S/A Joseph M. Kapitany received custody of the original finger and palm prints of Steven Avery, Sr. S/A Kapitany received them from Calumet County Evidence Technician Sergeant Bill Tyson. The fingerprints had recently been taken as the result of a search warrant initiated for Steven Avery's fingerprints and DNA.

S/A Kapitany took custody of the prints and transported them to the Two Rivers Police Department and subsequently turned them over to S/A Debra K. Strauss for ultimate transport to the Wisconsin State Crime Laboratory in Madison. S/A Strauss and S/A Kapitany did also fax a photocopy of the fingerprints to the Wisconsin State Crime Laboratory. S/A Kapitany turned over the prints to S/A Strauss, who subsequently turned them over to S/A James Holmes for transport to the Wisconsin State Crime Laboratory.

The Wisconsin State Crime Laboratory in Madison received standard fingerprint and palm print cards bearing the name Steven A. Avery, and assigned Crime Laboratory Case No. M05-2467, Item AS.

Both S/A Kapitany and S/A Strauss endorsed the evidence property custody document for the Calumet County Sheriff's Department showing the purpose of change of custody as transmittal. The fingerprint and palm prints were assigned Calumet County Sheriff's Department Items 2, 3 and 4. This document will be attached as a related object file and the original will be returned to the Calumet County Sheriff's Department. The Crime Laboratory receipt will be attached as a related object file and forwarded to DCIR.
