On November 6, 2005, S/A Kevin L. Heimerl and S/A Lisa Wilson assisted with the investigation of the missing person Teresa Marie Halbach in the Town of Gibson, Manitowoc County, WI. S/A Heimerl and S/A Wilson conducted a neighborhood canvas of the area of State Highway 147 and Avery Road.

On November 6, 2005, at approximately 1:50 p.m., S/A Heimerl and S/A Wilson made personal contact with three individuals to speak with them in regards to the neighborhood canvas and any information they may have related to this investigation. These individuals were identified as Todd H. Mott, W/M, DOB 03/24/1973, who resides at 3709 STH 147, Two Rivers, WI, cell phone 920-905-1557; Harlan A. Mott, W/M, DOB 09/10/1946, who resides at 3711 STH 147, Two Rivers, WI, 920-755-4074; and Harlan's wife, Sharon A. Mott, W/F, who resides at 3711 STH 147, Two Rivers, WI.

S/A Heimerl and S/A Wilson pulled into the driveway of Harlan Mott's residence and ultimately made contact with Harlan and Sharon Mott and their son, Todd Mott.

Investigators spoke with the Motts and asked if they had seen recent media coverage concerning the missing female from Calumet County. The Motts stated that they had seen media coverage of the missing female. Investigators asked if they had seen pictures of the female and her vehicle and they stated that they had. The Motts were asked if they had seen the female or the vehicle in the area, as the Motts reside approximately one-half mile west of STH 147 and Avery Road. The Motts stated that they had not seen the female or the vehicle in the area.

Investigators asked the Motts if they had made any observations or found anything in the area which they felt had been related to the investigation during the course of the previous week. The Motts stated they had not seen or heard anything which they felt was unusual or related to the investigation. Investigators asked the Motts if they were familiar with the Avery family or the Avery salvage business. Harlan Mott stated that he knows Al, Chuck and Earl Avery, however, he stated he does not know Steve Avery. Harlan and Todd Mott stated that neither of them have been to the Avery business for approximately six months to one year. The Motts provided no further information
