On November 7, 2005, S/A Kevin L. Heimerl and S/A James A. Sielehr assisted with the investigation of the missing person, Teresa Marie Halbach, in the Town of Gibson, Manitowoc County, WI. S/A Heimerl and S/A Sielehr conducted a neighborhood canvas of the area surrounding STH 147 and Avery Rd.

On November 7, 2005, at approximately 9:00 a.m., S/A Heimerl and S/A Sielehr made personal contact with two subjects who were identified as Rickey W. Nelson, M/W, DOB 03/05/1956, and his wife, Patti L. Nelson, F/W, DOB 07/10/1964, who reside at 12333 Jambo Creek Rd., Two Rivers, WI, 920-755-4083.

Investigators asked the Nelson's if they had seen media coverage concerning the missing female and her vehicle from Calumet County. The Nelson's stated that they had seen media coverage of this investigation. The Nelson's stated that they have seen pictures of the missing female and her vehicle on the news. The Nelson's stated that they have not seen the female or her vehicle in the area.

Investigators asked the Nelson's if they were familiar with the Avery family or the Avery Salvage business. Rickey Nelson stated that he was at Avery's Salvage business approximately one week earlier on a Saturday, purchasing auto parts.

Investigators asked the Nelson's if they had observed anything unusual or out of the ordinary in their neighborhood during the course of the previous week or if they had made any observations which they felt may be potentially related to this investigation. Patti Nelson stated that an unusual incident occurred to her during the course of the previous week. Patti Nelson provided the following information:

Patti Nelson stated that on Monday evening, October 31, 2005, at approximately 9:30 p.m., she was traveling home from work and was traveling southbound on STH 147, west of Jambo Creek Rd. Patti Nelson stated that as she was nearing the intersection with Jambo Creek Rd., she observed a large truck, which she described as being similar to a 250. Patti Nelson stated that this truck was traveling southbound on STH 147, in front of her vehicle. Patti Nelson stated that this truck drew her attention because the truck was traveling very slowly in its lane of traffic. Patti Nelson stated that the truck was traveling so slowly that she initially thought that the operator of the vehicle was looking for something. Patti Nelson stated that she was following this vehicle in a location on STH 147, between Avery Rd., and Jambo Creek Rd. Patti Nelson stated that the truck was traveling so slowly that she began to pass the truck and because it was traveling so slowly and unusually as she passed the truck it forced her to miss her turn onto Jambo Creek Rd. Patti Nelson stated that she then observed that after she passed the truck, the truck turned left or north on Jambo Creek Rd. Patti Nelson described the truck as being taller than a normal full size pickup truck. Patti Nelson stated that the front of the truck was higher than the front of S/A Heimerl's truck, which is a GMC-2500 full size pickup truck.

Patti Nelson was asked for further details concerning the truck she observed and she stated that she could only determine that it was a dark colored full size pickup truck. Patti Nelson stated that she believed that she could only see the silhouette of one occupant in the vehicle. Patti

Nelson was asked if she recognized the truck from the area or if she believed that she had ever seen this truck before and she stated that she did not.

Rickey Nelson provided further information concerning a conversation he had with his neighbor, Wilmer Siebert, who lives across Jambo Creek Rd. Rickey Nelson stated that he spoke with Wilmer Siebert and Siebert informed Rickey Nelson that Siebert had apparently observed a tan colored truck in the Radant gravel pit on one evening during the previous week. Rickey Nelson stated that Siebert provided no further information to him concerning this incident. Wilmer Siebert did not provide this information to investigators during an interview with Siebert, which occurred approximately 15 minutes prior to the interview with the Nelson's.
