On November 7, 2005, S/A Kevin L. Heimerl assisted in the investigation of the missing person Teresa Marie Halbach in the Town of Gibson, Manitowoc County, WI. S/A Heimerl conducted a neighborhood canvas of the area of STH 147 and Avery Road.

On November 7, 2005, at approximately 7:45 a.m., S/A Heimerl made personal contact with Bruce H. Sand, W/M, DOB 01/13/1956, who resides at 3606 STH 147, Two Rivers, WI, cellular telephone 920-905-3443. Sands resides on STH 147 approximately one-quarter mile west of Avery Road.

S/A Heimerl asked Sand if he had seen recent media coverage of the missing female and her vehicle from Calumet County. Sand stated he had seen the media coverage and had seen pictures of the female and her vehicle. Sand stated that he had not seen the female or her vehicle in the area. Sand stated that he works long hours and normally leaves his residence by 8:00 a.m., and does not arrive home until approximately 9:00 p.m. Sand was asked if he had made any observations of unusual activity in the area in the previous week or if he had made any observations of anything he felt was potentially related to the investigation. Sand stated that he had not seen anything unusual or potentially related to the investigation.

Sand was asked if he is familiar with the Avery family or the Avery salvage business. Sand stated that he and his son race cars and they have gotten parts from Avery's Auto Salvage in the past. Sand stated that the last time he was at the business was approximately March of 2005. Sand further stated that he has done drywall work in Chuck Avery's residence in the past. Sand stated that he does not know Steve Avery very well.

Sand informed S/A Heimerl that he had walked his ditch line in front of his residence after learning of the law enforcement activity in the area. He stated that on Tuesday, 11/01/2005, he found a Taco Bell bag in his ditch. Sand produced the bag from his shed, and S/A Heimerl noted it to be a plastic Taco Bell food bag only containing one napkin. S/A Heimerl did not observe any type of evidence on or in the bag which appeared to be related to the investigation. Sand provided no further information.
