On November 7, 2005, S/A Kevin L. Heimerl and S/A James A. Sielehr assisted with the investigation of the missing person, Teresa Marie Halbach, in the Town of Gibson, Manitowoc County, WI. S/A Heimerl and S/A Sielehr conducted a neighborhood canvas of the area surrounding STH 147 and Avery Rd.

On November 7, 2005, at approximately 1:30 p.m., S/A Heimerl and S/A Sielehr made personal contact with a subject identified as James L Pike, M/W, DOB 11/01/1955, who resides at 4209 Kuss Rd., Two Rivers, WI, 920-755-4306.

Investigators asked Pike if he had seen the recent media coverage concerning the missing female from Calumet County. Pike stated that he has seen the media coverage. Investigators asked Pike if he had seen pictures of the missing female and her vehicle and he stated that he had. Investigators asked if Pike had seen that female or her vehicle in the area and he stated that he has not. Investigators asked Pike if he had seen any activity, which he found to be unusual during the course of the previous week or if he had discovered anything on his property, which he felt was abnormal. Pike stated that he has not seen anything out of the ordinary nor has he found anything unusual on his property during the course of the previous week. Pike stated that on Monday, Wednesday, and Friday, of the previous week during the afternoon hours, he was hunting in the woods east of his residence on the south side of Kuss Rd. Pike stated that while hunting he did not discover anything unusual.

Pike was asked if he was familiar with the Avery family or the Avery Salvage business and Pike stated that he is somewhat familiar with the Avery family and their business. Pike stated that he has not had any contact with the Avery's or their business in several years.

Pike stated that his next door neighbor, Leo Richmond, had notified Pike of an unusual circumstance, which occurred on the evening of Friday, November 4, 2005. Pike stated that it was his understanding that an unknown female stopped at the Richmond residence late in the evening on 11/04/2005. Pike stated that Richmond would have further information concerning that incident. Pike provided no further information.
