On November 8, 2005, S/A Kevin L. Heimerl assisted with the investigation of the missing person Teresa Marie Halbach in the Town of Gibson, Manitowoc County, WI. S/A Heimerl conducted a neighborhood canvas of the area surrounding STH 147 and Avery Road.

On November 8, 2005, at 12:30 p.m., S/A Heimerl made personal contact with a subject identified as Lawrence F. Wojcik, W/M, DOB 10/06/1941, who resides at 13227 Jambo Creek Road, Two Rivers, 920-755-4672. Lawrence Wojcik stated he resides at this residence with his wife, Judy Wojcik. Wojcik's residence is located approximately 1/10th mile north of the intersection of STH 147 and Jambo Creek Road.

S/A Heimerl asked Wojcik if he had seen the recent media coverage concerning the missing female from Calumet County. Wojcik stated that he had seen the media coverage. Wojcik stated he had seen pictures of the missing female and her vehicle. Wojcik stated he has not seen the female or her vehicle in the area. Wojcik stated he has walked his wooded acreage surrounding his property and was aware that a team of searchers had also walked his property. He stated he did not discover anything which he felt was related to the investigation.

S/A Heimerl asked Wojcik if he had seen any activity in the neighborhood during the course of the previous week which he felt was abnormal or unusual or potentially related to the investigation. Wojcik stated he had not seen any unusual activity. Wojcik was asked if he was familiar with the Avery family or their business. Wojcik stated he is not really familiar with the Avery family or their business. Wojcik stated that earlier in the year he did take an old vehicle he owned to the salvage yard, and has had no contact with the Avery business or Avery family since that incident.
