On November 8, 2005, S/A Kevin L. Heimerl assisted with the investigation of the missing person Teresa Marie Halbach in the Town of Gibson, Manitowoc County, WI. S/A Heimerl conducted a neighborhood canvas of the area surrounding STH 147 and Avery Road.

On November 8, 2005, at 12:45 p.m., S/A Heimerl made personal contact with a subject identified as Barry H. Grimmer, W/M, DOB 04/16/1943, who resides at 13303 Jambo Creek Road, Two Rivers, 920-755-2774. Grimmer stated he resides at this residence with his wife, Diane A. Grimmer. Grimmer's residence is located approximately 1/20th mile north of the intersection of STH 147 and Jambo Creek Road.

S/A Heimerl asked Grimmer if he had seen the recent media coverage concerning the missing female and her vehicle from Calumet County. Grimmer stated that he had seen the media coverage. S/A Heimerl asked if Grimmer had seen pictures of the missing female and her vehicle, and he stated he had. Grimmer stated he has not seen the female or her vehicle in the area.

S/A Heimerl asked Grimmer if he had seen any activity which was abnormal or unusual for his neighborhood during the course of the previous week. Grimmer stated he had not seen anything out of the ordinary during the previous week. Grimmer further stated that he has spoken with his wife, Diane Grimmer, and is aware that this wife has not seen anything out of the ordinary or potentially related to this investigation. Grimmer stated that, had his wife seen anything unusual, she would have shared that information with Grimmer.

Grimmer was asked if he was familiar with the Avery family or their business. Grimmer stated that he grew up in the area as a child and at the time that he was a child the Aveyr business was beginning. Grimmer stated he then moved out of state and recently returned to this area,
