On November 12, 2005, S/A Kevin L. Heimerl and Calumet County Sheriff's Department Investigator John Dederling assisted with the investigation of the missing person Teresa Marie Halbach in the Town of Gibson, Manitowoc County, WI. S/A Heimerl and Deputy Dederling conducted a neighborhood canvas of the area surrounding STH 147 and Avery Road.

On November 12, 2005, at 11:55 a.m., S/A Heimerl and Deputy Dederling made personal contact with Wesley S. Springstube, W/M, DOB 03/05/1957, who reside at 13136 White Cedar Road, Two Rivers, 920-755-4665. Wesley Springstube was being interviewed related to the neighborhood canvas and in an attempt to gain additional information from Wesley Springstube as to the identity of a young female who stopped at the Leo Richmond residence on Kuss Road on the evening of 11/04/2005.

Investigators asked Wesley Springstube if he had seen the recent media coverage of the missing female and her vehicle from Calumet County. Springstube stated that he had seen that media coverage. Investigators asked Springstube if he had seen that female or her vehicle in the area and he stated that he had not. Springstube stated that he normally leaves for work in the early morning hours while it is still dark, and normally returns home after dark. Investigators asked Springstube if he had made any observations of abnormal or unusual activity in the area during the course of the first week of November, and Springstube stated that he did not observe any unusual activity. Investigators asked Springstube if he was aware of any information that was potentially related to this investigation and he stated he was not.

Springstube was asked if he was home on the evening of 11/04/2005, and he stated that he was. Investigators asked Springstube if he recalled any young females stopping at his residence that evening during the late evening hours. Springstube stated he may have been sleeping, however, he does not recall anyone stopping at his residence. Springstube stated that it is possible that someone may have stopped at his residence to see one of his children, and he may not be aware of it. Springstube did state that he believed that it was on the same date, 11/04/2005, that his daughter Jessica's friend, Hannah, stopped at their residence at approximately 5:30 to 6:00 p.m. to pick up pictures. Springstube stated that he would speak to his son, Chad Springstube, concerning that evening to determine if Chad had any friends stop over at his residence that evening.

Wesley Springstube was unable to provide any further information.
