On November 15, 2005, S/A Kevin L. Heimerl conducted follow-up investigation regarding the homicide investigation of Teresa Marie Halbach, in the Town of Gibson, Manitowoc County, WI. S/A Heimerl conducted follow-up investigation to attempt to identify a young female who had stopped at the [REDACTED] residence at [REDACTED], during the late evening hours of 11/04/2005.

On 11/15/2005, at 11:13 a.m., S/A Heimerl made personal contact with [REDACTED], W/F, DOB [REDACTED], at her residence at [REDACTED], Two Rivers, WI. [REDACTED]'s mother was present during this interview.

S/A Heimerl asked [REDACTED] if she was in the area of [REDACTED] or [REDACTED] on the evening of 11/04/2005, possibly to pick up her brother, [REDACTED]. [REDACTED] stated she was in that area on that evening. [REDACTED] stated that she recalled it was a Friday evening, approximately 1½ weeks prior to the interview. [REDACTED] stated on that evening, at approximately 11:30 to 11:45 p.m., she received a telephone call from her brother, [REDACTED] indicating he needed a ride from the [REDACTED] residence, as the person who was going to drive him home had to work late. [REDACTED] stated that her brother, [REDACTED] gave her general directions to [REDACTED] and explained to her that she needed to turn onto [REDACTED] and to look for a residence with basketball hoops and lights on at the residence. [REDACTED] stated she drove to the area and ultimately drove down a road and was traveling down this road off of CTH Q when she saw a residence with lights on and also saw basketball hoops in the driveway. [REDACTED] stated she pulled in the driveway and knocked on the front door and an adult male answered the door. She stated she recognized this adult male as being [REDACTED], and stated she knows [REDACTED] from church. [REDACTED] then stated she realized she had the wrong residence and then asked for directions to the [REDACTED] residence. [REDACTED] stated she was ultimately successful in reaching the [REDACTED] residence and she and [REDACTED] then returned home to their residence.

S/A Heimerl asked [REDACTED] if she recalled what she was wearing for clothing on that evening. [REDACTED] stated she was probably wearing a red hooded sweatshirt. S/A Heimerl asked [REDACTED] how she carries her car keys, and she stated her car keys are attached to a lanyard she described as being black in color.

Based on the information received from [REDACTED] concerning her admission that she stopped at the [REDACTED] residence during the late evening hours on 11/04/2005, S/A Heimerl is confident that [REDACTED] is the unknown female described by [REDACTED] during his interview as part of the neighborhood canvas.
