On Friday, November 11, 2005, S/A Michael Rindt and S/A Rodney J. Pevytoe conducted an examination of some burn debris noted during the search of the general area surrounding the Avery Auto Salvage property. The Special Agents conducted an examination of a small amount of burn debris located in back of a trailer utilized by Steven Avery. The debris was cast down an embankment to the south and immediately off the trimmed lawn area of the Avery residence. The two Special Agents examined the burn material and identified no items of suspected evidentiary material. The material was placed into a new sealed 5-gallon container and turned over to Deputy Rick Riemer, of the Calumet County Sheriff's Department.
