On Thursday, January 19, 2006, at approximately 1:42 p.m., S/A Thomas J. Fassbender and Investigator Mark Wiegert of the Calumet County Sheriff's Department interviewed James L. Doubek, 2528 44th St., Two Rivers, WI, 920-793-4600. Doubek is the mail carrier that delivers mail to the Avery's. S/A Fassbender and Investigator Wiegert met with Doubek at the Two Rivers Post Office.

Upon meeting with Doubek, they identified themselves and the reason for their contacting Doubek. Doubek provided the following information:

Doubek advised that he usually delivered mail to the Avery's at about 12:00, noon. Doubek advised he does not recall seeing a vehicle matching the Halbach vehicle on that Monday, October 31, 2005, or anytime that week. Doubek advised that Steven Avery's mailbox is located at the end of Avery Road. Doubek advised that he usually delivers the mail and does not even look down towards Steven Avery's residence.

Doubek advised that he did not recall seeing anyone that day. Doubek advised he did not recall seeing any smoke or a fire coming from the Avery property that day.

Doubek advised he may see Steven Avery's mother one time a year and his father maybe one or two times a year.

Doubek commented that when Halbach was reported missing, he kept an eye out, looking for her vehicle. Doubek reiterated that he saw nothing the entire week of October 31, 2005.

No further questions were asked and the contact was concluded at 1:48 p.m.
