On Thursday, September 28, 2006, S/A Thomas J. Fassbender, along with Investigator Mark Wiegert, Deputy Nick Sablich, Deputy Rick Riemer, Deputy Jeremy Hawkins, all of the Calumet County Sheriff's Department, and Evidence Technician Daniel Feucht, with the Fox Valley Technical College and the Grand Chute Police Department examined chunks of concrete, which had been taken from the floor of the unattached garage, associated with the residence that Steven Avery had resided at, in October of 2005, address of 12932 Avery Rd., Two Rivers, WI. This concrete had been seized pursuant to search warrant, on March 1, and 2, 2006. The concrete had been maintained in the custody of the Calumet County Sheriff's Department and Deputy Hawkins. During the examination activity, on September 28, 2006, custody of the concrete evidence was temporarily transferred to Deputy Sablich, as Deputy Hawkins had to attend court during the examination process.

During the examination of the concrete, all pieces of the concrete were first visually examined under bright lights for trace evidence, such as hair or blood. Fresh sheets of freezer wrap were utilized for each new item of evidence. The examiners also utilized gloves while examining the evidence and changed gloves before examining the next item of evidence. Each item of evidence consisted of at least one chunk of concrete and sometimes multiple smaller chunks of concrete. The evidence was contained in paper bags, which were inside five gallon plastic pails, which were sealed. The pails were stored and removed from a locked storage room, located within a maintenance garage on the north side of the north parking area, north of the sheriff's department.

Each item of evidence, which contained one or more pieces of concrete were identified by letter and number, beginning with C-1 and ending with C-16. Each item was also assigned a property tag number and item number by the Calumet County Sheriff's Department.

After the items of concrete were visually examined, they were then examined utilizing Blue Star spray to illuminate any potential traces of blood on the concrete. The Blue Star spray was sprayed on the top surface area of the concrete chunks, as well as the broken side of the concrete chunks which had originally faced toward the crack on the concrete floor. The crack ran through an area that had illuminated previously when sprayed with Luminol.

During this process, the chunks of concrete were sprayed with the Blue Star and then the lighting was dimed to lowlight/dark conditions and observations were made, which included a blue illumination when a potential positive result was obtained for the presence of blood. During this entire process, photographs of the concrete were taken, both during the lighted examination and the Blue Star examination. Deputy Riemer took the majority of the photographs. During the Blue Star examination, chalk was utilized to circle many of the areas on the chunks of concrete that showed the blue illumination.

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This was done in anticipation of later swabbing those surface areas for subsequent analysis for the presence of blood and/or DNA.
