**Wisconsin Division of Criminal Investigation Case Report**

On Thursday, December 21, 2006, S/A Thomas J. Fassbender and Sergeant Bill Tyson, of the Calumet County Sheriff's Department interviewed Lynn Zigmunt, Clerk of Courts for Manitowoc County. The interview took place at the Clerk of Courts office. Zigmunt provided the following information:

Zigmunt advised that she has been working for the Clerk of Courts in Manitowoc County for 2 years. Zigmunt advised that during that time, she has never seen Lieutenant Jim Lenk in the Clerk of Courts office area on his own. She explained that she called him over on one occasion for a meeting in her office, regarding procedures she was putting together for contraband evidence storage. She advised that Lieutenant Lenk and another official from the sheriff's department, who she believed to be Craig Schetter, met with her. She advised that they came in, met with her and left. Zigmunt advised she was provided Lt. Lenk's name for her meeting, because he was the evidence custodian at the sheriff's department at that time.

Zigmunt advised she has never seen Sergeant Andy Colburn in the Clerk of Courts office area

Zigmunt advised that no one from the sheriff's department has ever asked her about the location of the Steven Avery Sexual Assault file, under Case No: 85-FE-118.

Zigmunt provided no further information and the interview was concluded.
