On Thursday, December 21, 2006, S/A Thomas J. Fassbender and Sergeant Bill Tyson, of the Calumet County Sheriff's Department interviewed Roberta Brice, a Deputy Clerk for Manitowoc County Clerk of Courts Office in the Criminal Unit. The interview was conducted in the Clerk of Courts office. Brice provided the following information:

Brice advised she has been employed with the Clerk of Courts office in Manitowoc County for 21 years.

Brice advised that she knows Lieutenant Jim Lenk, of the Manitowoc County Sheriff's Department. She advised that it was possible Lieutenant Lenk came in to the Clerk of Courts offices by the Deputy Clerks' desks, but no other area. She advised she could not say for sure though, and if he would have come back by them, it would have been to drop off a search warrant or something like that. She advised this would have been several years ago and advised it was probably prior to 2002.

Brice advised she knows Sergeant Andy Colburn, and has never seen him in the Clerk of Courts office area.

Brice advised that she has never been asked by anyone from the sheriff's department about the location of the Steven Avery Sexual Assault file, under Case No: 85-FE-118.
