## ORDER DENYING MOTION TO FILE AMICUS CURIAE BRIEF

On May 25, 2017, James L. Hankins, counsel for Amici Curiae Peter Gill, Jane Goodman-Delanhunty, Suzanna Ryan, Moses S. Schanfield, George Schiro and Brent E.
