A channel-9 reporter (Adriana Iwasinski) has interviewed all of your involved parties in case #14-044803 (or at least, she attempted to). The victim's husband agreed to an interview, but the wife is backing out and making excuses so as not to be able to interview with the reporter. Iwasinski thinks the victim made up the story to explain coming home late and possibly the fact that she may be seeing someone else. The female victim is avoiding the reporter and cries when pushed for an interview. We don't identify sex crime victims. The husband did so. The RP-husband is still pushing the story with the reporter. The reporter is checking the business locations mentioned in the report in search of video surveillance evidence. This is all based on the fact that the RP-husband is calling Ch-9. We have commented on the incident at Ch-9's requests, but we have not allowed them to view the unapproved report because it is not yet in the system. Nearly all stations are now inquiring.

NARRATIVE

On 6/4/14, I was on-duty working out of Springlake Division assigned to unit L232. At 0016 hours, the listed RP (Alan Smith) called 911 requesting to speak with a "superior" officer. RP advised the call taker his wife was pulled over at Memorial and Western, searched and "molested" illegally. RP also requested a "special victim unit" to come talk with his wife, and wanted a supervisor to contact him by phone. Springlake Dispatch notified Lt. Steiner of the call for a supervisor by phone. I reviewed the 911 call and contacted RP by phone at 0037 hours.

I began the conversation with RP by identifying myself as a supervisor and asked him to tell me what had taken place with his wife. RP began by stating his wife (VI-Lydia Smith) had a prescription bottle of pills in her vehicle which she is prescribed. RP claimed that VI was pulled over by an Oklahoma City Police officer and during the traffic stop asked VI to search her vehicle. RP went on to stated VI was "stabbed in her private parts" as a child and had been "molested" by the officer on the traffic stop. RP stated he wanted to file a formal complaint on the officer and press criminal charges. I asked RP for the name of the involved officer and the exact time of the traffic stop so I could check with dispatch.

RP stated VI called him when she was being pulled over at 2322 hours. RP then went on to talk about how he has been in trouble in the past and has had encounters with the police. RP talked about officers calling in their traffic stops and stated I should be able to find a record of the stop. I explained to RP that standard procedure is for an officer to radio in his traffic stops, but I would have to check with dispatch to see if a traffic stop was called in at the specific date, time and location. I then began asking RP for further details on the officers and vehicle to further my investigation of his allegations. RP had to asked VI the questions and relay her answers to me. I could hear in the background VI was upset and was having difficulty providing answers to my questions over the phone.

RP advised me that VI told him the vehicle looked like a "normal" Oklahoma City Police vehicle. The vehicle had red and blue lights. I asked RP about the officers' uniforms. He relayed to me that the officers were wearing either black or blue uniforms. RP stated the officers were white males, standing taller than 5'10", and were between 180 to 220 lbs and 240 to 250 lbs respectively. Since RP stated there were two officers, I asked if VI saw more than one vehicle. RP stated VI only saw one vehicle, and the vehicle had red and blue lights.

As I continued questioning RP about the incident and gathering further detailed information, RP began saying he was not going to let this go and be covered up, and would call the media if needed. I fully explained to RP that if he was making allegations of officer misconduct, I was needing to gather the necessary information to conduct a full investigation of the incident. During this, I asked RP if VI saw or was told the names of the officers. RP stated VI said they "covered up" their name tags. I advised RP that I would look into his allegations by contacting dispatch and would call him back shortly. I asked RP where he lived in the event I chose to meet him and VI in person to gather further information. RP stated he lives at [REDACTED] in Edmond and would be happy to speak with me in person.

After concluding the phone call with RP, I made contact with the dispatch supervisor. I asked the supervisor if there were any traffic stops called in at Western and Memorial, or any locations near this, between 2315 and 2345 hours. The dispatch supervisor advised there were no traffic stops called in and no calls had been entered near this location all day. At this point in the investigation, I elected to go to 82 N. Boulevard to conduct further interviews in person.

On 6/4/14 at 0138 hours, I arrived at [REDACTED] where I initially made contact with RP. I briefly spoke with RP and requested to speak with VI. RP brought VI out and I spoke with her on the front porch. I began talking with VI about the subjects who stopped her on traffic. During this, VI made the comment that the subjects "did not look like" me. VI stated the subjects were wearing black or blue colored uniform and their uniforms did not have anything "shiny" on their uniforms. VI was referring to the "P" buttons and name plate on my uniform. VI further stated the uniforms did not have anything on the shoulders like my uniform had. VI was referring to the epaulets and FTO wraps on my uniform. I asked VI if the subjects had badges and if they were embroidered to their shirts. She stated they had a badge like mine but it was oval in shape as opposed to the shape of a shield.

While talking with VI about the subjects uniforms, VI turned towards my police vehicle. She stated the vehicle looked similar to mine, but was "smaller." I asked VI to come to my police vehicle to examine it and go over the details of the vehicle which pulled her over. VI stated the vehicle did not have any front push bars, but had two bright white LED spotlights. One spotlight was on the driver's side and the other was on the passenger side. I asked VI if the red and blue lights were on the roof of the vehicle on lower behind the front windshield. VI stated they were on top, but had a "gap" between the two lights. I turned on my overhead lights to show VI how they looked turned on. I switch my overheads from having all of the lights engaged to only having the lower front and rear flashers engaged. VI stated the vehicle had rotating red and blue lights which were wider than the front flashers on my police vehicle. At one point during my interview with VI, I showed her the door sticker on my police vehicle and asked if the vehicle which pulled her over had a sticker like mine on it. VI stated the vehicle had a sticker on it, but it was not as big as the one on my vehicle.

I then asked VI to further describe the uniforms the subjects were wearing. She described them to be wearing nylon duty belts with pistol holsters. VI could not say what kind of firearms they were carrying, but did state neither was carrying a radio. VI also stated she never heard a radio during the duration of the traffic stop. VI stated the subjects were wearing black or blue BDU style pants with cargo pockets on the thighs. I showed VI the equipment on my duty belt. She stated the subject did not have a baton or many of the other items I was carrying.

I continued my interview with VI and asked her to describe to me the events surrounding the actual traffic stop itself. VI stated she was traveling eastbound on Memorial Road approaching Western. VI stated she saw a vehicle behind her had engaged red and blue lights. VI turned north on Western, drove under the turnpike, past the On-Cue and pulled over in the parking lot of the old service station on the Northeast corner of westbound Memorial and Western. After pulling over, VI said she was approached by one of the subjects where he asked her for her driver's license and insurance. The subjects returned to their vehicle and came back to her vehicle in approximately two minutes. VI stated she has been pulled over by the police before, and it took the officer longer than this to return to her vehicle.


After returning to the vehicle, VI was asked for permission to search the vehicle. VI consented and the subjects searched her vehicle for approximately two minutes. Again, VI indicated this seemed like a short period of time for a search of her vehicle. While the subjects searched her vehicle, VI was asked to get out of her vehicle and sit on the curb in front of her vehicle. After the search of her vehicle, VI said the subjects had her lay on the hood of their car, where they searched her and both "coped a feel." I asked VI to be more specific about what she meant. VI stated they "touched everything they weren't supposed to."

I asked VI to describe the subjects to me as best as she could. VI stated they were both white males, between 30 and 40 years of age. VI said one had a short, military style haircut similar to mine and the other had a "buzz cut" which was a little longer. VI described one as being 6'0" and weighing 200 lbs. VI described the other as being 5'10", between 250 and 260 lbs. VI stated neither subject had tattoos or visible scars, and spoke "professionally" to her. I asked VI if she saw any markings on the vehicle which pulled her over. VI stated the subjects kept shining flashlights in her face and made every effort to prevent her from going past the front of their car.

During the interview with VI, I asked her, after having seen a uniformed Oklahoma City Police Officer and a marked Oklahoma City Police vehicle, if she felt the subjects who stopped her were Oklahoma City Police Officers. VI stated she did not think they were Oklahoma City Police officers. Based upon the VI's descriptions of the uniforms, equipment worn by the subjects and the vehicle, I concluded that VI was not pulled over by an Oklahoma City Police Officer during this incident. During this conversation with VI, RP stated he no longer felt VI was pulled over by an officer, but did not want to "discount the possibility" she could have been. RP further stated he has already contacted the media in reference to this between our prior phone conversation and my arrival at the residence.

I told RP and VI I would need to step away and make a phone call in reference to this incident. I returned to my vehicle and made contact with the Watch Commander, Capt. Tarver. I advised Capt. Tarver of the nature of the initial call and what information I had gathered from the interviews with RP and VI. Capt. Tarver advised me to forward a copy of this report to Capt. Nelson in the P.I.O. office in the event media inquiries are made, and requested I gather further details on what the subjects did to VI when they searched her.

I made contact with VI again, and asked her to be as detailed as possible what the subjects did to her to "molest" her. VI stated the subjects placed her upper body on the hood of their vehicle and told her to put her hands on the hood. After this, one of the subjects came up behind VI and placed his body against her's from behind. The subject then started "searching" her shoulders, went down her arms, across her breasts and down to her "crotch." VI stated the subject grabbed and squeezed her "crotch" and "butt." VI

further stated both subjects "searched" her in the same fashion. I asked VI if she was touched on top of her clothing or underneath her clothing. She stated it was on top of her clothing. I provided RP with my name and this case number, and advised him I would check the area where the incident took place to locate any businesses with cameras which might have captured any video of the involved vehicle.

At 0302 hours, I went to the On-Cue located at Memorial and Western, where I made contact with the employees on duty. Both employees stated they could not access the video system at this time. I was to the exterior cameras might show the lane closest to the east curb of Western, but not all of Western. I learned from one of the employees the video is saved on the system for approximately one month. I then left the On-Cue and drove the route VI had described. I noticed that the Sam's Club located at 1900 W. Memorial has cameras on the north end of the building with cameras pointing towards Memorial Road. No other business or buildings with obvious cameras were located. A significant incident report of this incident was created and posted.

SU VEH INFO:    FORD, CROWN VIC, 4DR, BLACK AND WHITE, TWO LED SPOTLIGHTS/RED  
 AND BLUE LIGHTS

BODY OF REPORT:

ON 6/4/14, I WAS ON-DUTY WORKING OUT OF SPRINGLAKE DIVISION ASSIGNED TO UNIT L232. AT 0016 HOURS, THE LISTED RP (ALAN SMITH) CALLED 911 REQUESTING TO SPEAK WITH A "SUPERIOR" OFFICER. RP ADVISED THE CALL TAKER HIS WIFE WAS PULLED OVER AT MEMORIAL AND WESTERN, SEARCHED AND "MOLESTED" ILLEGALLY. RP ALSO REQUESTED A "SPECIAL VICTIM UNIT" TO COME TALK WITH HIS WIFE AND WANTED A SUPERVISOR TO CONTACT HIM BY PHONE.

SPRINGLAKE DISPATCH NOTIFIED LT. STEINER, #1132 OF THE CALL FOR A SUPERVISOR BY PHONE. I REVIEWED THE 911 CALL AND CONTACTED RP BY PHONE AT 0037 HOURS.

I BEGAN THE CONVERSATION WITH RP BY IDENTIFYING MYSELF AS A SUPERVISOR AND ASKED HIM TO TELL ME WHAT HAD TAKEN PLACE WITH HIS WIFE. RP BEGAN BY STATING HIS WIFE (VI-LYDIA SMITH) HAD A PRESCRIPTION BOTTLE OF PILLS IN HER VEHICLE WHICH SHE IS PRESCRIBED. RP CLAIMED THAT VI WAS PULLED OVER BY AN OKLAHOMA CITY POLICE OFFICER AND DURING THE TRAFFIC STOP ASKED VI TO SEARCH HER VEHICLE. RP WENT ON TO STATED VI WAS "STABBED IN HER PRIVATE PARTS" AS A CHILD AND HAD BEEN "MOLESTED" BY THE OFFICER ON THE TRAFFIC STOP. RP STATED HE WANTED TO FILE A FORMAL COMPLAINT ON THE OFFICER AND PRESS CRIMINAL CHARGES. I ASKED RP FOR THE NAME OF THE INVOLVED OFFICER AND THE EXACT TIME OF THE TRAFFIC STOP SO I COULD CHECK WITH DISPATCH.

RP STATED VI CALLED HIM WHEN SHE WAS BEING PULLED OVER AT 2322 HOURS. RP THEN WENT ON TO TALK ABOUT HOW HE HAS BEEN IN TROUBLE IN THE PAST AND HAS HAD ENCOUNTERS WITH THE POLICE. RP TALKED ABOUT OFFICERS CALLING IN THEIR TRAFFIC STOPS AND STATED I SHOULD BE ABLE TO FIND A RECORD OF THE STOP. I EXPLAINED TO RP THAT STANDARD PROCEDURE IS FOR AN OFFICER TO RADIO IN HIS TRAFFIC STOPS, BUT I WOULD HAVE TO CHECK WITH DISPATCH TO SEE IF A TRAFFIC STOP WAS CALLED IN AT THE SPECIFIC DATE, TIME AND LOCATION. I THEN BEGAN ASKING RP FOR FURTHER DETAILS ON THE OFFICERS AND VEHICLE TO FURTHER MY INVESTIGATION OF HIS ALLEGATIONS. RP HAD TO ASKED VI THE QUESTIONS AND RELAY HER ANSWERS TO ME. I COULD HEAR IN THE BACKGROUND VI WAS UPSET AND WAS HAVING DIFFICULTY PROVIDING ANSWERS TO MY QUESTIONS OVER THE PHONE.

RP ADVISED ME THAT VI TOLD HIM THE VEHICLE LOOKED LIKE A "NORMAL" OKLAHOMA CITY POLICE VEHICLE. THE VEHICLE HAD RED AND BLUE LIGHTS. I ASKED RP ABOUT THE OFFICERS' UNIFORMS. HE RELAYED TO ME THAT THE OFFICERS WERE WEARING EITHER BLACK OR BLUE UNIFORMS. RP STATED THE OFFICERS WERE WHITE MALES, STANDING TALLER THAN 5'10", AND WERE BETWEEN 180 TO 220 LBS AND 240 TO 250 LBS RESPECTIVELY. SINCE RP STATED THERE WERE TWO OFFICERS, I ASKED IF VI SAW MORE THAN ONE VEHICLE. RP STATED VI ONLY SAW ONE VEHICLE, AND THE VEHICLE HAD RED AND BLUE LIGHTS.

AS I CONTINUED QUESTIONING RP ABOUT THE INCIDENT AND GATHERING FURTHER DETAILED INFORMATION, RP BEGAN SAYING HE WAS NOT GOING TO LET THIS GO AND BE COVERED UP, AND WOULD CALL THE MEDIA IF NEEDED. I FULLY EXPLAINED TO RP THAT IF HE WAS MAKING ALLEGATIONS OF OFFICER MISCONDUCT, I WAS NEEDING TO GATHER THE NECESSARY INFORMATION TO CONDUCT A FULL INVESTIGATION OF THE INCIDENT.

DURING THIS, I ASKED RP IF VI SAW OR WAS TOLD THE NAMES OF THE OFFICERS. RP STATED VI SAID THEY "COVERED UP" THEIR NAME TAGS. I ADVISED RP THAT I WOULD LOOK INTO HIS ALLEGATIONS BY CONTACTING DISPATCH AND WOULD CALL HIM BACK SHORTLY. I ASKED RP WHERE HE LIVED IN THE EVENT I CHOSE TO MEET HIM AND VI IN PERSON TO GATHER FURTHER INFORMATION. RP STATED HE LIVED AT 823 N. BOULEVARD IN EDMOND AND WOULD BE HAPPY TO SPEAK WITH ME IN PERSON.

AFTER CONCLUDING THE PHONE CALL WITH RP, I MADE CONTACT WITH THE DISPATCH SUPERVISOR. I ASKED THE SUPERVISOR IF THERE WERE ANY TRAFFIC STOPS CALLED IN AT WESTERN AND MEMORIAL, OR ANY LOCATIONS NEAR THIS, BETWEEN 2315 AND 2345 HOURS. THE DISPATCH SUPERVISOR ADVISED THERE WERE NO TRAFFIC STOPS CALLED IN AND NO CALLS HAD BEEN ENTERED NEAR THIS LOCATION ALL DAY.

AT THIS POINT IN THE INVESTIGATION, I ELECTED TO GO TO [REDACTED] TO CONDUCT FURTHER INTERVIEWS IN PERSON.

ON 6/4/14 AT 0138 HOURS, I ARRIVED AT [REDACTED] WHERE I INITIALLY MADE CONTACT WITH RP. I BRIEFLY SPOKE WITH RP AND REQUESTED TO SPEAK WITH VI. RP BROUGHT VI OUT AND I SPOKE WITH HER ON THE FRONT PORCH. I BEGAN TALKING WITH VI ABOUT THE SUBJECTS WHO STOPPED HER ON TRAFFIC. DURING THIS, VI MADE THE COMMENT THAT THE SUBJECTS "DID NOT LOOK LIKE" ME. VI STATED THE SUBJECTS WERE WEARING BLACK OR BLUE COLORED UNIFORMS AND THEIR UNIFORMS DID NOT HAVE ANYTHING "SHINY" ON THEIR UNIFORMS. VI WAS REFERRING TO THE "P" BUTTONS AND NAME PLATE ON MY UNIFORM. VI FURTHER STATED THE UNIFORMS DID NOT HAVE ANYTHING ON THE SHOULDERS LIKE MY UNIFORM HAD. VI WAS REFERRING TO THE EPAULETS AND FTO WRAPS ON MY UNIFORM. I ASKED VI IF THE SUBJECTS HAD BADGES AND IF THEY WERE EMBROIDERED TO THEIR SHIRTS. SHE STATED THEY HAD A BADGE LIKE MINE BUT IT WAS OVAL IN SHAPE AS OPPOSED TO THE SHAPE OF A SHIELD.

WHILE TALKING WITH VI ABOUT THE SUBJECTS UNIFORMS, VI TURNED TOWARD MY POLICE VEHICLE. SHE STATED THE VEHICLE LOOKED SIMILAR TO MINE, BUT WAS "SMALLER." I ASKED VI TO COME TO MY POLICE VEHICLE TO EXAMINE IT AND GO OVER THE DETAILS OF THE VEHICLE WHICH PULLED HER OVER. VI STATED THE VEHICLE DID NOT HAVE ANY FRONT PUSH BARS, BUT HAD TWO BRIGHT WHITE LED SPOTLIGHTS. ONE SPOTLIGHT WAS ON THE DRIVER'S SIDE AND THE OTHER WAS ON THE PASSENGER SIDE. I ASKED VI IF THE RED AND BLUE LIGHTS WERE ON THE ROOF OF THE VEHICLE ON LOWER BEHIND THE FRONT WINDSHIELD. VI STATED THEY WERE ON TOP, BUT HAD A "GAP" BETWEEN THE TWO LIGHTS.

I TURNED ON MY OVERHEAD LIGHTS TO SHOW VI HOW THEY LOOKED TURNED ON. I SWITCH MY OVERHEADS FROM HAVING ALL OF THE LIGHTS ENGAGED TO ONLY HAVING THE LOWER FRONT AND REAR FLASHERS ENGAGED. VI STATED THE VEHICLE HAD ROTATING RED AND BLUE LIGHTS, WHICH WERE WIDER THAN THE FRONT FLASHERS ON MY POLICE VEHICLE.

AT ONE POINT DURING MY INTERVIEW WITH VI, I SHOWED HER THE DOOR STICKER ON MY POLICE VEHICLE AND ASKED IF THE VEHICLE WHICH PULLED HER OVER HAD A STICKER

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LIKE MINE ON IT. VI STATED THE VEHICLE HAD A STICKER ON IT, BUT IT WAS NOT AS BIG AS THE ONE ON MY VEHICLE.

I THEN ASKED VI TO FURTHER DESCRIBE THE UNIFORMS THE SUBJECTS WERE WEARING. SHE DESCRIBED THEM TO BE WEARING NYLON DUTY BELTS WITH PISTOL HOLSTERS. VI COULD NOT SAY WHAT KIND OF FIREARMS THEY WERE CARRYING, BUT DID STATE NEITHER WAS CARRYING A RADIO. VI ALSO STATED SHE NEVER HEARD A RADIO DURING THE DURATION OF THE TRAFFIC STOP. VI STATED THE SUBJECTS WERE WEARING BLACK OR BLUE BDU STYLE PANTS WITH CARGO POCKETS ON THE THIGHS. I SHOWED VI THE EQUIPMENT ON MY DUTY BELT. SHE STATED THE SUBJECT DID NOT HAVE A BATON OR MANY OF THE OTHER ITEMS I WAS CARRYING.

I CONTINUED MY INTERVIEW WITH VI AND ASKED HER TO DESCRIBE TO ME THE EVENTS SURROUNDING THE ACTUAL TRAFFIC STOP ITSELF. VI STATED SHE WAS TRAVELING EASTBOUND ON MEMORIAL ROAD APPROACHING WESTERN. VI STATED SHE SAW A VEHICLE BEHIND HER HAD ENGAGED RED AND BLUE LIGHTS. VI TURNED NORTH ON WESTERN, DROVE UNDER THE TURNPIKE, PAST THE ON-CUE AND PULLED OVER IN THE PARKING LOT OF THE OLD SERVICE STATION ON THE NORTHEAST CORNER OF WESTBOUND MEMORIAL AND WESTERN. AFTER PULLING OVER, VI SAID SHE WAS APPROACHED BY ONE OF THE SUBJECTS, WHERE HE ASKED HER FOR HER DRIVER'S LICENSE AND INSURANCE.

THE SUBJECTS RETURNED TO THEIR VEHICLE AND CAME BACK TO HER VEHICLE IN APPROXIMATELY TWO MINUTES. VI STATED SHE HAS BEEN PULLED OVER BY THE POLICE BEFORE AND IT TOOK THE OFFICER LONGER THAN THIS TO RETURN TO HER VEHICLE.

AFTER RETURNING TO THE VEHICLE, VI WAS ASKED FOR PERMISSION TO SEARCH THE VEHICLE. VI CONSENTED AND THE SUBJECTS SEARCHED HER VEHICLE FOR APPROXIMATELY TWO MINUTES. AGAIN, VI INDICATED THIS SEEMED LIKE A SHORT PERIOD OF TIME FOR A SEARCH OF HER VEHICLE.

WHILE THE SUBJECTS SEARCHED HER VEHICLE, VI WAS ASKED TO GET OUT OF HER VEHICLE AND SIT ON THE CURB IN FRONT OF HER VEHICLE. AFTER THE SEARCH OF HER VEHICLE, VI SAID THE SUBJECTS HAD HER LAY ON THE HOOD OF THEIR CAR, WHERE THEY SEARCHED HER AND BOTH "COPE A FEEL." I ASKED VI TO BE MORE SPECIFIC ABOUT WHAT SHE MEANT. VI STATED THEY "TOUCHED EVERYTHING THEY WEREN'T SUPPOSED TO."

I ASKED VI TO DESCRIBE THE SUBJECTS TO ME AS BEST AS SHE COULD. VI STATED THEY WERE BOTH WHITE MALES, BETWEEN 30 AND 40 YEARS OF AGE. VI SAID ONE HAD A SHORT, MILITARY STYLE HAIRCUT SIMILAR TO MINE AND THE OTHER HAD A "BUZZ CUT", WHICH WAS A LITTLE LONGER. VI DESCRIBED ONE AS BEING 6'0" AND WEIGHING 200 LBS. VI DESCRIBED THE OTHER AS BEING 5'10", BETWEEN 250 AND 260 LBS. VI STATED NEITHER SUBJECT HAD TATTOOS OR VISIBLE SCARS, AND SPOKE "PROFESSIONALLY" TO HER.

I ASKED VI IF SHE SAW ANY MARKINGS ON THE VEHICLE WHICH PULLED HER OVER. VI STATED THE SUBJECTS KEPT SHINING FLASHLIGHTS IN HER FACE AND MADE EVERY EFFORT TO PREVENT HER FROM GOING PAST THE FRONT OF THEIR CAR.

DURING THE INTERVIEW WITH VI, I ASKED HER, AFTER HAVING SEEN A UNIFORMED OKLAHOMA CITY POLICE OFFICER AND A MARKED OKLAHOMA CITY POLICE VEHICLE, IF SHE FELT THE SUBJECTS WHO STOPPED HER WERE OKLAHOMA CITY POLICE OFFICERS. VI STATED SHE DID NOT THINK THEY WERE OKLAHOMA CITY POLICE OFFICERS.

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BASED UPON THE VI'S DESCRIPTIONS OF THE UNIFORMS, EQUIPMENT WORN BY THE SUBJECTS AND THE VEHICLE, I CONCLUDED THAT VI WAS NOT PULLED OVER BY AN OKLAHOMA CITY POLICE OFFICER DURING THIS INCIDENT.

DURING THIS CONVERSATION WITH VI, RP STATED HE NO LONGER FELT VI WAS PULLED OVER BY AN OFFICER, BUT DID NOT WANT TO "DISCOUNT THE POSSIBILITY" SHE COULD HAVE BEEN. RP FURTHER STATED HE HAS ALREADY CONTACTED THE MEDIA IN REFERENCE TO THIS BETWEEN OUR PRIOR PHONE CONVERSATION AND MY ARRIVAL AT THE RESIDENCE.

I TOLD RP AND VI I WOULD NEED TO STEP AWAY AND MAKE A PHONE CALL IN REFERENCE TO THIS INCIDENT. I RETURNED TO MY VEHICLE AND MADE CONTACT WITH THE WATCH COMMANDER, CAPT. TARVER. I ADVISED CAPT. TARVER OF THE NATURE OF THE INITIAL CALL AND WHAT INFORMATION I HAD GATHERED FROM THE INTERVIEWS WITH RP AND VI. CAPT. TARVER ADVISED ME TO FORWARD A COPY OF THIS REPORT TO CAPT. NELSON IN THE P.I.O. OFFICE IN THE EVENT MEDIA INQUIRIES ARE MADE, AND REQUESTED I GATHER FURTHER DETAILS ON WHAT THE SUBJECTS DID TO VI WHEN THEY SEARCHED HER.

I MADE CONTACT WITH VI AGAIN, AND ASKED HER TO BE AS DETAILED AS POSSIBLE WHAT THE SUBJECTS DID TO HER TO "MOLEST" HER, VI STATED THE SUBJECTS PLACED HER UPPER BODY ON THE HOOD OF THEIR VEHICLE AND TOLD HER TO PUT HER HANDS ON THE HOOD. AFTER THIS, ONE OF THE SUBJECTS CAME UP BEHIND VI AND PLACED HIS BODY AGAINST HER'S FROM BEHIND. THE SUBJECT THEN STARTED "SEARCHING" HER SHOULDERS, WENT DOWN HER ARMS, ACROSS HER BREASTS AND DOWN TO HER "CROTCH." VI STATED THE SUBJECT GRABBED AND SQUEEZED HER "CROTCH" AND "BUTT."

VI FURTHER STATED BOTH SUBJECTS "SEARCHED" HER IN THE SAME FASHION. I ASKED VI IF SHE WAS TOUCHED ON TOP OF HER CLOTHING OR UNDERNEATH HER CLOTHING. SHE STATED IT WAS ON TOP OF HER CLOTHING.

I PROVIDED RP WITH MY NAME AND THIS CASE NUMBER, AND ADVISED HIM I WOULD CHECK THE AREA WHERE THE INCIDENT TOOK PLACE TO LOCATE ANY BUSINESSES WITH CAMERAS WHICH MIGHT HAVE CAPTURED ANY VIDEO OF THE INVOLVED VEHICLE.

AT 0302 HOURS, I WENT TO THE ON-CUE LOCATED AT MEMORIAL AND WESTERN, WHERE I MADE CONTACT WITH THE EMPLOYEES ON DUTY. BOTH EMPLOYEES STATED THEY COULD NOT ACCESS THE VIDEO SYSTEM AT THIS TIME. I WAS TOLD THE EXTERIOR CAMERAS MIGHT SHOW THE LANE CLOSEST TO THE EAST CURB OF WESTERN, BUT NOT ALL OF WESTERN. I LEARNED FROM ONE OF THE EMPLOYEES THE VIDEO IS SAVED ON THE SYSTEM FOR APPROXIMATELY ONE MONTH.

I THEN LEFT THE ON-CUE AND DROVE THE ROUTE VI HAD DESCRIBED. I NOTICED THAT THE SAM'S CLUB LOCATED AT 1900 W. MEMORIAL HAS CAMERAS ON THE NORTH END OF THE BUILDING WITH CAMERAS POINTING TOWARD MEMORIAL ROAD. NO OTHER BUSINESS OR BUILDINGS WITH OBVIOUS CAMERAS WERE LOCATED.

A SIGNIFICANT INCIDENT REPORT OF THIS INCIDENT WAS CREATED AND POSTED.
