1 THE COURT: Ms. Bowen, that is all the
2 questions we're going to ask you, ma'am. You can push
3 that microphone away from you so you can get down. You
4 may step down from the witness chair and you are free to
5 leave.

6 THE WITNESS: Thank you.

7 THE COURT: Counsel, we'll be in recess until
8 3:30 p.m.

9 (Whereupon, a brief recess was had; after which the
10 following further proceedings resumed:)

11 THE COURT: State may call its next witness.

12 MR. GIEGER: Thank you. The State calls Janne
13 Ligons.

14 THE COURT: Ma'am, would you step over here by
15 the bench just a moment. Right here is fine.

16 (Witness sworn.)

17 THE COURT: All right. Have a seat there in
18 the witness chair, ma'am. Ma'am, if you'll just make
19 yourself comfortable where you can face out toward the
20 lectern out there in the middle of the room where you can
21 talk right at the microphone.

22 THE WITNESS: All right.

23 THE COURT: Would you please state your name?

24 THE WITNESS: Janne Ligons.

25 THE COURT: Thank you, ma'am.

1 Mr. Gieger, you may inquire.

2 JANNE LIGONS,

3 was called as a witness, after having been first duly
4 sworn, and testified as follows:

5 DIRECT EXAMINATION

6 BY MR. GIEGER:

7 Q Ms. Ligons, if I can, ma'am, I'd like to turn your
8 attention back to the early morning hours of June 18 of
9 2014. Do you remember that day?

10 A I do.

11 Q Something unusual happen to you that day, ma'am?

12 A It did, sir.

13 Q Okay. If you can I want to turn your attention back
14 to that evening. Can you tell the Judge a little bit
15 about what you did the evening. So I'm talking about as
16 it got dark on 17th of June and then as it -- on past
17 midnight and into the next day. What were you doing
18 during that time?

19 A I was at a friend's house playing cards and
20 dominoes. That's where I usually go to relax. I work at
21 a day care facility and I have grandkids and I stay with
22 my daughter. So I have to be there with them. I sit
23 there until it's almost time for them to go to bed, they
24 can sleep and then I'll go back, sometimes not all the
25 time.

1 Q I don't want -- I don't want to know your address,
2 ma'am, but you said you live with your daughter.

3 A I did.

4 Q What part of town -- what part of town was that back
5 -- that you were living back then?

6 A Northwest.

7 Q Northwest?

8 A Uh-huh.

9 Q The friend's house that you went to play dominoes
10 and relax with, what part of town are they in?

11 A East side.

12 Q East side.

13 A Uh-huh.

14 Q Can you tell me generally the -- don't give me the
15 exact address, but like the streets that it's on.

16 A 46th and Terry.

17 Q 46th and Terry, on the northeast side of Oklahoma
18 City?

19 A Yes, sir. Yes, sir.

20 Q About what time did you arrive there on the 17th or
21 was it after midnight, so it was the 18th that you got
22 there?

23 A The 17th.

24 Q Some time during the evening of the 17th?

25 A Uh-huh. Maybe around 7:00-ish or 8:00. Some --

1 Q All right. And you've already told me a little bit
2 about what you did. Did you do anything else than just
3 spend the evening with them playing dominoes and doing --

4 A Just with them.

5 Q Okay. Did you have dinner?

6 A No. Watch television and basically --

7 Q Okay. Did you drink?

8 A No, sir. Kool-Aid, had Kool-Aid.

9 Q Had some Kool-Aid. Did you smoke any marijuana?

10 A Well, actually I don't want to lie I don't smoke
11 marijuana, but my friend had a joint and I just like hit
12 it once and that was it. I really don't smoke it, yeah.

13 Q You took some?

14 A I did.

15 Q Were you high or intoxicated?

16 A Oh, no, sir, never.

17 Q Okay. At some point as you stayed there with your
18 friends, did the evening come to a close and did you
19 decide to leave?

20 A Right. I decided to leave because it was getting
21 late and my fiance works at Chesapeake and I know I had
22 to take him to work in the wee hours of the morning, so
23 it was getting late and I had to leave.

24 Q Do you know what time back then he had to report to
25 work at Chesapeake?

1 A He had to be to work, I take him like about -- we
2 leave about 4:00-ish in the morning because he have to be
3 there at 5:00 and I was across town and I had to get
4 there, so I had to leave.

5 Q Okay. About what time of night or early morning is
6 it that you decided to leave your friend's house?

7 A About -- it was about 2:00, a little after 2:00.
8 Between 2:05 and 2:07. In between that time, a little
9 bit after 2:00.

10 Q Okay. Early morning hours around 2:00?

11 A Yes, sir.

12 Q Okay. When you left your friend's house do you
13 remember the direction you went or the path you traveled?

14 A I sure do. I left there --

15 Q Can you tell me where you went?

16 A I left there and I went to 46th and Terry, then I
17 turned on 46th and Terry and I went to 48th and Prospect,
18 that's my mom's street. I always go down my mom's
19 street. She stay on 48th. I passed 48th and Prospect
20 and I went all the way down 48th and Prospect to 48th and
21 Everest and I turned there, right there, made that right
22 on 48th and Everest and went down --

23 THE COURT: Could you slow down just a little
24 bit?

25 THE WITNESS: Oh, I'm sorry. I do talk fast.

1 I'm sorry. I talk fast. I went to 48th and Everest and
2 I made that right turn.

3 Q (By Mr. Gieger) Okay. Time out. Time out for just
4 a minute. Okay.

5 A Okay.

6 Q So you left and you said you drove by your mother's
7 house; is that right?

8 A Always, yes, sir.

9 Q Is that because you're -- why do you drive by your
10 mom's house?

11 A My mom is ill and I always check on her house to see
12 if anything is okay.

13 Q So you drove -- you drove there and I understand
14 you're being very detailed with me and I appreciate that.

15 A Uh-huh.

16 Q Eventually, did you make your way to Northeast 50th
17 Street?

18 A I did make my way to Northeast 50th Street, sir.

19 Q Okay. When you got on 50th which way were you
20 going? Where were you?

21 A I was going towards 50th and Kelley right there at
22 the light.

23 Q Were you heading eastbound or westbound?

24 A I was going westbound because I'm going to I-44, but
25 I noticed a car behind --

1 THE COURT: Ma'am, you were going westbound on
2 50th; is that right?

3 THE WITNESS: It was -- I turned right there on
4 50th and Everest, right there I made the left.

5 THE COURT: Okay. Let's try to answer just the
6 question that Mr. Gieger asks and then he'll ask more
7 questions.

8 THE WITNESS: Okay. Okay. I'm sorry.

9 THE COURT: That's okay. Thank you.

10 Q (By Mr. Gieger) Ms. Ligons, I know you're kind of
11 anticipating where -- the events that night, but if you
12 just kind of stay with me and let's just take it step by
13 step. Okay?

14 A Okay. I'm sorry. Okay. Okay, sir.

15 Q So you were westbound on 50th and you're heading
16 back toward the part of town that you were living in back
17 then?

18 A Correct.

19 Q Was it your intention to get on I-44 at Lincoln?

20 A That was my intention to get on I-44, yes, sir.

21 Q Okay. So that's the direction you were going?

22 A Yes, sir.

23 Q At some point as you were on 50th, ma'am, did you
24 notice a police car behind you?

25 A I noticed some lights.

1 Q Tell me about that. What did you notice and what
2 did you do?

3 A I noticed some lights on the left side of me as I
4 was driving because I looked through my side mirror and
5 as it got closer I know it was a black police car with
6 some big, old white letters on it that said police. And
7 it got up a little closer.

8 Q Okay. Was it one of those police car -- do you know
9 what the difference between the new ones and the old ones
10 are?

11 A Of course, yes, sir.

12 Q Okay. Was it a newer one or an older one?

13 A It was a new one.

14 Q Okay. And if I understood you he actually came up
15 right beside you?

16 A Correct.

17 Q On the driver's side or the passenger's side?

18 A The driver's side.

19 Q Okay. What did you do or what happened at that
20 point?

21 A I kept going and then he got behind me as the lights
22 changed on 50th and Kelley he got behind me. And I kept
23 going straight and when the lights -- when I got to the
24 lights on 50th and Lincoln he was behind me and I was
25 going to make the turn, but I kept straight. I was going

1 to -- keep straight down to Western and that's when I
2 passed 50th and Lincoln. That's when he put his lights
3 on and I pulled over.

4 Q All right. So he initiated a traffic stop; is that
5 right?

6 A Right. Correct.

7 Q And you're at the area of Northeast 50th and
8 Lincoln?

9 A Yes, sir.

10 Q Do you remember if you were on the west side of
11 Lincoln or the east side of Lincoln, if you know?

12 A I really don't know. I just --

13 Q You just know it was that intersection?

14 A Yes, sir.

15 Q Okay. I'll ask you, ma'am, do you know if that's in
16 Oklahoma County?

17 A Of course.

18 Q All right. Did you pull over and stop?

19 A I did.

20 Q Okay. And when you pulled over and stopped can you
21 tell me what happened? Did the officer approach you?

22 A He had his lights on. When he got out of his car I
23 opened up my door on the driver's side because my window
24 don't roll down, yes, he did. And he said, he stopped me
25 because I was swerving. And I said, "No, I wasn't

1 swerving." And then that's when he asked what did I have
2 in my cup there, that it was alcohol. I said, "No, sir,
3 it's Kool-Aid." I said --

4 Q Tell me about that cup. Where was there a cup in
5 your car?

6 A It was sitting in the center of my cup holder.

7 Q Okay. And you had a cup there, what was in it?

8 A Kool-Aid.

9 Q Okay. And so he asked you about it. What did you
10 say?

11 A I said -- answered it, I said, "It's Kool-Aid." I
12 said, "You can taste it."

13 Q And what did he do?

14 A Then told me to step out the car.

15 Q Did you do that?

16 A Yes, sir.

17 Q Okay. When you stepped out of the car what happened
18 after that?

19 A I started walking back to his car then he was
20 walking back, but he was walking backwards and then he
21 looked at me and he say what are you nervous for. And
22 I'm like, really, I'm not nervous, which I had -- I had
23 took a PM actually before I left because I had a
24 headache. I had took a PM aspirin, but basically that
25 was it. I told him I wasn't nervous.

1 Q Are you saying you took a PM aspirin?

2 A It's an aspirin. It's an aspirin.

3 Q Okay.

4 A It's for a headache. That's all.

5 Q Like an Advil PM or something like that?

6 A Yeah, it's in my purse now, yes. It's in my purse,
7 yeah.

8 Q Okay. So did he direct you to walk back to his
9 police car?

10 A Yes, sir.

11 Q And that's what you did?

12 A Yes.

13 Q Okay. At some point did he put you in the car?

14 A Yes. After he put my hands on top of his car and he
15 started searching me.

16 Q Tell me about that. How did he search you?

17 A I had my hands on the car and he just started
18 patting me all over and said, do you have anything
19 illegal on you. I said, "No, sir." He said, you better
20 let me know. If you do I'm going to take you to jail. I
21 said, "No, sir. I don't have anything illegal on me."

22 Q Okay. Stop for just a minute. So at this point are
23 you standing up?

24 A I'm standing up.

25 Q Beside the police car?

1 A Uh-huh, with my hands on top of the police car,
2 yeah.

3 Q You did some motioning, ma'am, whenever you were
4 describing that.

5 A Uh-huh.

6 Q And you were patting your legs?

7 A Uh-huh.

8 Q As he searched you while you were standing up
9 outside the car, do you feel as though he touched you
10 inappropriately in any way during that exchange?

11 A At that point in time, no, sir.

12 Q All right. So after he patted you down he asked
13 about illegal substances on you?

14 A Uh-huh, correct.

15 Q And what did you tell him?

16 A I told him I didn't have any on me. He patted me
17 down, didn't find any and he told me to go sit in the
18 back of his police car.

19 Q Did you do that?

20 A Yes, sir. And he shut the door and my --

21 Q So you were all the way inside of it?

22 A Uh-huh.

23 Q All right.

24 THE COURT: Was that a yes or a no?

25 THE WITNESS: Yes.

1 THE COURT: Thank you.

2 Q (By Mr. Gieger) What did he do at that point, if you
3 know?

4 A He went back to my car, like I said, my window don't
5 let down, so my door was left open on the driver's side.
6 He went inside my car like -- apparently, he saw that was
7 Kool-Aid and I guess he went through my purse.

8 Q Could you see him through the glass of the police
9 car?

10 A No, I could not. No, I could not.

11 Q Okay. So you just know that he went back to your
12 car?

13 A Oh, I seen him -- well, no, I take it -- I saw him
14 go to my car.

15 THE COURT: Ma'am. Ma'am. I need to ask
16 another favor. If you will help me out a little bit. If
17 you're talking at the same time Mr. Gieger is talking I
18 can't understand either one of you and this lady who is
19 writing down what we're saying can't possibly write
20 everything down.

21 THE WITNESS: Okay.

22 THE COURT: If you could not talk over each
23 other and wait until he's completely through with his
24 question.

25 THE WITNESS: Okay. Okay. Okay.

1 THE COURT: Because you're kind of doing it to
2 me right now too. See. Let's just talk one at a time
3 just like kindergarten. Okay. Thank you. Mr. Gieger,
4 thank you, sir.

5 MR. GIEGER: Thank you, Judge.

6 Q (By Mr. Gieger) Ms. Ligons, you a little bit
7 nervous?

8 A A little bit.

9 Q Okay. Let's just take our time and get through it.
10 Okay?

11 A Okay.

12 Q All right. I was asking you whether or not you
13 could see what the police officer was doing in your car.
14 Could you see him through the window of the police car or
15 not?

16 A No, sir.

17 Q Okay. You talked about how he was going through
18 your car, how do you know he was doing that?

19 A He went to my car.

20 Q Okay. You just assumed he was looking around inside
21 of it?

22 A Yes, sir.

23 Q Well, after a while did he come back and approach
24 you again?

25 A Yes, sir.

1 Q Okay. Tell me about that. What did he do?

2 A When he came back to the police car he opened up the
3 back door where I was at and he said to me he said, how
4 do I know you don't have anything in your bra, so.

5 Q Now, Ms. Ligons, let me -- I want to be real clear
6 that I understand what you're telling me. Okay. You're
7 still sitting inside the car?

8 A Right.

9 Q But he's opened up the back door --

10 A Right.

11 Q -- is he standing beside you?

12 A He's standing beside the car, yeah, looking in. He
13 said, how do I know you don't have anything in your bra.

14 Q What did you say?

15 A And I started making motions with -- like picking
16 with my bra, I said, "No, sir, I don't have anything in
17 my bra." And he said, I can't tell like that and I'm
18 like, what, you want me to lift up my blouse. And he be
19 like, yes. So I lift up my -- when I lift up my blouse
20 and my bra came up he took his flashlight and shined it
21 on my chest and I put my blouse down really quick.

22 Q Okay. So your decision to go ahead and pull your
23 shirt up, your blouse up.

24 A Uh-huh.

25 Q Had he just asked you one time about your bra and

1 that's -- is your response is I'll just do that or had he
2 asked more than one time or tell me exactly how that
3 happened?

4 A No. He asked one time for me to lift my shirt up
5 and I -- you know, being a police officer that's what I
6 did.

7 Q So he told you to lift your shirt up?

8 A Yes.

9 Q Okay. And when you did that did you say that your
10 bra came up as well?

11 A It basically it kind of -- I just kind of lifted and
12 it came up like that and he shined his light and I put it
13 down.

14 Q Okay. Whenever you lifted your blouse up, ma'am --

15 A Uh-huh.

16 Q -- and when he started shining were your breasts
17 actually exposed or was your bra still covering your
18 breasts?

19 A No. It was exposed to a certain extent, not all the
20 way up, but it was exposed.

21 Q Okay. Could you -- were your nipples exposed?

22 A Yes, they were.

23 Q Okay. And he took a flashlight and shined it on
24 them?

25 A Yes, he did.

1 Q Okay. Did he touch you in any way?

2 A No.

3 Q Okay. And then I think you said you -- after he
4 shined the light and looked then you put your shirt back
5 down?

6 A Correct.

7 Q Okay. At that point what happened?

8 A At that point he said how do I know you have
9 anything in your pants. So I started doing my pockets
10 like this (indicating) and he -- like he can't tell like
11 that. And he wanted me to turn around like he said, turn
12 around to the side and I turned around to the side and he
13 asked me to get out of his car. I got out of his car.
14 And so I started fidgeting with my pants. And he like,
15 he can't tell like that. I said, what, you want me to
16 pull my pants down and he said something like yes.

17 So me not knowing I pulled my pants down and when I
18 pulled them down I pulled them down to my knee and I had
19 on black underwear and I kind of was fidgeting with them
20 and he had his flashlight and was kind of shining it
21 between my legs and I pulled them up really fast and I
22 turned around to get back in --

23 Q Now -- okay. So you've actually stepped out of the
24 car?

25 A Yes, sir, I did.

1 Q Are you standing in that part of the car where the
2 door, just where the door is open, but you're just
3 standing right there?

4 A No, I was outside the car.

5 Q I understand you're standing up. But are you -- is
6 the door still open to the passenger side?

7 A The door is still open.

8 Q Are you right in that area where the door opens or
9 have you stepped away from that area?

10 A I stepped away from the door.

11 Q Okay. As I understood it, you said you pulled your
12 pants down. Did your underwear stay up?

13 A Yes, sir, they did.

14 Q Okay. So your skin, your private parts were not
15 exposed?

16 A No, sir, it wasn't.

17 Q All right. And you pull them down and then he
18 looked with a flashlight again?

19 A He looked the flashlight.

20 Q During this time period that you've told me about
21 either while you were sitting in the car and you pulled
22 your shirt up at his direction or when you got out, did
23 you notice if he was doing anything with -- was he
24 touching you? Was he doing anything with his hands
25 during this time period?

1 A He wasn't touching me, but he was touching himself
2 like, you know, with -- had his hand down there touching
3 himself.

4 Q At what part of this exchange, did you notice that
5 he was touching himself?

6 A When I was -- when I was -- when I got back into the
7 car and that's when I noticed he was touching himself.

8 Q All right. Now, hang on. So you got out, you
9 pulled your pants down at his direction, you pulled them
10 back up and then you got back in the car?

11 A Correct. Yeah. After he -- he made a comment like
12 he said, damn, you got a big ass. Those are the exact
13 words. And I'm like, oh, my God, he's going to kill me.
14 That's what I kept saying to myself.

15 Q And at that point he directed you to get back in the
16 police car?

17 A Uh-huh.

18 THE COURT: Was that a yes or a no, ma'am?

19 THE WITNESS: That's a yes, sir.

20 THE COURT: Thank you.

21 Q (By Mr. Gieger) And is it at this point, Ms. Ligons,
22 that he -- you noticed he started touching himself or
23 is --

24 A It was at that point he started touching himself
25 when I got back into the car, sir.

1 Q Whenever you told me about that a moment ago, ma'am,
2 you did a motion with your hand and you motioned to
3 basically the crotch area or the private area, is that
4 where he was touching?

5 A Correct.

6 Q Where his penis is?

7 A Correct.

8 Q Okay. And then you also told me a moment ago before
9 you got back in the car he said you have a big ass and
10 that caused you to have a reaction. Did that make you
11 afraid?

12 A Oh, most definitely.

13 Q Okay. Why?

14 A Because by him being a police officer and the things
15 he was doing and I'm -- to myself, oh, God, he's not
16 going to risk everything and let me go, what he's doing
17 or what he's saying to me. I say, "He's going to kill
18 me."

19 Q Okay. Ms. Ligons, you're back in the car at this
20 point; is that right?

21 A Correct.

22 Q Okay. Now, are your -- are you all the way in with
23 the door shut or is the door still opened?

24 A The door is still open.

25 Q Are your feet in the car?

1 A My feet is in the car at that point in time.

2 Q Okay. But the door is still open?

3 A The door is still open.

4 Q Okay. What happens next?

5 A He had me to turn my feet to the side and that's

6 what I did. I turned my feet to the side.

7 Q And by that do you mean you put your feet outside of

8 the car?

9 A Outside of the car, sir.

10 Q But you're still sitting on the passenger --

11 A I'm still sitting -- I'm still sitting, but my feet

12 are turned outside.

13 Q And you're in the backseat of the car?

14 A I'm in the backseat, uh-huh.

15 Q Okay. Do you remember which side of the car you're

16 on, the driver's side or the passenger's side?

17 A Passenger's side.

18 Q So backseat passenger's side?

19 A Uh-huh.

20 Q Okay. What happens then, ma'am?

21 A He unzipped his pants and takes his penis out and

22 said, "Come on." Then I quoted -- I was twirling my

23 hands together I was so afraid. I said, "No, sir. Now,

24 you're not supposed to do this. You're not supposed to

25 do this, sir."

1 He said, "Come on."

2 He said, "I don't have all night."

3 He said, "I just got off of work." By this time a
4 silver -- not a silver it was a gold SUV passed by the
5 street and he was like in front of me. He had his hand
6 on top of his car and when the SUV passed by he looked at
7 it -- as far as he -- where it was going. It went
8 through that parking lot where I had pulled -- I had
9 pulled over at. The car went to that parking lot and he
10 was following them as they was going through the parking
11 lot. And as they passed and went all the way around then
12 he turned back around to me.

13 Q Okay. So he watched where that car went?

14 A Yes, sir, he did.

15 Q Did that car go on by and go where it was going?

16 A It went on by through that parking lot.

17 Q Now, ma'am, I want to ask a couple of things about
18 what you just told me. Okay.

19 A Okay.

20 Q As you're sitting in the car he's standing beside
21 you?

22 A Correct.

23 Q Okay. And you said at some point you said he
24 unzipped his fly and pulled his penis out. Did he just
25 unzip it and take it out of the opening of the fly or did

1 he undo the pants and do it some other way or do you
2 know?

3 A I can remember. He didn't undo -- he just unzipped
4 it and took it out. I remember very well.

5 Q Okay. It was exposed?

6 A It was exposed.

7 Q Do you know if it was erect or not?

8 A Excuse me?

9 Q Do you know -- was it hard, do you know?

10 A I would say so, yes.

11 Q Okay. As this car goes by he's now put his hands up
12 on top of the roof of the car?

13 A Uh-huh.

14 Q The police car?

15 A Uh-huh.

16 THE COURT: Was that a yes or a no?

17 THE WITNESS: Oh, yes. Yes, sir.

18 THE COURT: Thank you.

19 Q (By Mr. Gieger) After he watches the car go by, what
20 happens at that point?

21 A He turned back and looked at me and said, "Come on."
22 He said, "I don't have all night." He said, "I just got
23 off of work and I'm tired."

24 Q Let me ask you, Ms. Ligons: Do you have -- do you
25 know what the police officer shifts are in Oklahoma City?

1 Have you ever been told what they are?

2 A No, sir, ever.

3 Q Okay. As you sit here today, do you have any idea
4 of what shifts -- what time officers get off in the
5 middle of the night, things like that?

6 A No, sir.

7 Q Okay. He says come on, just got off, what happens
8 next?

9 A He told me he just got off of work. And I'm sitting
10 there, no, sir, don't make me do this. Don't make me do
11 this. I said, "You're going to shoot me," and so -- and
12 I'm sitting there looking afraid. I try to bend my head
13 down, but I was looking at that gun in his holster and
14 I'm saying to myself when I bend down he's going to shoot
15 me in the head. I was really afraid.

16 So I tried to, but I couldn't. I raised my head
17 back up and I said, sir, please don't make me do this.
18 Don't make me do this. You're going to shoot me. Then
19 he made the comment he said, I'm not going to shoot you,
20 I promise. I said, "You promise." And he kind of made a
21 snicker sound.

22 Q A snuffle sound?

23 A A snicker, like a grin. He kind of grinned.

24 Q Like a laugh?

25 A A laugh.

1 Q Okay. And what happened then, ma'am?

2 A After then, because he said he wasn't going to shoot
3 me, promise. I tried to hold my head back down and touch
4 his penis, which I did a little bit, but I was so afraid.
5 I held my head back up and I said, "Oh, no, sir, I can't
6 do this." He backed away and he let me out the car.

7 Q Were you pleading with him at that point?

8 A Yes, sir. I thought he was going kill me. I just
9 did. I couldn't see myself getting away with that.

10 Q Ms. Ligons, before he backed away I know you said a
11 moment ago you did. Did his penis go in your mouth?

12 A It did a little bit, a little bit, not much, but it
13 went in there.

14 Q Not for very long?

15 A Not for very long because I wouldn't allow it.

16 Q Okay. So you tried to do what he said, but then
17 you --

18 A I tried, I couldn't.

19 Q And you pled with him to stop and he did?

20 A Uh-huh, he did stop.

21 Q What happened at that point, ma'am?

22 A He backs up, I get out the police car and I didn't
23 know what else to say. The only thing that would come to
24 my mind because I thought when I walked away he was going
25 to shoot me in the back. The only thing I could say, was

1 saw two police cars park like side by side like they were
2 talking.

3 We made a U-turn and went back. And I started
4 telling them what happened and they called the captain
5 and the captain came and they took a report and they took
6 me back to the scene where it happened. And they went to
7 I guess surveillance cameras. They got everything from
8 surveillance cameras. They took me to Integris Hospital
9 do a mouth wipe and all that. And --

10 Q They let you see a nurse at the hospital --

11 A Seen a nurse. Yes, sir, I did.

12 Q And they swabbed your mouth; is that right?

13 A They swabbed my mouth.

14 Q Okay. And you told the police officers what had
15 happened?

16 A Exactly.

17 Q All right. Ms. Ligons, do you see the officer in
18 the courtroom that did these things to you?

19 A Most definitely.

20 Q Okay. Can you tell me where he's sitting and what
21 he's wearing, please?

22 A Right there (indicating).

23 Q Okay. What's he wearing?

24 A A black suit with a blue tie sitting right there on
25 the end.

1 Q On the end?

2 A Uh-huh.

3 THE COURT: Is that a yes or a no?

4 THE WITNESS: That's a yes.

5 THE COURT: Okay. I need to be sure exactly
6 what your answer is on this one.

7 THE WITNESS: Okay. I'm sorry.

8 MR. GIEGER: Ask the record reflect
9 identification, Your Honor.

10 THE COURT: Record will reflect that the
11 witness has pointed out Daniel K. Holtzclaw as the person
12 she encountered on June 18, 2014, in the early morning
13 hours.

14 Q (By Mr. Gieger) Ma'am, that night at the hospital
15 you remember talking to a police detective, a female
16 detective?

17 A Yes, sir, I do.

18 Q Do you remember telling her, ma'am, at the hospital
19 that the individual that you -- that did this to you, you
20 remember him having blond hair. Do you remember saying
21 that?

22 A I remember saying that.

23 Q Okay. Are you certain that the person you've
24 identified in the courtroom today is the individual?

25 A That's -- he's the individual.
