- 12 A Yes.
- 13 Q And, ma'am, the street that's right here, I don't know
- 14 if you can see it on there or not, but is that Highland?
- 15 A Yes.
- 16 Q So Highland goes north/south and almost right to where
- 17 | the Relax Inn is.
- 18 A Yes.
- 19 Q Where were you telling the officer that you wanted him
- 20 to let you out?
- 21 A Right there off a 16th and Highland.
- 22 | Q About 16th and Highland?
- 23 A Yes.
- 24 Q All right. So 16th is going to be down actually
- 25 | this -- the last street is 17th, can you see that?

- 1 A Uh-huh. Yes.
- 2 Q And then if he lets you out at 16th and Highland
- 3 | what -- what was your intention? What was your plan?
- 4 A I was gonna walk back towards the room.
- 5 0 Walk back toward the hotel?
- 6 A Uh-huh.
- 7 Q Did he take you that direction in the car? In other
- 8 words, did he take you from 16th and Lottie in the direction

- 15 A Yes.
- 16 Q All right. Ma'am, when you talk about the park and the
- 17 | school, is this the area that you're talking about?
- 18 A Yes.
- 19 O So he turned on 18th Street?
- 20 A Yes.
- 21 | Q And did he drive down toward that park and that school?
- 22 A Yes.
- 23 Q What happened?
- 24 A He jumped the curb and pulled between the buildings.

- 23 Q Back at the 16th and Lottie area?
- 24 A Yes.
- 25 Q Can you tell me -- can you see on there where your

1 recollection is that he parked? 2 Between the buildings. Α 3 Let me -- is that the school? Q Okay. 4 Α Yes. 5 Q Okay. Do you know which buildings he parked between? 6 Α It was probably, like, between them two buildings with 7 the --8 Q. Okay. I'm gonna -- you tell me --9 Α Bushes. 10 Are you talking about these two buildings? Q 11 Yeah, those on the front part. Α 12 Q By where? 13 Α Up in the front by -- like in --14 This way? Q 15 Yeah, right there in that area. Α 16 Somewhere in here? Q 17 Α Yeah. 18 All right. When you pulled in there, ma'am, were there 19 lights or anything from the school? 20 No, it was dark. Α 21 Okay. And did he actually stop there? 22 Yes, and got out the car. 23 And what happened whenever he got out of the car? 24 Opened my door and he let me out. And he asking me do 25 I have anything on me illegal. And I told him no. And he

1 made me show -- show myself to him. 2 Okay. So at this point he's out of the car. 3 (No audible response.) Is that right? 5 Α Yes. 6 Are you still in the car or are you out of the car at 7 this point? 8 I'm out of the car. 9 You're out of the car? 10 (No audible response.) 11 Where are you standing in relation to the car? 12 Like, I'm still standing by the car door with the door 13 open. 14 So are you just outside the back seat? 15 Uh-huh. 16 And where is the officer? 17 Standing right there, like kinda little bit behind me a 18 little bit. 19 Ma'am, had he asked you to get out or did you just get 20 out knowing that he opened the door so you got out? How did 21 that happen if you remember? 22 I just got out because he opened the door. 23 He opened the door. 24 Yeah.

Can you open the door from the inside of the car --

1 police car? No. Huh-uh. 3 So you actually stand up --4 Α Yeah. 5 -- beside the car? And then tell me what happens. 6 7 And he had made a comment and he said I bet that pussy is wet. 9 Okay. You said something a minute ago, ma'am, about 10 him asking you if you had anything on you; do you remember 11 telling me that? 12 Uh-huh. 13 When did that happen? Were you still in the car or 14 were you out of the car when that happened? He axed me if I had anything on me but I had got out 15 the car and that's when I had to show myself to him. 16 17 Okay. And did that happen right after you got out or did something else happen first? 18 19 That was right -- that happened first. That happened first? 20 21 Yeah. 22 Okay. So when you stood up that's part of the 23 conversation about: Do you have anything on you? 24 Uh-huh. All right. And then in response to that what did he do 25

- 1 or what did you do in response to do you have anything on
- 2 you?
- 3 A He made me -- he asked me to show my cleavage and --
- 4 | and my private.
- 5 Q Okay. Tell me about that. Tell me how that happened
- 6 exactly. The jury doesn't understand exactly -- they
- 7 | haven't heard anything about this. So tell us -- tell us
- 8 what happened.
- 9 A He just had me to pull my shirt up and pull my panties
- 10 down so -- so assumed it -- I didn't have nothing on me.
- 11 Q Ma'am, what were you wearing that day?
- 12 A I think it was -- might've been a dress.
- 13 Q Okay.
- 14 A I'm not for sure.
- 15 | Q Like a one-piece thing?
- 16 A Yes.
- 17 Q Okay. You said he had you pull your shirt up. Tell me
- 18 what you -- did he tell you to do that?
- 19 A Yes.
- 20 Q Or did he motion or how did you know that's what he
- 21 | wanted you to do?
- 22 A He told me to do it.
- 23 Q And what did you do?
- 24 A I did it.
- 25 | Q Were you wearing undergarments? Were you wearing a

1 bra? 2 Yes. 3 Okay. Did that stay on? 4 He made me pull everything up. He didn't -- I guess he 5 just wanted to see if I had anything on me. But I don't 6 think -- I didn't have nothing on me, just what he was 7 wanting to do. 8 And I want to ask real specific. I'm not trying to 9 embarrass you but I want to ask real specific. So he had 10 you actually pull up your shirt and pull your bra up. Were 11 your breasts exposed to him? 12 Yes. 13 Was there light there? Could you see? 14 I guess how he had his light or something on them, I'm 15 not for sure. 16 And what light -- do you remember there being any 17 lights? 18 Not when we pulled up I didn't. 19 Okay. Was there lights on the car or in the car? 20 Yeah. 21 The door was open? 22 Α Yes. 23 Does the light come on when the door is open? 24 Yes. 25 So there was that light?

- 1 A (No audible response.)
- 2 Q After you exposed yourself to him, your breasts, how
- 3 long did you hold your shirt up? Was it just a moment or
- 4 did you put it down; tell me about how that went.
- 5 A I just showed him and just clothed myself back up.
- 6 Q Did he say anything?
- 7 A Other than I bet that pussy's wet.
- 8 Q I want to make sure I'm following the sequence. So he
- 9 said that after you pulled your shirt up or before?
- 10 A After.
- 11 O After.
- 12 You also said something about having to either
- 13 pull your dress up to where your privates were exposed or --
- 14 at one time you said your pants. I'm not sure which. Is
- 15 | it -- do you remember?
- 16 A No, I just remember pulling my panties down.
- 17 Q Your panties down?
- 18 A Yeah, because he was tryna make sure if anything was
- 19 stuffed in there or something.
- 20 Q Ms. Lyles, do you remember why you specifically did
- 21 | that? In other words, did he tell you to do that or did you
- 22 just do that on your own?
- 23 A He told me to.
- 24 Q What did he say if you remember?
- 25 A Pull my panties down make sure I didn't have nothing up

1 in me. 2 And when you did -- nothing up in you? 3 Α Huh? He said I want to make sure you have nothing up in you? 5 Is that what he said? 6 Yes. 7 All right. Ma'am, whenever you did that -- well, first of all, did you do that? 9 Α Yes. 10 And so then your pubic and your vaginal area was 11 exposed as well? 12 Yes. 13 Did that last about the same amount of time as your 14 shirt or was it different? 15 Lasted about that time. 16 About the same time? 17 Α Uh-huh. 18 Did he say anything to you after you did that? 19 Other than I bet that pussy's wet, and then he just --20 And that's when -- that's when he said that? 21 Α Yes. 22 And then I interrupted you. You were gonna say 23 something else? That's when he had me bend over. 24 25 Okay. Ma'am, at this point if I understand it you're

- 1 | -- are you still standing outside the car?
- 2 A Yes.
- 3 Q Okay. He said, I'm gonna have you bend over or -- you
- 4 said -- you said he had me bend over. Tell me what happened
- 5 next.
- 6 A He just pulled it out and he just start raping me I
- 7 guess.
- 8 Q Okay. Did you at some point bend over?
- 9 A Uh-huh.
- 10 Q Okay. And tell me where did you bend over or how did
- 11 | you bend over, Ms. Lyles?
- 12 A In the back seat of the car.
- 13 Q Okay. Are your feet still outside the car?
- 14 A Yes.
- 15 Q So basically the door's -- you haven't -- have you ever
- 16 moved away from the door?
- 17 A No.
- 18 Q You're still standing right in the opening if this is
- 19 | the street; right?
- 20 A Yeah.
- 21 Q And so does the top half of your body lean onto the
- 22 | seat?
- 23 A Yes.
- Q Okay. Ma'am, had you -- I think you said: And then he
- 25 | started raping me, something -- is that what you said?

- 1 A Uh-huh.
  2 Q You got to answer -- she has to write it down. So you
  3 have to --
- 4 A Yes.
- 5 Q Say yes or no. Okay. That's why I'm making you do
- 6 that.
- 7 Ma'am, did you see his penis?
- 8 A Yes.
- 9 Q Okay. Did you see it -- when did you see his penis?
- 10 A After the fact -- after he told me to raise up and told
- 11 me to suck his dick.
- 12 Q Okay. Did that happen before or after he had you bend
- 13 over?
- 14 A It was like back and forth so it's kind of confusing.
- 15 Q Okay. So not only did he actually -- to use your
- 16 word -- rape you, but he actually had you suck his dick too?
- 17 A Yes.
- 18 Q Okay. And I want to make sure I understand. Did he do
- 19 | it more than one time?
- 20 A Yes.
- 21 | Q Okay. So it was back and forth?
- 22 A Yes.
- 23 | Q Do you remember whether or not the oral started first
- 24 or the vaginal intercourse started first?
- 25 A I think he -- he had me bend over first.

- 1 Q He had you bend over first?
- 2 A Yeah.
- 3 Q All right. Ma'am, I'm gonna ask another question,
- 4 again, I'm not trying to embarrass you. Whenever he had you
- 5 bend over did you feel his penis go into your vagina?
- 6 A Yes.
- 7 Q Okay. Other than his penis going into your vagina, did
- 8 | you feel anything else back there?
- 9 A Yes. I felt like it might've been his gun or something
- 10 poking my hip.
- 11 Q You felt like his gun was poking your hip?
- 12 A Uh-huh.
- 13 Q Did you see how he removed his penis from his pants?
- 14 A Yeah, he just -- he just unzipped his fly.
- 15 Q Okay. So his gun and stuff stayed on?
- 16 A Uh-huh.
- 17 Q But his penis came out his fly?
- 18 A Yes.
- 19 Q All right. In regards to the sexual intercourse do you
- 20 have any idea how long that lasted?
- 21 A Probably like 20 or 30 minutes.
- 22 Q Seemed like 20 or 30 minutes?
- 23 A Yeah.
- Q Do you know whether or not he ejaculated, Ms. Lyles?
- 25 A I don't think so.

- 1 | Q Why don't you think so?
- 2 A Because I know -- I know the difference of that. It
