I was talking with Susie while she was bartending at the downrigger, I was at work at Harold's when someone stated to Susie they SAW PAM AT MA'S BAR 13 Sept 93 around 1300 being SEXUALLY MOLESTED By Terri Schindler AND Dennis VAN AND AN Individual by the name of DOUG? - Short - Skinny - Blonde HAIR - COATER FACED i.e. Sunkin holes. I was told they were putting ice cubes down her blouse to MAKE her nipples erect. They were fondling her breasts, AND touching other parts. Also they were encouraging her to keep drinking shots of liquor AND MADE sure she was staying

My assessment is PAM MUST HAVE BEEN "TOTALLY BLOWN AWAY" AND NOT CAPABLE OF MAKING ANY KIND OF RATIONAL Decision PERTAINING TO her own well being or she would have left, or she was FORCED to stay against her will. I know PAM well enough - "I have been living with her for NINE MONTHS" to know she would NOT allow ANYONE TO TOUCH HER IN ANY WAY SHAPE OR FORM UNLESS IT WAS MYSELF AT Home in sharing our affection.

RANDY Comes to MA's PLACE during the afternoon, PAM IS TOTALLY WAISTED, I DON'T know HOW SHE KNOWS THIS RANDY, I DON'T know WHO HE IS, OR WHAT HE DOES, OR WHAT HIS PLAN FOR TAKING PAM WAS However what could be the tie between RANDY AND Terri Schlinder AND Dennis VAN getting PAM TOTALLY WAISTED so he could come along AND abduct her for whatever MOTIVE He may have.

My first Assessment is for "RAPE Prostitution", more concisely when An individual is abducted, against their will, restrained, AND A Fee PAID TO the Abductor for sexual use of the victim. I feel very strongly THAT THIS IS WHAT HAS OCCURRED.

I BASE this conclusion on the following.

- I. Some time ago PAM was abducted by All three of the Schlindler Bros. She was held against her will for a period of three days, AND the Schlindler Bros. would collect a fee, then their "Clients" could have sexual access to PAM for X amount of time

## Arrest made in Claflin death

### Authorities say suspect killed Manitowoc woman last Septem

**MANITOWOC** — A 32-year-old Sheboygan County jail inmate was arrested late this morning and is charged with first-degree intentional homicide in connection with the death of Pamela Claflin 11 months ago.

Manitowoc County District Attorney James FitzGerald filed a five-page criminal complaint today against Randall K. Mataya,

who has been in the Sheboygan jail since Aug. 10 on burglary and driving after revocation charges.

Claflin's body was found last Sept. 21 in a brushy area off Evelyn Lane, just west of the Manitowoc city limits. Manitowoc County Sheriff's Department investigators said evidence at the scene and from an autopsy indicated the 35-year-old woman was murdered.

Claflin was last seen on Sept. 13 leaving Ma's Place Tavern,

1134 S. 10th St., between 8:30 and 9 p.m.

A witness told police, Claflin left the tavern that day with a man he identified through a photo lineup as Mataya, according to the criminal complaint.

Mataya said in a Sept. 22 interview with police that he saw Claflin at Ma's Place and that he had never seen her before. She kissed him on two occasions inside the tavern, he said. In the interview he told police he last saw

Claflin as she was walking toward another tavern, but later in the interview said he gave her a ride to the other establishment, the complaint indicates.

A family member told police in an interview earlier this month that around midnight Sept. 13, he saw Mataya toiling over a sink at the family's trailer home in Cleveland, attempting to get what appeared to be blood stains out of a white pair of pants he wore earlier in the day.

Mataya told the you blood was from a fight men on the highway the evening. The witness told police Mataya's were cut.

He also told investigators Mataya appeared intoxicated, nervous, and that he told him not to talk with him. The next day, the man said, he saw Mataya

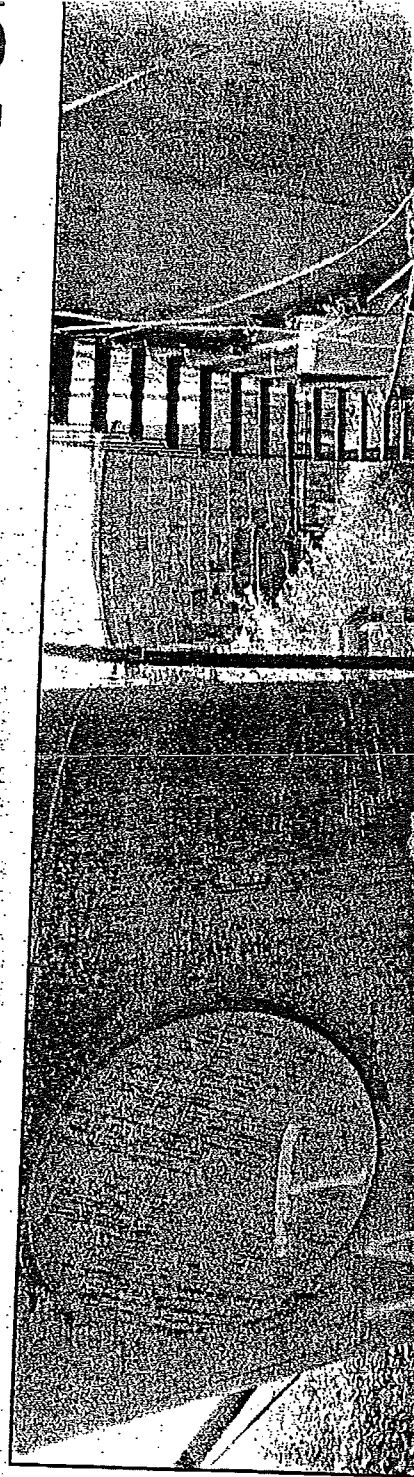

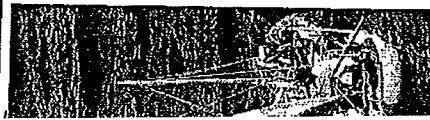

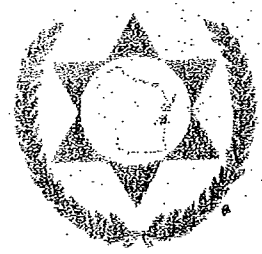

The Manitowoc County Sheriff's Dept. is conducting a homicide investigation jointly with the Manitowoc City Police Dept.

The investigation started when a missing person report was filed with the Manitowoc City Police Dept. on the afternoon of Friday, September 17. The employer of Pamela L. Clafin reported that Pamela had not reported to work since Monday. Detectives of the Manitowoc City Police Dept. worked on the investigation over the weekend, later releasing information to the media on the missing person.

On Friday, Sept. 18, at 11:00 am, the Manitowoc City Police Dept. received a call that blood-stained jeans had been discovered near Evelyn Lane just west of the Manitowoc city limits. City officers checked the area and located the jeans. The Manitowoc County Sheriff's Dept. was then contacted along with the FBI and they are working on the location just outside the city limits. A search was conducted, and the body of Pamela L. Clafin, age 33 of the city of Manitowoc, was discovered.

Officers at the scene believe that a homicide took place. The investigation continues today as a joint effort by the Manitowoc County Sheriff's Dept. and the Manitowoc City Police Dept. with investigators working at the scene and questioning people who were last seen with Pamela.

The body is placed in Milwaukee today at 11:00 am with Coroner Debbie Reister and Sheriff's Dept. detective accompanying the body. Specific details on injuries or cause of death are not available at this time.

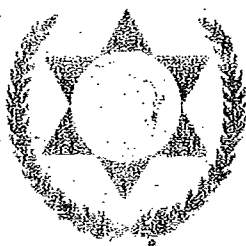

Quasius explained that Claflin does have problems and has been known to go out on a binge but never for this long or without contacting someone. They advised they had checked with friends and found out Claflin had been at the DOWNRIGGER Friday and Saturday(9-10 & 9-11), KONO's on Saturday and Sunday, and MA'S PLACE Fri., Sat., Sun., and Mon.. Quasius said the last time anyone saw her was late Monday afternoon at Ma's Place. Claflin should have been there until approx. 4:30-4:30 PM. Wiegert advised that Claflin's vehicle (87 Horizon DYP 553/Wi) is still parked in the Lakeport Credit Union next to Ma's. Wiegert said that Claflin has all the keys for businesses which they clean and requested we check her vehicle for them. Capt. Hartman and I checked the vehicle and no keys were located. I made contact at Ma's Place and spoke with Paul Havel who was bartending. I asked about CLAFLIN and Loris Buettner (Patron) said some other girls were in asking about her. She said the last they saw CLAFLIN was Monday afternoon around 4:30. Buettner said Evelyn Schindler was bartending that afternoon. Buettner said Claflin was there when she stopped in. Buettner stated she had to leave at 4:40 and Claflin was still there but when she returned at 5:30 pm, Claflin was gone. Buettner said Claflin was wearing a pink t-shirt and blue jeans with white denim shoes. Buettner stated she knows CLAFLIN and figures she's out on a binge on cleaning

somewhere. I later spoke with Evelyn Schindler. She said she was bartending and Claflin was there Mon. afternoon. Evelyn said Claflin told her about an apartment she was going to rent and some young guy she was going out with. Evelyn said she was pretty busy with customers and never paid attention when Claflin left or with who. I asked her if she might be with Terry but Evelyn said Terry was on a roofing job here in the county and would be home later. She stated Claflin was not with him. She will have Terry contact us. I also checked at DOWNRIGGERS where I spoke with Sue Zelinski. Sue said she works at Downriggers (cook) and CLAFLIN was in there last Friday night. Sue stated Claflin had heard Wendy's business was going to go under so she (claflin) was out on a binge. Sue stated it is not unusual for Claflin to be on weekend drunks but Claflin liked her job and was getting her life straight. She thought it was unusual that Claflin would not let someone know where she was. Sue said she heard Claflin was with Terry Schindler all last weekend and on Monday she was also at Ma's with Terry and Dennis Van. She stated Claflin should have been drunk and they took her into the back room where they were putting ice cubes down her shirt. Sue also said she heard Claflin may have stopped at the ANCHOR INN after leaving Ma's. I also contacted Doug Duescher. He stated Claflin moved in with him and his wife about a week or so ago. He stated the last time he saw Pam was Sunday night as she was home that night and then he saw her at Ma's Place Monday afternoon around 4PM. Duescher said he and his wife also work for Wiegert and Floor Care so he stopped by Claflin (Ma's Place) to pick up some cleaning stuff from her car. Duescher said Claflin was on the first bar stool as you enter and Terry Schindler was next and another guy on the 3rd. Duescher thought there were maybe 10 people or so in the bar. He got the car keys from Claflin, took the supplies, returned her keys, and left. He did say Claflin appeared drunk. Duescher stated his wife went into the hospital Tuesday and between work and going to the hospital he is gone quite a bit. He did not think Claflin has been back at the house for any clothes or anything. Duescher advised Claflin had gone to Little Sturgeon for a weekend with a Todd (Wallen) but did not know where else she might be. He said her old boyfriend was James Fleming from Two Rivers but Fleming was in county jail at this time. Duescher will contact us if he hears anything.

I did make contact with several bars in the Little Sturgeon area. I contacted Goetz's and Little Sturgeon Inn but they advised they had not seen Pam since Labor Day weekend when he was up there with Todd Wallen. They advised her dad (Burton Claflin) has a cottage up there. Burton called a short time later and he said he has not seen or heard from his daughter all week. He said that is not like her as she usually calls. Burton advised her can be reached at 824-5289 and should be back at home on Monday. Todd Wallen reported to our department as I had left messages for him. He stated he does know Pam Claflin although he only recently met her. He stated Pam cleaned by them (Santa's Best) and that's where he met her. She invited him up to her parents cottage over Labor Day and he took her up there. Wallen stated that's when he found out about her problem. She told him they would go boating but when they got there they only sat in the bars all day and night. He said she borrowed about \$30 from him and described her as a lush who has big problems with the sauce. Wallen said her parents were real nice but he wasn't interested in Pam after finding out her problem. Wallen said Pam called several times after and the last time he saw her was a week ago Thurs.(9-9). He said Pam called him and told him she couldn't stand it at Duescher's as he's always playing loud wierd music so she went back to her old boyfriend's apartment in Two Rivers (Fleming). She asked Wallen to stop there after work and he stated he did but did not stay long. Wallen stated the lady has REAL problems. He stated she wanted to start a relationship and sleep with him right away. Todd said she called him around 1:30AM Mon. morning and he could tell she was sauced. He told her off and hung up. Todd stated several of Claflin's friends have been calling asking if he's seen her and stuff. He said when he was up in Sturgeon Bay with her, she knew almost everyone. He stated they visited a Randy in the city of Sturgeon Bay and he offered her a job up there in some type of cleaning service. Todd stated he thought she may have taken off from here and moved up there. Todd will call if he hears anything.

the W/F. Groothoff said that it was definitely dark out and that he could not give a better description of the male subject or his vehicle which was parked directly next to the Claflin vehicle. He said that the two people continued to talk and walk back and forth to each of their vehicles. The male made sure that the Claflin vehicle was locked up and then the W/F got into the males auto. Groothoff said that the female appeared to do this hesitantly as if she did not really want to go along with the male subject. Groothoff has never seen this male subject before and after showing a photocopy of Mug # 13288 to Groothoff he said that the female was Claflin. He doesn't know either subject. Groothoff said that they then drove off in the male subjects vehicle. After thinking about it he thought that maybe the date could of been, Monday, 09/13/93 and not Saturday, 09/11/93. Groothoff will think about it further and call should there be anything else that he thinks of. I also motored to 2402 Nelson Lane which is off of South 26th St. just south of the Manitowoc City Limit's. This was Terry Schindler's residence for quite sometime and upon checking could find no activity. At approx. 1145 Hrs. I again tried calling the Van residence and made contact with him. I then motored to his residence and asked him if he knew Pam Claflin. Van said that he did and that the last time he seen her was Monday afternoon and he felt it was still light out. Van said that he went there by himself and happened to see her there with Terry Schindler. He also said that Claflin was considerably drunk and the last he knew is Terry was saying that Claflin was his girlfriend and that he was going to have sex with her that evening. Van left alone and did not have any further contact with Claflin. Van did say that he just ran into Terry Schindler late last evening at Studio Eight Bar and that Schindler did not say anything at all about Claflin or anything about what may of happened on Monday, 09/13/93. It should be noted that while speaking with Van at approx. noon this date, he still seemed considerably intoxicated from last evening and was drinking further upon my contact with him at this time. No further information could be gained from speaking with Van. I also tried calling the Schindler residence again without any luck.



Thorington called and stated that he had observed Claflin in the bar while he was there. He stated that he had observed her leave with a male subject, that he could not identify. This would have been about 2100-2200 Hrs on Monday night. He stated that he had checked with a person and that person stated that she may have gone to The Anchor Inn Bar after leaving Ma's Place. Lt. Thorington stated that Bruce or Terry Schindler may have known the subject Claflin left with.

9/20/93-At 1015 Hrs this morning, I went to Ma's Place where I spoke with Evelyn Schindler regarding this matter. Schindler said that she could not offer anything further other than when she last observed Pamela Claflin, Pamela was dressed very nice and was dressed pretty. She also said that Pam was somewhat intoxicated, however she was walking and Pam gets in this type of shape pretty often. While speaking with Evelyn, she informed me that Scott Nething, Randy's brother, was a patron in the bar and I then spoke with him and he said that he used to go out with Pamela Claflin approximately 10 months to a year ago, however he couldn't add much into this complaint. Scott did say that his brother, Randy, does live at home with his mother at 604 S. 18th Street, and he knows that Randy didn't come home last night. Scott recommended checking with De-tox as he thought Pamela would be admitted into the De-tox unit at HFMMC.

I also spoke with Terry Schindler who just awoke this morning. Upon speaking with him above Ma's Bar, he informed me that he was, in fact, with Dennis Van, Pamela Claflin, along with another male subject having the first name of Randall, at Ma's Place Bar last Monday and that Pamela had left with this Randall. He said that he spent all day yesterday making telephone calls with Brandy Quasius trying to find out who this male subject having the first name of Randall would be. He said that on Monday, the male subject having the first name of Randall showed him some drunken driver papers which he thought was either by the Cleveland Police officers or the Manitowoc County Sheriff's Office, and thought that this Randall would have been stopped for OWI within the last month to month and a half. He also said that Pamela definitely left with this subject named Randall and that it would have been about 8:30 or 9:00 p.m. on Monday evening. He also felt that Randall was getting divorced and has one child with his wife. The only description he could give of this subject was that he was approximately 32 to 33 years of age, about 6'1" tall, having shorter hair with a mustache, no glasses and was thin in physical stature. He also said that the subject was drinking Kessler and Cokes and that Pamela was drinking tap Miller beer. Upon her leaving the bar with this subject, she had left

fifteen to twenty cents (15¢ to 20¢) in change on top the bar with a full glass of beer and according to Terry and Evelyn, this was very strange for her to do. I asked Terry where he was going to be later in case I needed to speak with him further, and he said I could contact him at the bar.

I then went to MTSO and made contact with Dep. Inspector Rick Tisler. Tisler did some checking and found out that Randall K. Mataya was picked up for OWI by MTSO Dep. Jacobs on 8/13/93, while in the Cleveland area. For this information refer to attached MTSO copy of the OWI CAse #S93-06176. Also supplied to me by Rick Aukamp was an MTSO mug of Randall K. Mataya. I ran a 10-27 D.L. check and the physical features outlined by DOT is that he is a white/male 6'2" tall, 200 lbs, brown hair and brown eyes. He has a revoked driver's license.

I then returned to Ma's Bar and had shown Terry Schindler the picture of Mataya and both Terry Schindler, Jody Schindler, and Dennis Van who were patrons in the bar, positively identified Mataya as being the one who left with Pamela Claflin on Monday evening, 9/13/93, at approximately 2100 hours. Information gained is that Mataya was living in the trailer courts in Cleveland at 204 Beachwood and I contacted Chief Deputy Gene Kusche from MTSO where we motored to the trailer courts together along with Det. J. Borman.

At 1250 Hrs. this afternoon we made personal contact with Randall Mataya's wife, Judy, at her residence. Judy said that Randall left for Appleton looking for auto parts at approximately 10:00 a.m. this morning and he hasn't been back and she doesn't know when he will be back. I informed her that we would like to speak with him reference a gal that hasn't been seen in the city of Manitowoc for approximately a week and she said that he hasn't been in Manitowoc for over at least the last one week period. I then showed her the photograph which MTSO supplied to me of her husband which she said that this was her husband and I had written down the telephone number for my office and the Detective Division to have her husband contact us as soon as he reports back home. We then left the Mataya residence. To this time, no family member or friend has received word from Pamela Claflin and Capt. [Name] has been in contact with Claflin's father. We also did contact HFMMC De-tox unit and [Name] has not been there in the last one week period.

At approximately 1414 Hrs this afternoon, Terry Schindler again called and wanted to know if we found out anything else upon speaking with the male subject named Randall and he was informed that nothing further has been heard and as soon as something is heard, we would be in contact with him or if we need to speak with him further, we would, and he said that we can feel free to contact him at Ma's Place Bar.

9/17/93-I made contact with James L. Fleming at the MTSO County Jail. Fleming advised Pam Claflin had lived with him for approximately nine months and only recently moved out after he went to jail. He stated he heard she is living with Ann and Doug Duescher who are friends but he also heard she has not been seen since Monday. Fleming stated during the time she lived with him, Pam never disappeared like this.. He did say Pam has a problem. He said Pam works for the Floor Care Co. and he thought she heard the business was failing and was going to close on the 15th. Fleming said this amongst other things would cause Pam to go out on a binge. Fleming stated Pam frequents Ma's Place which is run by the Schindler's. He stated he wished to add several things but they would have to remain confidential. He stated last year Pam told him Terry, Gary, and Robert Schindler had abducted her and kept her for approximately three days while they sexually assaulted her. They released her but threatened to kill her if she told anyone. On another occasion — Fleming stated Pam told him Gary Schindler and Rick Thorington took her to Sheboygan and on the way back, Gary raped her in the back seat. He stated this was done in front of Rick Thorington who is a Deputy with the Sheriff's Department and he personally threatened to kill her if she told anyone. Fleming said he feels Pam may have been abducted by these guys and is being forced to be a prostitute against her will. Fleming stated he does not know why else Pam would not have contacted anyone.

9/20/93-Rick Thorington and Robert Schindler reported to our department as requested. Both subjects stated they had been at Ma's Place last Monday night, (9/13). Thorington and Schindler stated they quite often stop at Ma's Place towards the end of the evening after they finish their jobs. Thorington stated they clean and service beer taps for the taverns in the area on a part time basis. Neither Thorington nor Bob Schindler could be specific on their time but thought they stopped at Ma's Place for about an hour and probably left around 8:30 or 9:00 p.m. They stated Pam Claflin was in the bar and very intoxicated. Schindler said he and Thorington sat on the bench near the window as you walk into the establishment. Pam sat several stools down with Michael Steinberg and another male friend towards the other end of the bar. He also thought two females were in the bar but he could not remember who they were. Both Schindler and Thorington stated Pam was so intoxicated she was talking to herself. They said occasionally they would talk with her but they did not see any other guys who were sitting or talking with her. Thorington stated that they have known Pam for quite

some time and she is a very excessive drinker and also tends to act crazy. He stated there are times when she is intoxicated and talking crazy to herself where she will just babble on for hours. I also asked Thorrington about some of the inuendos raised by Mr. Fleming but he stated he and Bob (Schindler) will talk with Pam at the bar but that is the end of it. He said he has no interest in Pam and he is aware of some of the accusations Fleming has made. I asked both Schindler and Thorrington to fill out statements.

James A. Erickson reported to our department as requested. James stated he and Pam had been married for approximately six months during 1989 to 1990. He stated he occasionally sees Pam and heard she had recently moved in with friends of theirs, the Duescher's. Erickson said Pam has a big problem and while they were married, she disappeared on him for approximately two months or so. He said he never heard from her and even contacted an attorney to start divorce proceedings. During that time, he heard she took off with a subject to Chicago. Erickson stated Duescher's contacted him about Pam's disappearance but he told them not to report her as she had disappeared on him many times and this seems to be her trademark. He said Pam lets you in and once you begin to care about her, she slams the door and takes off. I asked Erickson to write out a statement.

9/20/93-Sgt. R. Schroeder and I, (Habeck) along with an MTSO Deputy proceeded to Cleveland where we made contact with Randall Mataya at his residence. He was aware of this complaint as he had talked with his wife and I informed him we are looking for his assistance in locating Pam Claflin. I told Randy she would have been at Ma's Place last Monday night and has not been seen since. He stated "Oh, the dingy one". I asked Randy what he meant by that, and he stated she (Pam), was sitting at the bar talking to herself. Randy explained he had a court appearance that day and went to Ma's Place around 4:00 p.m. He thought he was there approximately 4 to 5 hours and during this time was shooting darts with a subject named Bill, (last name unknown). He stated during this time, they saw this female sitting at the bar and she was talking to herself. Randy stated occasionally they would go over and talk to her.

Randy stated they were flirting but he has a wife and kids and one is all he can handle. He said she was drinking beer but you could tell she was wasted. He stated he left around 9:00 or 9:30 and when he walked out the door, she followed. Randy stated his vehicle was parked in the Credit Union Lot alongside Ma's Tavern. I asked him which vehicle he had and he said it was his '78 Pontiac Grand Am (blue in color). Randy said the lot is only several feet from the bar and while they were walking, Pam told him she was going to the Spot. He said she had told him she had been at the Spot earlier and was going back. Randy stated he jumped into his vehicle and left. He said he was driving and went out the back way onto S. 11th. Randy stated that was the last he saw Pam as she was walking on the sidewalk towards the Spot. I asked Randy if Pam had walked with him to his vehicle or if he had given her a ride. Randy stated Pam never left the sidewalk and he did not know if she had a vehicle or not. I told Randy someone thought they had seen Pam getting into his car and Randy denied this stating she was never in or near his vehicle. I asked Randy if he could recall what Pam was wearing and he thought she had been wearing blue jeans and possibly a white shirt. He stated this was the first time he ever saw her and he wasn't familiar with her name until I told him. I showed Randy a picture of Pam and he stated "that's her". I again asked Randy about him leaving or giving Pam a ride and he again denied this. He stated he only talked to Pam occasionally inside the bar at Ma's Place in between their dart game. He said when he left, Pam was walking towards the Spot. I asked Randy if we could look in his vehicle and he permitted this and signed the Permission to Search form. Randy has a '78 Pontiac Grand Am with License Plate #LHD 656, which is a blue 4 door. I located a filet fisherman's knife in the glove box along with cigarette butts and mainly potato chip and snack type wrappers. I took those items and placed them into our evidence room. Randall had written out a statement which is attached.

9/21/93-At approximately 0930 Hrs this morning, I motored to the Spot Bar where I made contact with the cleaning person who informed me that owner, Jim Vnuk, was not in however she supplied me with his home telephone number. I made telephonic contact with Mr. Vnuk who informed me that the bartender at the Spot Bar on Monday evenings would be Debra VanderBloomen. I made telephonic contact with Ms. VanderBloomen and later spoke with her in person and I had asked her if she knew of a Pamela Claflin and she said that the name would not be familiar with her. I asked her if I would show her a picture of Pamela Claflin if she could tell me if Claflin would have been in the bar on Monday, 9/13/93. Upon showing Debra Mug Photo #13288, she said that she is positive that Claflin was not in the Spot Bar on the date in question. She said that Mondays are usually slow and on the Monday in question there was only approximately 20 people in the bar throughout the entire evening. VanderBloomen was asked to write out a statement and one was given to her which will be dropped off at the PD. Later any further information becomes available to Ms. VanderBloomen regarding anyone seeing Claflin in the Spot Bar at any other time, she will be in contact with me.

I then motored to the Duane Groothoff residence and he was not home. A message was left at Duane's wife's answering system in the city of Two Rivers to have Duane contact the P.D. as soon as possible as I wanted to show him a picture of Randall Mataya to see if he could identify him as being the subject whom he observed outside of his apartment with Pamela Claflin on Monday, 9/13/93.

I also made contact with Terry Schindler who was at Ma's Place Tavern this morning and I informed him that possible later this morning I would like to reinterview him at the Police Dept. further regarding this investigation.

At approximatley 1059 Hrs this morning, Det. J. Borman and I went to the Douglas and Ann Duescher residence at 1411 Hamilton St., which is the last residence where Pamela Claflin had been residing. I informed the Dueschers that I would like to check over Pamela's room to see if we could locate anything of importance which would give us any clues to the disappearance of her. Upon checking her room on the second story of the household, I was shown a small bedroom where Pamela slept and resided. On top of one of the dressers was an open pack box of Newport cigarettes with a pink disposable lighter on top which was left there by Claflin. After checkint the room for a short time, nothing out of the extreme ordinary was located however on one of the closet shelves I noticed that there was a prescription medication bottle from the \_\_\_\_\_, issued to Pamela Claflin by \_\_\_\_\_ which was a prescription for \_\_\_\_\_, dated 2/18/93, refills \_\_\_\_\_

At that time the prescription bottle was left there and it was unknown why Claflin would be taking the prescription medication or if it was just an old prescription bottle which we located. It should be noted that there was some medication left inside the pill bottle. Also located on the mattress and bedding sheets on the floor on the right side floor area, were numerous newspaper articles which had notes and apartments for rent circled which Anna said that Pamela did as she was looking for a new apartment to live. Some of the jeans which Pamela was said to have been wearing the Sunday prior on 9/12/93 were draped over chairs and they were checked with nothing located inside. At that time the only thing that was taken was the various newspaper ads and articles with the apartments circled and notes and photos taken by \_\_\_\_\_ and \_\_\_\_\_

Claflin with the permission of both Anna and Doug Duescher. These newspaper ads and articles were later tagged with evidence/Property Tag #11244.

Upon leaving the Duescher apartment at approximately 1136 Hrs this morning, Capt. Hartman radioed that I should call him on the Squad #47 car phone immediately. Upon speaking with Dapt. Hartman, I was informed that I was to go to the Rolland D. Krepline residence at 4313 Broadway Street as a neighbor of Krepline's located a ladies pair of blue jeans which appeared to have stains on them somewhere in a field in the vicinity of Broadway Street and Harvest Circle.

Det. Borman and I motored to the Krepline residence where we made contact with Mrs. Krepline who said that Rolland and Robert Herzog were further west near the Harvest Circle area where the jeans were found. Det. Borman and I then motored to the location just south of the hill below Harvest Circle where I located Krepline and Robert Herzog near the Herzog personal vehicle. We arrived at this location at 1141 Hrs. Krepline and Herzog were standing just off a dirt type service road off Harvest Circle underneath an area of power lines which run east and west. Located a few feet away from one of the power poles was a pair of smaller somewhat stonewashed bluejeans which appeared to have a red substance similar to stains on them. It should be noted that before leaving the Duescher residence, I was informed by both Mr. & Mrs. Duescher that upon them last observing Claflin, she was wearing blue jeans similar to the ones located in this area this morning. They also felt that she was either wearing an aqua colores shirt or a pink colored T-shirt and no jacket. The area in question was felt to be in the County of Manitowoc outside the City Limits and contact was made with Capt. Hartman who summoned Chief Deputy Gene Kusche from MTSO to the scene. Arrangements were also made to have a County K-Nine summoned to that area for assistance if need be.

At approximately 1200 Hrs Chief Inv. Gene Kusche arrived at the location along with K-Nine Officer Kirk Bessler. Chief Inv. Kusche was briefed on the situation thus far and was brought up to date on the missing person complaint that we were investigating. Chief Inv. Kusche from that point was the control person for the possible crime scene area. Det. Borman and I stood by for assistance.

At approximately 1301 Hrs, Det. J. Borman noticed a human body in the brush/weed area within approximately a ten foot area away from the blue jeans. MTSO Deputy Brian L. Nack was also at the scene keeping a time and log of the crime scene area. I remained on the scene for assistance along with standing by until identification could be made to see if, in fact, the body was that of our missing person, Pamela L. Claflin. It should also be noted that earlier this morning, Capt. Hartman received information that Claflin was a heavy cigarette smoker usually smoking her brand of Newport Menthol cigarettes. She was also said to be right handed and had a tattoo on her forehead area with a tattoo of a rose above her left breast.

At approximately 1500 Hrs this afternoon the body was moved and after being so appeared to be that of our missing person as facial appearance was similar to the Mug #1288, along with

Hartman to have the Claflin vehicle impounded where Custer Street Shell was notified and at 1724 Hrs Custer Street Shell towing operator Chris Wallace towed the Claflin vehicle to MTPD impound. I signed the wrecker bill of \$40.00 acknowledging receiving the vehicle and at that time, 1724 Hrs the vehicle was placed under lock and key in the impound, fenced in cage area.

I also had contact with Ass't D.A. Gail Prost late this afternoon regarding the missing person investigation thus far and she was given the updated information regarding the investigation to this time. I later spoke with her in person where initial preparation was done to try to gain a Search Warrant for the Randall Mataya 1978 blue Pontiac 4 door bearing WI Lic RP #LHD656. Det. Habeck and I also met with Chief Inv. Gene Kusche who was given a detailed briefing of the Claflin missing person report thus far from the time she was reported missing with our department to this date. From this point in time, arrangements were made that this would be a City/County joint investigation with the County handling the possible homicide with the city following through and contacting witnesses who may have last seen Claflin alive.

9/22/93-This morning at 0900 Hrs, I met with MTSO Det. Tom Marquardt who was assigned to handle the interviews on the County's part of this investigation. Upon meeting with him I briefed him on the missing person report from the start of the investigation to this point in time. I also received a phone call from Chief Inv. Gene Kusche who asked that I try and obtain a Search Warrant for the 1978 Pontiac Grand Am which is the vehicle reported to be driven by Mataya on Monday, 9/13/93.

This morning I met with Ass't D.A. Gail Prost along with Judge Allen Dehn where oral testimony was given by me to try to obtain a Search Warrant. The Search Warrant was granted by Judge

Det. Habeck and I then motored to the Cleveland Trailer Court at 204 Beechwood in the village of Cleveland where I met with Inv. Gene Kusche. At 1208 Hrs this afternoon the Warrant was turned over to Inv. Kusche where he read the Warrant to **Judy Mataya**. Arrangements were already made prior by Inv. Kusche to have the vehicle in question towed to the County's impound area. The original warrant and MTSO's copy was also turned over to Inv. Kusche at that time and he will endorse the item, fill it out and get it back within the allotted time frames. Det. Habeck and I left the Mataya trailer area along with following the wrecker and Mataya vehicle to the County Sheriff's Dept. at 1230 Hrs this afternoon.

Earlier arrangements were made that Inv. Marquardt asked if I could contact Terry Schindler to obtain a written statement from him.. At 1358 Hrs this afternoon I spoke with Evelyn Schindler along with Ma's Place Bartender Kathy to have Terry Schindler contact me ASAP. I was informed by the bartender that Terry was working and probably wouldn't be back home until approximately 1800 to 1830 Hrs this evening.

9/21/93-Duane G. Groothoff reported to our department. Duane explained he lives in an apartment above the Lakeport Credit Union. He stated it was either Sunday or Monday night around 8:00 or 9:00 p.m. when he was looking out the window. He stated he noticed two cars which were parked in the Credit Union lot side by side. Groothoff said one of the vehicles is still in the lot. He described this car as a yellow Horizon. Groothoff stated that Sunday or Monday night he heard people talking outside. He said he looked out and saw a male and female talking by those vehicles. He stated they were talking for approximately five to ten minutes and it seemed as if the female was hesitant to go along with the male. Groothoff said it seemed as though the male had everything under control as if he had things planned and the female was pacing back and forth as if she didn't know if she wanted to go along. He stated finally the male jumped into the Horizon and locked the doors. Groothoff said the male then jumped into the other vehicle and unlocked the door for the female to get in. Groothoff also stated sometime during this activity, the male subject had the hood of his vehicle open as if he was doing something to the engine to get it started. Groothoff stated they left going out the back way onto S. 11th Street. He said the Horizon has been parked in the lot ever since. Groothoff described the female as having longer brown hair and was approximately 5'6" and in the 125 lb range. He stated he only saw her from the rear. He described the male as also having longer brown hair, taller in stature, and thought he was over 6 ft, and stated he was not real muscular and thought his weight to be 160 to 170 lbs. He also stated the subject may have had a mustache but no beard. Groothoff stated he thought the female may have been drunk, not because she was stumbling around, but just by her actions where she would stand like a zombie and couldn't decide whether she should go or not. I asked Groothoff to describe the vehicle they left in. He stated he thought the car belonged to the male party and said it was definitely larger than her Horizon. Groothoff thought

Groothoff immediately ruled out three of the subjects and after several minutes of examination, he pointed to the photo of Randall Mataya stating the subject looks very similar to this. Groothoff said he cannot be positive this is the subject, but stated the male would have similar length hair and features. I had Groothoff write out a statement.

Klabunde stated he saw the Claflin vehicle parked in the Credit Union Lot for the entire week. Klabunde said on Sunday, Sept. 12, when he returned from the Packer/Eagle football game, he saw a newer BMW parked alongside Claflin's vehicle. He stated he did not see any subjects and did not see this vehicle leave. Klabunde was not able to shed any light on any other activity by the Claflin vehicle. While we were on S. 10th Street, Terry Schindler came out of Ma's Place stating one of the subjects which had been there Monday evening, (9/13), was now inside the bar. He pointed out Shawn Bloch and we asked Shawn if he would speak with us. Det. Swetlik and I spoke with Shawn outside the tavern. He confirmed he was in the bar on Monday, 9/13, and would have been shooting darts with two guys. He did not know their last names but said one guy was named Bill and the other Randall. Bloch said Pam Claflin was in the bar and that Randy was talking with her. Bloch said he was shooting darts with Randy and Bill and in between Randy would be sitting and talking with Pam. Bloch said they were shooting darts for beers and thought Randy had quite a bit to drink, although he stated it seemed Pam was intoxicated.

Bloch stated Pam would be talking to herself at different times but he stated he has seen her do this in the past. Bloch stated Randy was hugging and kissing Pam and thought it was around 9:00 - 9:30 p.m. when they left. Bloch was sure they left together and thought Randy walked out the doorway first with Pam right behind. Bloch stated they did not say where they were going. He again stressed he was not familiar with Randy but was only shooting darts with him throughout the evening. Bloch could not recall what either Randy or Pam would have been wearing. Bloch did state that he would be willing to write out a statement.

9/23/93-I made phone contact with Mike Steinberg as we had received a report he may have been in Ma's Place on Monday, 9/13. I asked Mike about this and he stated he would not have been in Manitowoc during the week as he works but there would have been a possibility he may have been there that weekend. Mike advised the last time he would have seen Pam was at Ma's Place and thought it may possibly have been Saturday or Sunday (9/11 or 9/12/93). Mike stated the only reason he remembers is because Pam was drunk and arguing with Poncho over some money. Pam was drunk and telling Poncho he still owed her some money but Poncho ran upstairs and brought down receipts showing he had paid her in full. Due to her condition, Pam continued to argue and finally Poncho's girlfriend through her out of the bar. Mike stated there were not any hard feelings as Pam gets in this condition quite often. He stated the following weekend on Saturday, (9/18), he saw Pam's vehicle parked in the Credit Union Lot and she was not inside the bar. He stated he asked about her but everyone said they had not seen her.

11:30 p.m. that night and stated she did not observe anything unusual. Ma's Place is located almost directly across the street from this Kwik Trip. Vetting stated she heard Pam comes into their Kwik Trip quite often for cigarettes but she cannot say for sure if Pam would have been in there that day or evening.

We also contacted Debbie VanderBloomen who was the bartender at the Spot Bar on September 13. She had finished her statement which Det. Vogel had given to her earlier. We also asked her to make a list of Patrons which would have been in the Spot Bar during the hours she worked on September 13. The list of names is attached.

I also spoke with Michelle L. Adams. Michelle is Shawn Bloch's fiance and while Shawn was in Ma's Place on Monday, (9/13), she was waiting for him outside in the vehicle. I asked Michelle if she was familiar with Pam Claflin and she stated she is not. Adams states often while she waits for Shawn she is reading a book and does not really pay attention who is coming or going from the tavern.

On 9/23/93, Steven P. Vandegrift contacted our department. Steve advised he had heard some screams during the evening hours sometime during the last week or two. He advised he cannot be sure on which night he heard the screams but thought it may have been one to one and one-half weeks ago. Steve stated they sleep with their windows open and the first scream woke him up. He said occasionally his wife will have a dream or nightmare and she wakes up screaming so Steve said he looked over at her but she was fast asleep. Steve stated it was approximately 15 seconds or less when he heard a second scream. He advised both screams were definitely female and the second scream sounded eerie. He described the second scream as somewhat muddled as if the subject was attempting to scream louder. Steve said he was debating whether he should get up but thought it may have been coming from a neighbor or something. Steve stated he did not look over at the clock but said he is in bed by 8:00 or 8:30 p.m. and his wife usually goes to bed by 9:30 or 10:00 p.m. Steve stated if he had to venture a guess, he thought it would be late evening or during the very early morning hours. He also stated he thought he heard a car

driving by very slowly and that the people were arguing. Again, Steve stated he could not be sure whether this was the same night or whether it was before or after he heard the female screams. Vandegrift stated his house is located on Carrie Lane by Harvest Circle and the area where the body was found would be out his back yard and through the field area. Steve said he talked with a neighbor but she informed him she had not heard the screams. She did tell him when the police officers were at the scene, she was able to hear them plain as day. Steve agreed to write out a statement.

I had received information from George RADke that he had seen Pam with Ricky Hauke at the Tower Tavern on Saturday night, Sept. 11, around midnight. I made contact with Ricky D. Hauke (DOB 8/13/56). Rick did confirm he has known Pam for quite a while and had somewhat of a relationship with her for approximately three years. He stated the last time he saw Pam was on Saturday night, Sept. 11. Hauke said he was at Kono's with Roger Brault when Pam came in. He stated this was around 11:00 p.m. or so and he talked with Pam for quite some time. Hauke stated Pam told him she was working for a cleaning business where they clean businesses and homes Hauke said they ended up leaving together and that he was intoxicated so Pam drove. He said they stopped at one other bar but cannot remember where before going back to his house. Hauke said Pam spent the night and the next morning dropped him off at his vehicle which was parked by Kono's. Hauke said this was around 8:30 in the morning because he had to leave for the Packer/Eagle football game. Hauke stated that during their relationship they have had sex on occasion. He said on that evening, 9/11, they tried to have sex but due to his condition, he was not able to ejaculate. I also asked him about the type of sex they have had in the past and Hauke said it was just normal sex. He stated he never had oral sex with her and said Pam had commented once that she has some difficulty

I thanked Hauke for his time and information.

9/23/93-Tiffany A. Mahloch returned the call to our department. Tiffany advised on Sunday evening, September 12, she saw Pam at Terps Too along with Mark Ording, Chris Vehwinkel, and another male subject. She stated Pam had enough to drink and was talking to herself. She stated she was kissing Vohwinkel and mentioned that Pam tends to lead guys on but at the end doesn't put out. Mahloch stated Pam left with Ording, Vohwinkel, and the other male subject around 9:00 p.m. and she later saw them at the Spot Bar around 10:00 or 11:00 p.m. Mahloch said she did not stay at the Spot Bar and does not know when Pam left or who she left with.

sounded like someone was being physically assaulted. She stated she then heard one car door slam and tires squealing. She also stated the car sounded very loud when it took off. Mary could not be sure from which direction the sound came. We gave her a statement form to fill out.

9/25/93-I made phone contact with Connie Zabler. She confirmed she does deliver the Milwaukee Sentinel to the Harvest Circle area. Connie stated she was aware of the incident and may have some information for us. She stated she usually delivers the Sentinel to that area between 2:15 and 3:00 a.m. She said it was either Sept. 14 or 15, she was on Evelyn Lane placing the Sentinel into the row of tubes. She said suddenly a male subject came up to her vehicle and asked her for a light for his cigarette. Zabler said she did not know where the subject had come from. She said she watched him while she grabbed her cigarette lighter and told him he could keep it. Zabler stated that would have been a white Bic lighter. Zabler described the subject as being approximately 5'9", 180 lbs, with dark hair. She said by dark hair, it could have been either brown or black as she stated it was dark out at the time but she definitely knew it was not blonde or red. She said the subject had shoulder length hair and a mustache and thought that he was in his mid-thirties to possibly 40. She also said the subject was wearing a plaid flannel shirt with lining and that the shirt was open. Zabler said she had to wait for the subject to walk away from her vehicle before she could continue to the turnaround and then head back towards Harvest Circle. Zabler stated while making the turnaround on Evelyn Lane, she saw a vehicle parked approximately 30 feet down the dirt lane. She thought the subject was walking back to the vehicle and described the vehicle as blue or silver in color. Zabler said she only saw the vehicle from the rear and could not be sure on its' condition, make or model. She said at the time she thought someone may have been possibly small game hunting but later found out this was the week before any hunting opened. Zabler thought she would be able to pick out the guy from a photo.

I contacted Det. Markvart of MTSO with this information and he set up an appointment with Zabler

They are still working on this case and awaiting results from the State Crime Lab.

I met Pam through housekeepers (the cleaning agency that cleans where I work). The Thursday before Labor day weekend she asked me if I wanted to go to Little Sturgeon with her to do some boating and fishing with her and her friends who live up there. She told me I could stay at her parents house free. I told her I'd go but couldn't leave till Sunday because of work Saturday. She said that was fine and gave me her phone number. Because I barely knew her and felt weird about just getting in a car with her and going out of town I called her Saturday to see if she wanted to get together for a drink or something so I could get to know her a little bit. I picked Pam up at her friends house on Hamilton street, we went out for a couple hours and when I took her back there were several cars parked in the yard and driveway. She said there probably wasn't room for her to sleep there and asked if she could stay at my house. I wasn't real happy about it but I said sure she could sleep in my bed and I would sleep in the living room cause I didn't want her to get the wrong idea about me and her. Sunday around noon we left for Little Sturgeon, once up there she wanted to go to the bar down the road from her parents house to find her friend Mary. When we got to the bar she told me she didn't have a penny to her name, she borrowed Twenty dollars from me that day and more money for cigarettes the next day. We sat in the bar by her friend Sunday till around nine o clock when we went back to her parents and went to sleep (her in the spare bedroom and me on the couch). Monday when we got up she wanted to go back to the bar for a bloody mary, then to see an old friend in Sturgeon Bay, I believe his name was Randy. Afterwards we went back to her parents house for lunch and then came back to Manitowoc and I dropped her off at the house on Hamilton street. The next Thursday (9/9) when she came to work to clean she told me the girl she was staying with was married to a crazy man who stays up drinking and screaming to music all night and she was going to stay at her old apartment in Two Rivers and I should stop there when I was done at the shop that night. I did for about a half hour and she said she wanted to do something with me that weekend, I told her I'd let her know even though I didn't want to do anything with her. She called my house all weekend and left messages on my machine each time she called she was drinking. I didn't return her calls. At 1:30 Monday morning I woke up to my phone ringing, it was Pam (drunk) I told her it was 1:30 in the morning and I didn't appreciate her calling at that hour and hung up the phone. Wednesday (9/15) I couldn't reach her at the Two Rivers number because she didn't want her to cause a scene about me not returning her calls at work the next day when she'd come to clean. I didn't reach her in Two Rivers I called her friends house on Hamilton street where the crazy man said she was on a three day drinking binge when she called me Monday morning and she hasn't been around since then. Pam didn't come to
