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Ok. Bock: 1 Ah, they've been paged with the information and I 2 Dispatcher: know, but you maybe heard this before but, we're, we're dispatch 3 and our hands are kind of tied in this situation. There's 4 nothing more we can really do except page 'em the information. 5 Ok, cause I was under the impression somebody was 6 Bock: gonna try to find somebody ah, over in the building. 7 Dispatcher: Hang on a second. (Call transferred to another 8 Dispatcher) 9 Dispatcher: Mr. Bock? 10 11 Bock: Yes. Dispatcher: The only thing that we can do is that no one has 12 spoken with him cause there's not any detectives in the 13 building. The only information I can give you at this point is, 14 he said when he gets to his office, he'll give him the note, but 15 I have no idea when that will be. 16 Ok, cause I thought, and believe me I appreciate Bock: 17 you not just telling me to jump in a lake. I, I, it's just ... 18 Well we're frustrated because we don't know what Dispatcher: 19 else to you know ... 20 I, I understand and I, I know, I, I know, when I 21 Bock: left, I left the phone conversation, I thought, cause I seen a 22 couple police officers walk in ... 23 24 Dispatcher: Right, but ... 25 Bock: Over here and so I was just wondering if one of 26 them could take the note to my guy. Dispatcher: I don't think they have access up there to get to 27 it to give it to him. Because I ask him that, I finally got a 28 29

hold of one of 'em, and he said, "No," that the detective needed 1 to give it to him. And that as soon as he came in ... 2 Is it cause the, I mean is it cause they're Bock: 3 scared to give it to him or because they can't get to it cause ... 4 Dispatcher: I don't think they can, I think because of the 5 separate divisions they can't get it to give it to him. 6 Well I'm just asking, I don't ... Bock: 7 Dispatcher: Yeah, I mean I don't know either. That's, that's 8 just what he told me. 9 Bock: See they may just not want, they may just not 10 want to cause they don't, it's 'ohh I don't want to touch that 11 case." Or, I didn't know if they had access or they just 12 decided they ... 13 I don't think, I don't think they do. Dispatcher: And I 14 know that, you know, there hasn't been any detectives in the 15 building since I've been speaking with you, that's the only 16 reason why it hasn't happened up till now. 17 Well I can plead, I mean I know, I know, Bock: Yeah. 18 it's just a hard situation, I'm trying to find some way to get 19 in there ... 20 Dispatcher: Right. 21 Bock: Ah...I mean do you know what would happen, I mean 22 do you all have jail visits right now if I ... 23 24 Dispatcher: I, I don't think so, I think they have like you 25 know scheduled times. 26 Bock: Well that's not, not the lawyer's ... Well they shouldn't ... right, yeah, but I ... that, 27 Dispatcher: that, you know, I apologize, but that's the only information 28 that we have is, is that. 29

Ok and the detective called you back and said that Bock: 1 he'd give him the note ... 2 As soon as he got in to where, to where, when he 3 Dispatcher: got into his office he would. And hopefully that will be, you 4 know, this evening. 5 Ok, he said it would be this evening? 6 Bock: Dispatcher: No, I said, hopefully it will, I don't know. 7 I'm just guessing. He didn't give me a time or anything else. 8 Ok, well...alrighty, I will ah...I'll stop calling every 9 Bock: 15 minutes, maybe I'll check back in an hour or so. And ah, 10 11 please be patient with me? Dispatcher: Ok, well I, you know, I mean 12 Bock: I'll check back in a hour or so ... 13 Dispatcher: Ok. 14 Bock: And please be patient with me ... 15 Ok, well you know I mean, like I said... Dispatcher: 16 Bock: 17 Just trying to do my job. Like I say, I know you are and we're, like I say, Dispatcher: 18 we're, we, we're in a totally separate building and we're just 19 dispatchers so we have no idea what's going on over there. 20 Right, well ... 21 Bock: Dispatcher: We're kind of like ... you know, we don't know what 22 to tell you to help ya. 23 24 Bock: Right. I mean is there anybody that's in charge 25 of this. I mean its ... 26 Dispatcher: Right. It's, Sergeant Thompson's in charge of this. But he's not over there either. 27 Bock: Is there anyway to get a hold of 'em? 28 29

Dispatcher: Ah...I, I tried to get a hold of him also. I've 1 got a page into him also. So, I've just to wait for them to, 2 you know, call us back. Cause they, as far as we know they 3 maybe working on something else that I don't even know anything 4 about. 5 Or maybe sleeping ... 6 Bock: Dispatcher: Or maybe even sleeping, you know ... 7 Bock: Cause I'm sure they haven't slept much, but you 8 got to remember that, you know, my, my client's right to see his 9 lawyer is pretty far up there with reference to the importance 10 11 of some of the rights that we've got. Dispatcher: Yeah, but, I, you know, like I said ... 12 Bock: I know you can only do, I'm not ... 13 I have, like I said, all I do is answer the phone Dispatcher: 14 and that has nothing to do ... 15 I know and I, and I appreciate, I appreciate you Bock: 16 patience with me and ah...I will check back or I'll wait for a 17 phone call, I'm gonna go home and take my wife to dinner and 18 I'll probably get a phone call the minute my dinner comes. 19 Dispatcher: (laughs) 20 Bock: But ah...I, I appreciate your help. 21 Dispatcher: You're welcome. 22 Bock: Bye-bye. 23 24 25 26 Dispatcher: (inaudible) Hi. Ah, did you guys page Fike and ask him or 27 Thompson: have him call my mobile number? 28 Dispatcher: I did page Fike with your mobile number. 29

He hasn't called so let's try Pfeiffer next. 1 Thompson: Dispatcher: Pfeiffer with your mobile number. 2 Yes sir. 3 Thompson: Dispatcher: Ok. 4 Thompson: Thanks. 5 Dispatcher: 6 Bye. 7 8 9 Dispatcher: Communications (inaudible). 10 11 Bock: Ah, yes, ah, this is Billy Bock, I'm a lawyer ah, here in Oklahoma City, and I have been calling regarding a 12 client of mine named Christopher Jordan who's in your jail. 13 Dispatcher: Uh-huh. 14 And I had spoken earlier to ah...ah, Detective Bock: 15 Mize, and Detective Mize had left a note ah, to be taken into my 16 client, but he was sleeping. Ah, regarding a visitation and 17 I'm just trying to find out ... and Detective Mize called me at 18 about 6:00 and said that he was going home, but that he was 19 gonna leave that note with ah, Detective Rex DeMoss. 20 21 Dispatcher: Uh-huh. 22 Bock: And whose, whose got that murder case and I'm just trying to follow up to find out if ah, anybody has taken 23 24 that note into my client. 25 Dispatcher: I'm, I'm in a totally different building from 26 them, ah, I don't, I don't know if ah...Detective DeMoss has been in or, or not. 27 Bock: Ok, 28 and since then I... Dispatcher: 29

I was taken, I, I don't know, but I, I was 1 Bock: speaking with some ladies there in Communications, or they maybe 2 done, or they maybe gone home or ... ah ... they, there was a couple of 3 'em there that knew, knew about the situation. 4 I'm familiar with the situation, I'm not sure Dispatcher: 5 that ah...I don't believe Det, ah, Detective DeMoss is coming, has 6 come in. 7 Bock: Ok. 8 Dispatcher: Since earlier this evening. 9 Bock: Ok, was he in this evening? 10 11 Dispatcher: No, I don't believe so. Ok, ok. Bock: 12 Dispatcher: He may have been early on in the day, but I, I 13 don't believe he's been in this evening at all. 14 Bock: Ok. Is there anyway ... 15 Dispatcher: Or where the note has been left or ... 16 That's it's been left for Detective DeMoss. Bock: 17 DeMoss, right. Dispatcher: 18 But, but that it has not been taken into my client. Bock: 19 Dispatcher: To my knowledge, no. 20 Is there anyway, ah, I know, I mean I'm not knew 21 Bock: Ok. at this, so I'm not asking for security reasons when their gonna 22 be transferred, because ... 23 24 Dispatcher: Oh no, yeah, I understand. 25 Bock: You know and I know that we're not suppose to know 26 exactly when their transferred for security reasons. Dispatcher: 27 Right. 28 29

But is there anyway to find out if those boys are 1 Bock: going to be in the Oklahoma County Jail sometime during the, 2 before Monday morning? 3 Ah, I have, I have no idea on that, I can leave Dispatcher: 4 ah, a message for Detective DeMoss when he comes in to give you 5 a call as soon as he, he can pass on that information to ya. 6 Ok. Bock: 7 Dispatcher: But if I, I have no idea, no way of knowing. 8 Is there anyway to page Detective DeMoss again, we had 9 Bock: him paged at 6:00, a few times, is there anyway to page him to 10 11 my, to my mobile phone and, and see if we can do it again, to have him call me? 12 Dispatcher: Ok, what's your phone number? 13 My name again is Billy Bock, B O C K, ah my mobile Bock: 14 phone number that I'll have with me for a little while that is, 15 is 620-3031. 16 3031. 17 Dispatcher: Yes, assuming he has an alpha -numeric pager that you Bock: 18 can just put that information in and see if he'll call me. 19 Dispatcher: Sure. 20 Bock: Ok? 21 Dispatcher: Ok. 22 Bock: Thank you sir. 23 24 Dispatcher: Bye. Bock: Bye-bye. 25 26 27 28 29
